- 4 I went through time, I found myself to be more into those
- 5 ideas then Basij ideas. So it was the reason I joined
- 6 Islamic Students Association.
- 7 INTERVIEWER: And were you involved with Basij --
- 8 MEHTDI OSTADHASSAN: In college?
- 9 INTERVIEWER: -- in Paris? When you were in Paris?
- 10 MEHTDI OSTADHASSAN: No, no, no. They don't -- not
- 11 at all.

- 13 in in Paris?
