**[PROPOSED] ORDER APPROVING
SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT**

[PROPOSED] ORDER

Upon consideration of the parties' Joint Motion for Approval of Settlement Agreement, **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that:

- (1) The Settlement Agreement, signed and filed by the parties on March 4, 2026, *see* Dkt. 711-1, is **APPROVED**.
- (2) Pursuant to the approved Settlement Agreement, it is further **ORDERED** that:
 - (a) The stay of the Adjustment Class claims, *see* Dkt. 612 & 613, is lifted, and all claims of the Adjustment Class are **DISMISSED** with prejudice;
 - (b) Plaintiffs' Fifth and Eighth Claims for Relief with respect to the Naturalization Class are **DISMISSED** with prejudice;
 - (c) Pursuant to the Court's summary judgment ruling with respect to Plaintiffs' Eighth Claim for Relief—that is, with respect to the

Naturalization Class, CARRP was adopted in an arbitrary and capricious manner—the case is **REMANDED** to USCIS without vacatur;

- (d) On remand, USCIS shall take remedial action by rescinding the CARRP policy, as memorialized in the policy memoranda and guidelines set forth in the Certified Administrative Record, within seven months of this Order. USCIS shall notify Plaintiffs and the Court promptly after CARRP is rescinded;
- (e) The Court shall retain jurisdiction over the case for the purpose of enforcing the Settlement Agreement until notification that USCIS has rescinded CARRP. Should USCIS not rescind CARRP within seven months of this Order, Plaintiffs may move the Court for specific performance of the obligation to rescind CARRP or such other relief appropriate in the circumstances.
- (f) The Court's jurisdiction contemplated in Paragraph (e), above, shall expire upon notification to the Court of the rescission of CARRP as outlined in Paragraph (d), above, except as to a potential motion for costs, expenses, and fees.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
