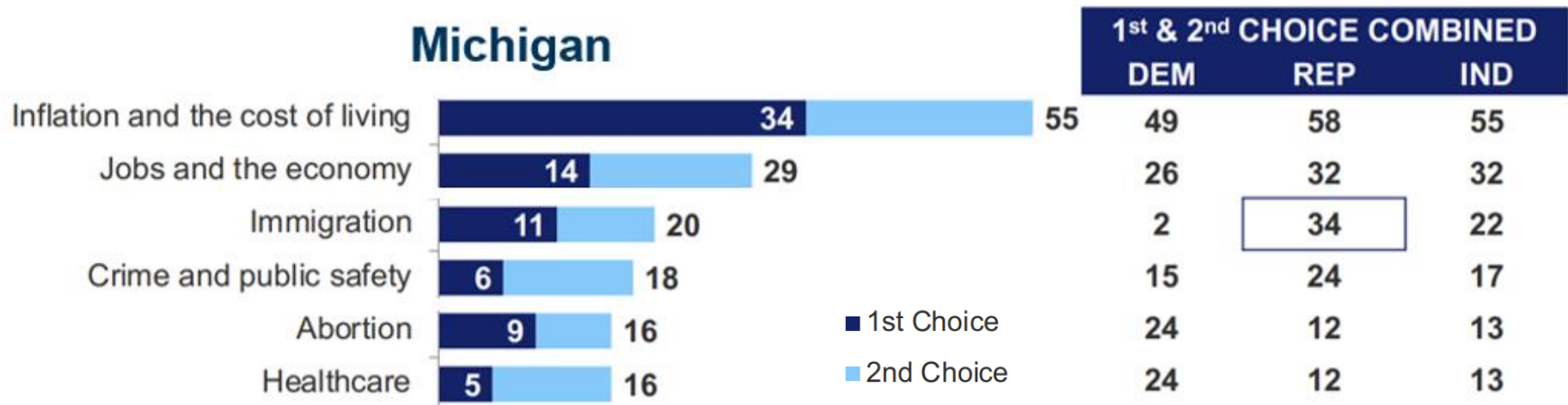
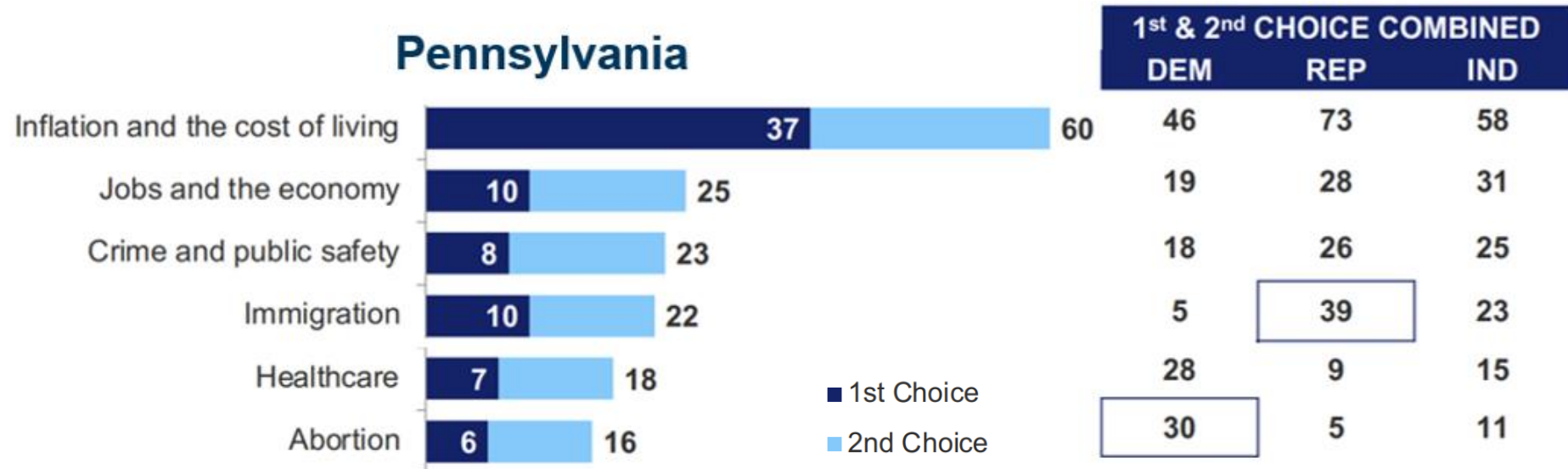

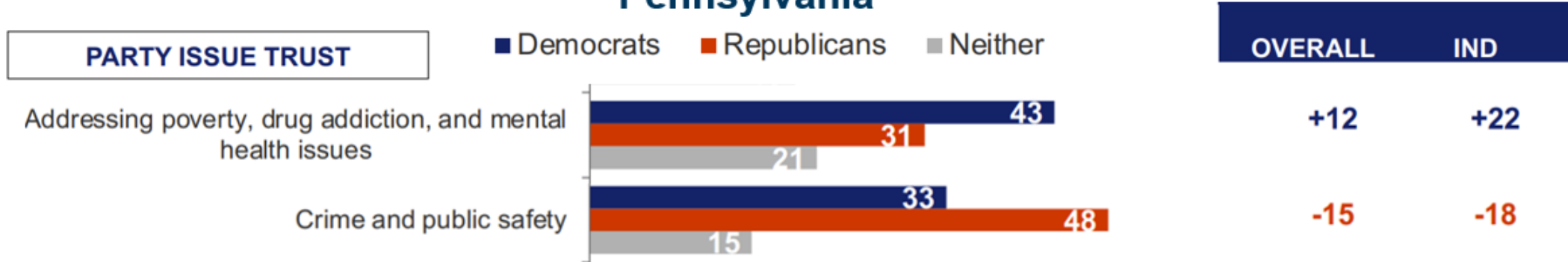

# Crime and public safety are mid-tier concerns in Pennsylvania and Michigan.

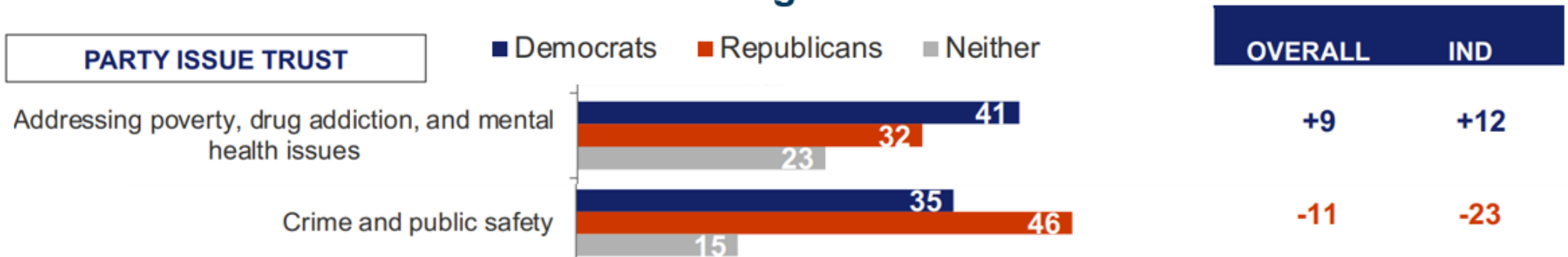


# Voters trust Republicans more on public safety, but trust Democrats more on handling the root causes of crime.

## Michigan

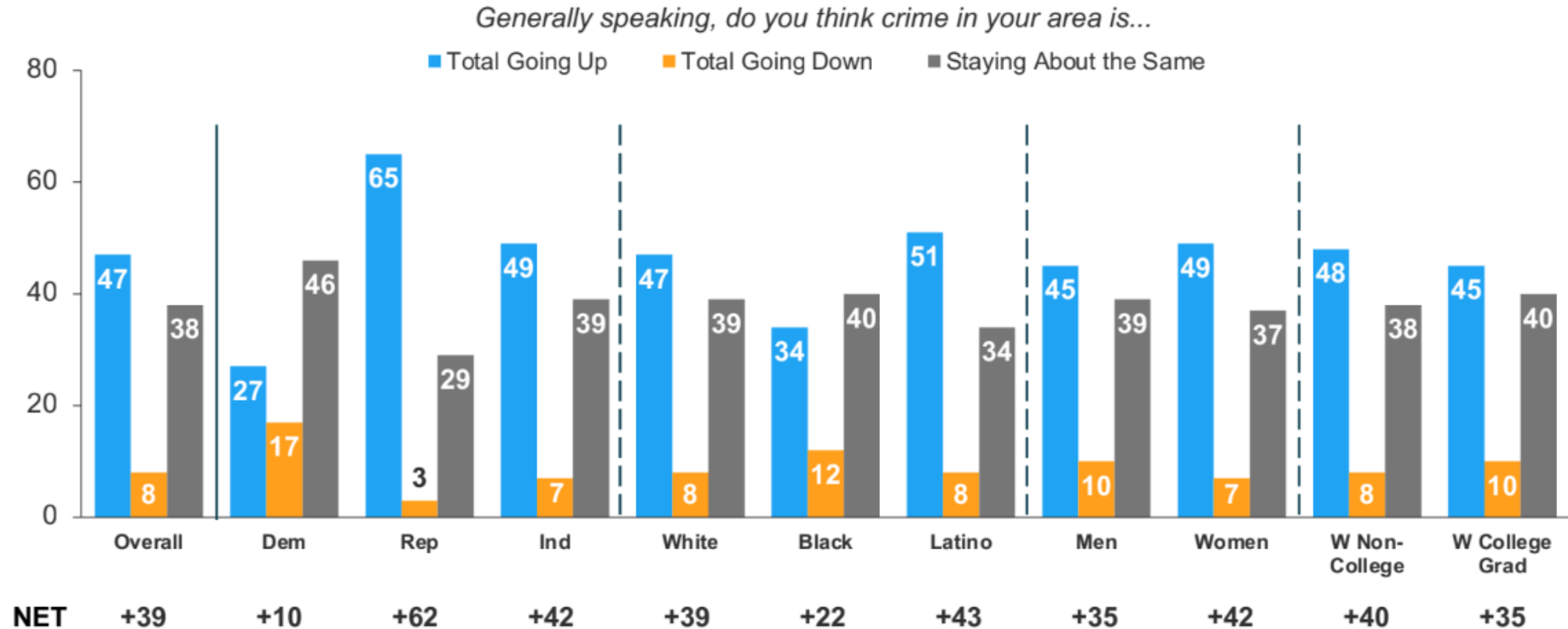

Event though crime is on the decline, voters across most demographics believe crime is going up.



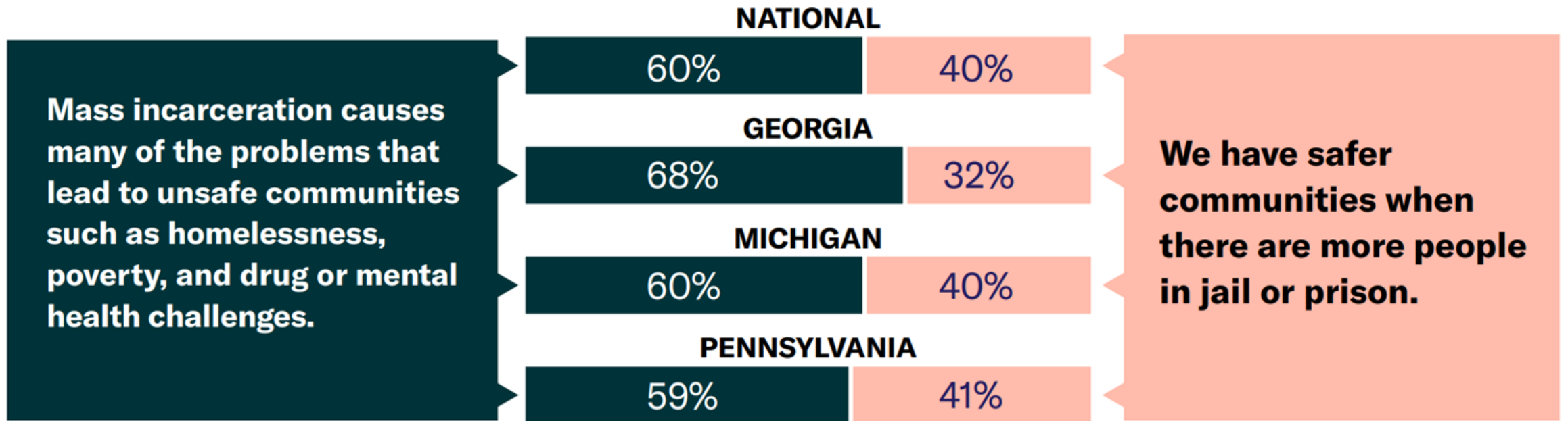

67% believe the criminal justice system needs complete overhaul or major reform.

65% say it is important to reduce jail and prison populations.

And 60% believe mass incarceration leads to unsafe communities.

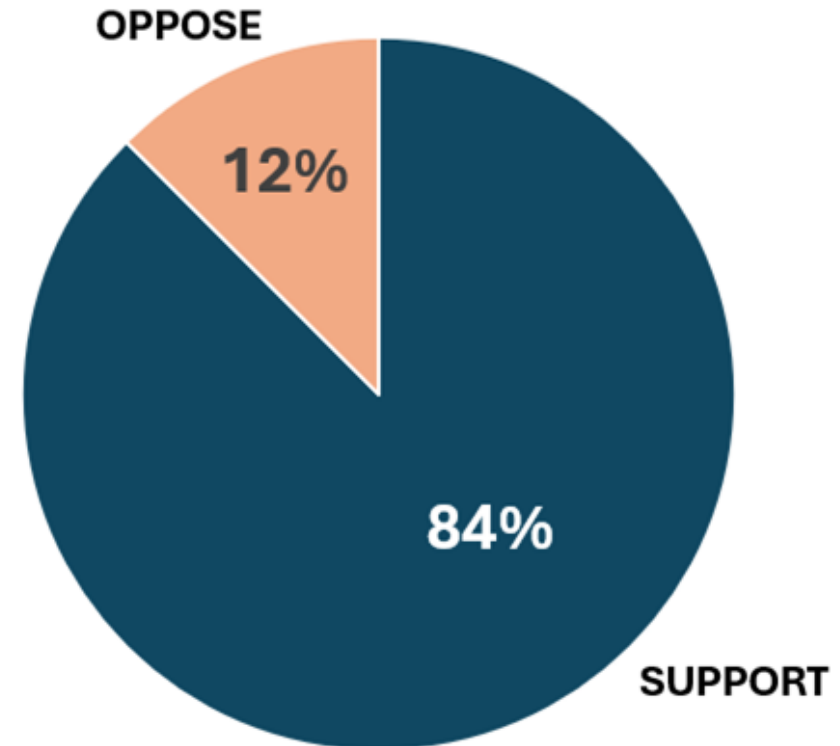

**84% of likely voters support protecting the First Step Act and finding further opportunities to safely reduce the federal prison population.**



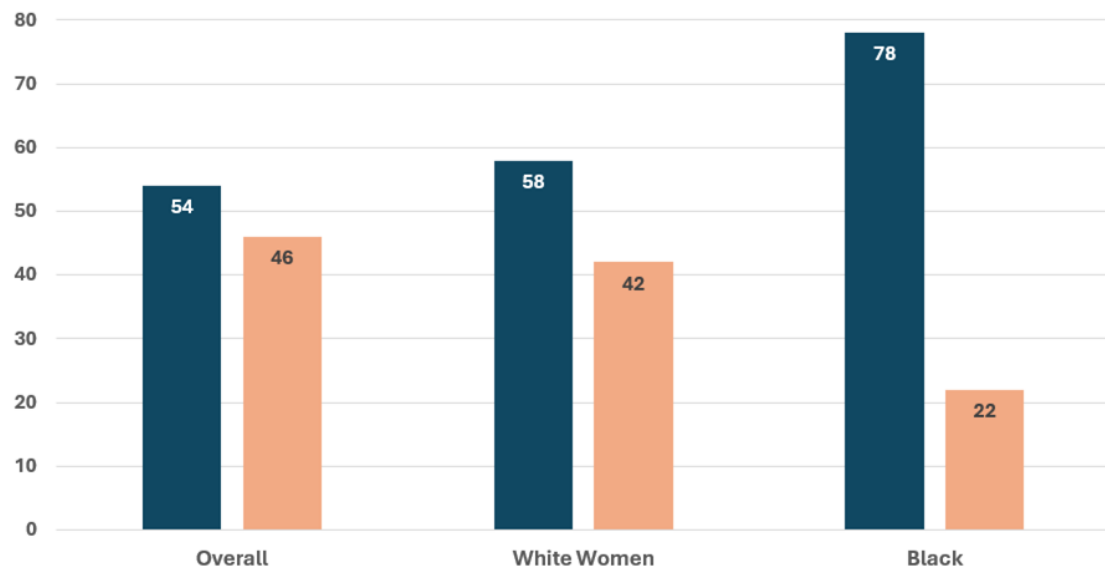

# Offer proven solutions to address the root causes of crime.

## Michigan

The most effective ways to keep our communities safe are proven solutions that prevent crime before it happens, like investing in housing, education, and mental health and addiction programs.

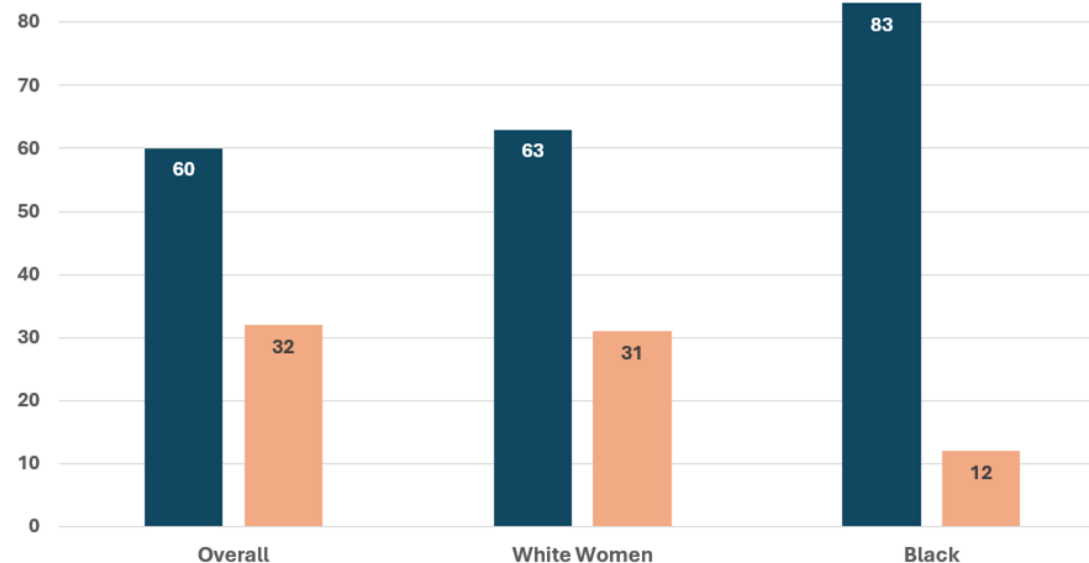
In order to keep our communities safe, we need a tough on crime approach that increases police funding, improves police response times, and imposes stricter sentences for the worst offenders.

We need to invest in proven solutions to prevent crime, like affordable housing and mental health and addiction services, to make our communities safer.

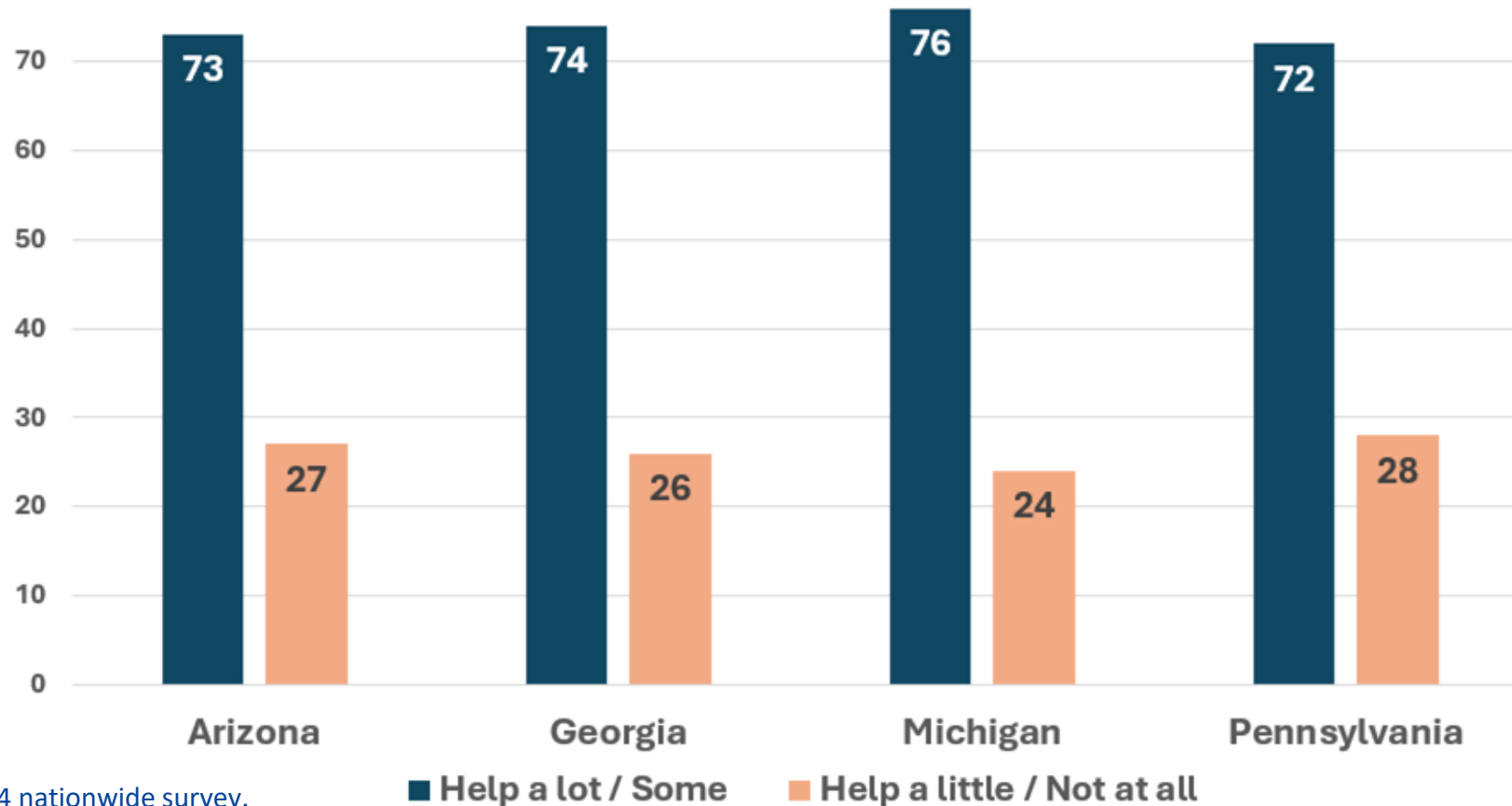
We need to put 100,000 more police on the street to address crime and make our communities safer.

## Battleground voters prefer prevention over punishment

| <b>[PREVENT]</b> We need to invest in proven solutions that prevent crime, drug addiction, and homelessness from happening in the first place, and reaching people with the resources they need when they need it - instead of sending them to jail and giving them criminal records that make it harder to get a job, housing, or education. | 72%                         | 25%                              | 3%         |
| <b>[RESOURCES]</b> The safest communities usually have the most resources. We need to invest in proven solutions to prevent crime, like affordable housing and mental health and addiction services. By addressing poverty, economic despair, and lack of opportunities, we can stop the cycle of crime.                                      | 71%                         | 25%                              | 4%         |
| <b>[ANSWER]</b> Police are not the answer to every problem - they are not social workers or counselors. We shouldn't ask them to fix problems that shouldn't be their job to handle in the first place. We can reduce the burden on police by funding more appropriate first responders for certain emergencies.                              | 70%                         | 26%                              | 4%         |

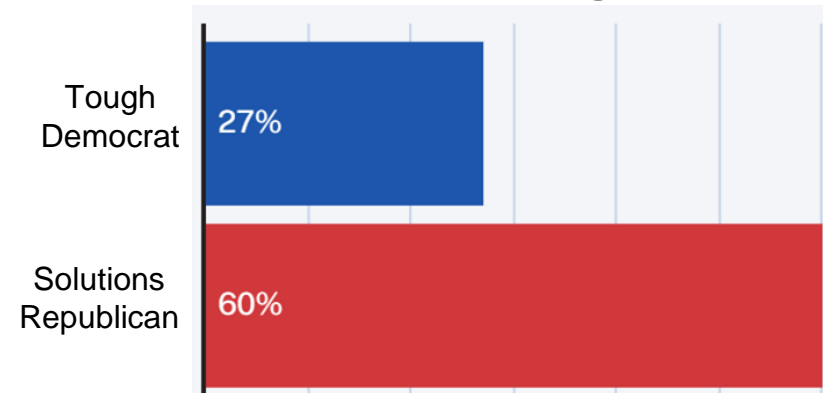

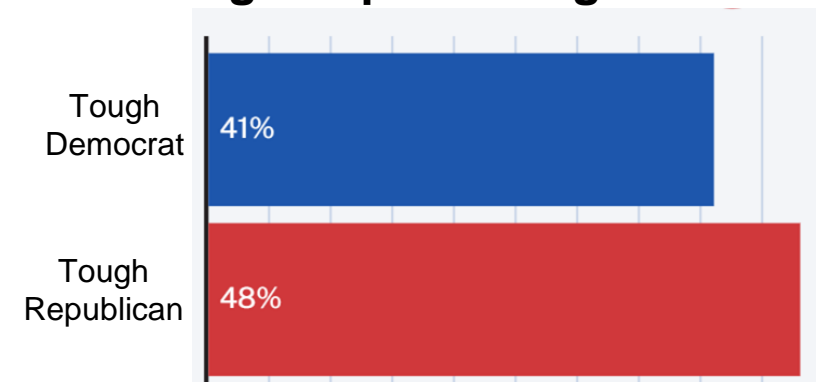
