RESPONDENTS' REQUEST FOR CONDITIONS OF RELEASE

Because Petitioner remains subject to removal proceedings in immigration court, this Court directed Respondents to submit proposed conditions of release. The requested conditions are contained in the Proposed Order, filed herewith, and are intended to balance the Court's May 9 Order with Immigration and Customs Enforcement's legitimate interests in being able to administer removal proceedings. The requested conditions are several of the standard conditions of release that apply to aliens who are subject to removal proceedings and who are released on recognizance. *See* Form I-220A, Order of Release on Recognizance, filed herewith as Exhibit 1.

Upon receipt of the Court-approved list of conditions, to confirm Petitioner's receipt of and awareness of those conditions and to harmonize the Court's order with the on-going removal proceedings, ICE intends to serve Petitioner with a Form I-220A, Order of Release on

Recognizance, that reflects both the Court's May 9 Order as well as the list of approved conditions at Petitioner's next check-in with a deportation officer in or near Boston.

PROPOSED ORDER

Recognizing that Petitioner remains subject to removal proceedings in immigration court, and Respondents' legitimate interests in the administration of removal proceedings, the Court hereby amends its May 9 order releasing Petitioner under *Mapp v. Reno*, to add the following conditions of release:

- Petitioner must report for any hearing or interview as directed by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) or the Executive Office for Immigration Review.
- Petitioner must report to Boston Enforcement and Removal Operations (ERO) by calling
 (781) 359-7500 within 48 hours of the issuance of this order for further reporting instructions. If required to report in person, the address is 1000 District Ave., Burlington,
 MA 01803.
- Petitioner must surrender for removal from the United States if so ordered.

- Petitioner must not change her place of residence without first securing written permission from the officer listed above.
- Petitioner must advise the officer listed above in advance of any overnight travel outside the states of Massachusetts or Vermont.
- Petitioner must not violate any local, State or Federal laws or ordinances, including but not limited to:
 - o 18 U.S.C. § 922(g)(5) (relating to possessions of firearms by aliens);
 - o 8 U.S.C. § 1302 (relating to registration as an alien);
 - o 8 U.S.C. § 1304(e) (relating to the need to carry proof of registration); and
 - o 8 U.S.C. § 1305(a) (relating to timely updating address changes).
- Petitioner must assist ICE in obtaining any necessary travel documents.
- Petitioner must not associate with known gang members, criminal associates, or be associated with any such activity.
- Petitioner must continue to follow any prescribed doctor's orders whether medical or psychological including taking prescribed medication.
- Petitioner must provide ICE with written copies of requests to Embassies or Consulates requesting the issuance of a travel document.
- Petitioner must provide ICE with written responses from the Embassy or Consulate regarding your request.

Failure to abide by these conditions may result in you being taken into ICE custody, as well as the possibility of being criminally prosecuted.

ICE shall serve Petitioner with a Form I-220A, Order on Release on Recognizance, that is consistent with both the Court's May 9 Order as well as the above list of conditions.
