I, Desiree Guerra, hereby declare and state as follows:

1. I am over eighteen years old, and I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth in this Declaration. I could and would testify competently to those facts if called to be a witness in this case.

2. I am a parent member of Family Forward Oregon, a non-profit organization that organizes and empowers Oregon mothers and caregivers to fight for racial, gender, and economic justice, including access to affordable and quality childcare for all Oregon families.

3. I am a resident of Salem, Oregon, and the mother of two children, ages two and
three.

4. My two-year-old son is currently enrolled in an Early Head Start program in Oregon.

5. My three-year-old daughter has aged out of the Early Head Start program and is waiting to attend Head Start in September of 2025.

6. My family is low-income and cannot afford childcare programs where we live. We depend on the Head Start program to give our children the strong and healthy start that they deserve.

7. Head Start has been a critical part of our lives. It provides my two young children with early education, healthy meals and snacks, social skills, and a safe and structured environment. It gives them the opportunity to grow, learn, and be cared for in ways that I simply couldn't do on my own while managing all of my responsibilities.

8. Since joining Head Start, my son has been able to develop his skills. My son's teachers brag to me that he is ahead of his class in his speech and motor skills. He has become more assertive, confident, and outgoing since starting the Head Start program. He also has developed empathy and understanding when someone is hurt. He stands up for other kids in his class when kids are picking on them. He also loves to help more around the house, and he is even excited for potty training.

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9. Access to Head Start has also helped to encourage my son to try new healthy foods. My son can try a variety of healthy food that he does not have access to at home due to our financial situation, and I fear that if we lose access to Head Start, my son will not have access to the same healthy snacks and meals that he does now. I do not think we can afford to spend more on groceries, as we already struggle with money at the end of every month.

10. My daughter was enrolled in the same Early Head Start program for a shorter amount of time, due to her age. While enrolled in Early Head Start, she looked forward to going each week. She became more outgoing and confident while she was enrolled in the program, and also had social development with other kids her age. Her speech improved, and she made new friends.

11. My daughter can't wait to start the Head Start program this September. She asks me every day since she aged out of the program, "Mommy, when I go to school?" She tells me, "Mommy, I want to go to school." She will cry about her brother being able to go to school and how she cannot at this moment. I fear that if we lose access to Head Start, my daughter will be devastated, as she would not be able to go back to school for another three years.

12. I am especially worried about the current presidential administration's attacks on diversity, equity, inclusion, and accessibility ("DEIA") in Head Start. My children are mixed-race, and proudly Black, Chilean, and white. They benefit from Head Start's DEIA programs. It is important that my children are in an environment where they learn about and are taught to celebrate their Black and Hispanic heritage and identity. It is important that they are surrounded by diverse staff and classmates.

13. Access to Head Start means that I am able to attend college as a full-time student, where I am studying social work. I chose to become a social worker because I want to help other families like mine and be part of the change I believe in. I wouldn't be able to do that without the support that the Head Start program provides.

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14. Without Head Start, I wouldn't be able to attend my classes or complete assignments with the focus and time that I need. Knowing my children are safe and learning gives me the peace of mind to keep pushing forward in school.

15. I have also benefited from Head Start's parenting classes, and those classes helped me a lot. The parenting classes that I was apart of taught me about the circle of security, which is about strengthening parent-child relationships. The classes helped me to better understand the needs of children, and helped me to reparent myself as well.

16. Losing Head Start would be a blow to my family and other families like mine who are working hard every single day to build a better life. Losing Head Start threatens not only my children's development, but also my ability to finish school and eventually give back to my community.

17. My family is not asking for handouts—we're asking for a fair shot. Head Start helps families rise. It gives kids a chance to succeed and parents the support they need to keep going.

18. These attacks on Head Start send the message that our children's futures don't matter. But they do. And I won't stop speaking up until they're heard.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
