Re: Support for Prescription Abortion Medication

On behalf of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), YouGov fielded a survey of 1,006 registered voters nationwide between May 21 and 23, 2025 to assess support for prescription abortion medication. Overall, a majority of voters say that abortion should be legal in most cases and support allowing women to use prescription abortion medication. The following are key findings from the poll:

- **57 percent of voters say that abortion should be legal in all or most cases**, including 88 percent of Democrats, 44 percent of Independents, and 28 percent of Republicans.
- **61** percent of voters support allowing women to access medication abortion, including 87 percent of Democrats, 44 percent of Independents, and 36 percent of Republicans.
- **59** percent of voters oppose nationwide restrictions on abortion medication, including 80 percent of Democrats, 55 percent of Independents, and 38 percent of Republicans.
- Voters disagree with making abortion care harder to receive:
 - 69 percent of voters agree the statement: "Women in every state deserve access to safe, effective medication, including abortion medication."
 - 94 percent of Democrats, 57 percent of Independents, and 44 percent of Republicans agree.
 - 66 percent of voters agree with the statement: "Making it harder to get medication used for abortion care would insert politics into decisions that should be made between a woman and her health care provider."
 - 88 percent of Democrats, 64 percent of Independents, and 45 percent of Republicans agree.
 - 64 percent of voters agree with the statement: "Requiring women to travel long
 distances just to pick up a prescription medication in person would needlessly prevent
 some people in our communities from getting the abortion care they need. Women
 should not have to travel long distances just to pick up a prescription for abortion
 medication."
 - 88 percent of Democrats, 54 percent of Independents, and 42 percent of Republicans agree.

Methodology: This above is based on 1,006 interviews conducted by YouGov on the internet of registered voters. The sample was weighted according to gender, age, race/ethnicity, education, and U.S. Census region based on voter registration lists, the U.S. Census American Community Survey, and the U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as 2020 Presidential vote and approximate 2024 Presidential vote based on available results. Respondents were selected from YouGov to be representative of registered voters. The margin of error (a 95% confidence interval) for a sample percentage p based upon the subsetted sample is approximately 3.3%.
