

1. Executive Summary

Overview: The GEO Group, Inc. (GEO) is pleased to present our response to the Request for Information (RFI) issued by the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) for Immigration Detention Services to support the Washington Field Office. GEO proposes the use of the Rivers Correctional Facility in Winton, NC, which offers a secure, fully functional, and strategically located detention setting within commuting distance of Richmond, VA.

The facility was purpose-built in 2001 and operated under federal contracts for more than two decades. This (b)(4)-bed facility, which includes a (b)(4)-bed Restrictive Housing Unit (RHU), is idle and available to serve ICE's detention needs. The facility provides a full range of services in alignment with ICE's National Detention Standards (NDS) 2019 and is capable of full activation within 90 days of award.

B. Facility Address: The facility is located at 145 Parker's Fishery Road, Winton, NC 27986. Situated on 257 acres in Hertford County, the facility lies in the northeastern region of North Carolina approximately 20 miles south of the Virginia state line. This location provides direct highway access and is within a two-hour surface commute of the ICE Richmond sub-office and approximately 60 miles from the Norfolk sub-office. Its rural setting offers a secure operational environment with minimal community disruption while ensuring proximity to key transportation networks and regional support services.

C. Facility Ownership: GEO is the sole owner of the Rivers Correctional Facility. As a publicly traded company with decades of experience in facility development, ownership, and management, GEO maintains full control of the site and all supporting infrastructure. The property is privately owned and was originally financed, constructed, and operated by GEO under a contract with the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP). The facility remains fully maintained and available for immediate use in support of ICE operations under a new contract award.

D. Facility Operator: As a leading provider of correctional, detention, and reentry services, GEO has a demonstrated track record of performance supporting ICE and other federal agencies. GEO brings more than 30 years of ICE operational experience and will manage all aspects of daily operations, including security, transportation, medical care, food service, and facility administration. The facility will be led by an experienced Facility Administrator and supported by GEO's regional and corporate infrastructure to ensure operational excellence, compliance with NDS 2019, and accountability across all service areas.

E. Proposed ICE Detention Standard: The facility will operate in compliance with the NDS 2019. The facility is designed and equipped to meet NDS 2019 requirements across all service areas, including security, housing, medical and mental health care, food services, recreation, legal access, and grievance procedures. GEO has extensive experience implementing these standards across its national ICE portfolio and will ensure that all operations at Rivers comply with the performance expectations outlined in the NDS framework.

G. Year Built: The facility was constructed in 2001 by GEO to meet the specifications of a federal detention contract. It was purpose-built to support secure housing, medical, and programmatic needs for federal detainees. Since its original use, the site has been continuously maintained. The facility is available for immediate activation to support ICE operations under NDS 2019.

O. Experience with ICE Operations and Detention Standards: GEO is the largest detention services provider to ICE, with nearly 40 years of operational experience under ICE contracts. GEO currently operates 18 ICE-contracted detention facilities nationwide and has successfully implemented and maintained compliance with both the NDS and Performance-Based National Detention Standards (PBNDS).

GEO's operational framework includes specialized training programs, quality assurance protocols, and performance monitoring systems tailored to ICE requirements. GEO's extensive portfolio and longstanding relationship with ICE underscore its capacity to provide mission-critical support, rapidly respond to agency needs, and ensure continuous compliance with evolving federal detention mandates.

P. Transportation Distances and Local Services: The facility is within direct access to major transportation and emergency services. The facility is approximately 102 miles (1 hour, 50 minutes) from Richmond International Airport and 9.7 miles from ECU Health Roanoke-Chowan Hospital. The nearest fire station is the Winton Volunteer Fire Department, two miles away. Bus access is available in Ahoskie, NC, and the facility lies within a well-connected regional highway network. The nearest immigration court is located in Richmond, VA. These logistics support timely medical response, efficient detainee movement, and access to legal proceedings.

- List potential impediments to facility operation (pending or expected legal issues, state/county statutes, political concerns including opposition to ICE mission within local and state government/community, etc.).

D. RFI Submission
