Tom, Garrett is off today. I'll talk to him on Tuesday and see what's new that we can put together for you. This was a hot topic over the weekend at the IACP Highway Safety meeting. However, be cautious. Many LE executives expressed concerns about their officers making large sums of overtime at highway construction sites but serve little if any safety or enforcement measure. As you are aware, in most cases a marked patrol unit with all emergency lights activated is the first vehicle placed in the construction zone for the purpose of warning/detering. However in reality there is little deterrent to reducing speed because motorists realize that there in fact is almost no enforcement activity. Some executives are looking to change the way they do business and have their officers there for enforcement purposes and not as a warning vehicle. Unions are already weighing in on the issue citing officer safety concerns. The NYS Police are changing their policy. Major Salmon said they are mobilizing 100 troopers to deploy statewide for speed enforcement in construction zones. Other states have significantly increased their fines, while others are considering automated speed enforcement. Chief Bud Pendleton, Waterford CT PD is representing the CT Chief's of Police on this issue on a statewide committee, Phil Weiser may be aware of it, if not I'm sure that Bud would be happy to talk to you. I hope all is well. I met with the new Commissioner of the PA State Police, Colonel Frank Pawlowski this week. His Patrol Director Major Harvey Cole and his DC of Operations, Lt. Col Lenny Bandy were also in attendance.

They are interested in finding a way to use LPRs or photo radar in construction zones. Do you have any information on that? They are also interested in knowing if we have a guideline for position patrol cars in construction zones? The LT Col wants to position them facing traffic instead of in the same direction. He believes members will be afforded better crash protection should their vehicle be struck by a passing motorist. Anything on that? From IACP? or our international partners?

Even more obscure: do we have anything on pre-emptive highway closures due to bad weather (snow)? Any Rocky Mountain states or Pacific Northwest states have a policy?
