Program Narrative

With the assistance of the 2012 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program the Danbury Police Department will be able to a mobile license plate reader system which will be used by a Danbury Police Officer in the future for law enforcement proactive patrol activities. These canine activities include traffic enforcement, serving arrest warrants, as well as other related investigative activities.

Police Patrol Function

The Danbury Police Department is responsible for patrolling the City of Danbury, Ct. and its approximately 80,000 residents. The department employs approximately 150 full-time sworn officers. The main division of the department is the patrol division which is comprised of approximately 90 officers. The patrol division is responsible for patrolling the nearly 44 square mile of Danbury as well as responding to calls for service by its citizens.

The Community Conditions Unit falls under the patrol division and is comprised of one police sergeant and four police offices. These officers are proactive police officers who address wife ranging quality of life issues from drug sales, crimes of violence, and crimes against property. When there is an increase in certain crimes in certain neighborhoods CCU Officers attempt to address these problems through proactive measures while evaluating causational issues such as location, social-economic issues, method of operation, and any other information available.

In an effort to assist with the efforts of the Community Conditions Unit, the Danbury Police will purchase one mobile license plate reader system. This system will be mounted on a marked Danbury Police cruiser that is specifically assigned to the officer of the Community Conditions Unit. While mounted on a police cruiser, this license plate reader will capture the images of license plates and simultaneously compare them with license plates which are currently on "Hot Lists." The patrolling officer will then be notified if/when they are in the vicinity of a vehicle that has been reported stolen or possibly occupied by a wanted person. This system will greatly enhance the performance of these officers while on patrol.
