Dear Senators Feinstein, Murray, and Wyden:

On behalf of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), we are writing to thank you for introducing legislation to nullify Executive Order 13798, "Promoting Free Speech and Religious Liberty," signed by President Trump on Thursday, May 4, 2017.

As your legislation correctly notes, this EO lays a foundation for potential discrimination against LGBTQ people, women, and religious minorities under the guise of religious liberty. Its directive to federal agencies to explore religious-based exceptions to healthcare cues up potential future battles, but, for now, leaves the current status quo unchanged.

The ACLU will continue our steadfast charge to defend Americans' right to exercise their religion and ensure their freedom from having others' beliefs forced upon them. Should the Trump administration use this EO to trigger official government action that would license discrimination against LGBTQ people, women and religious minorities, the ACLU will not hesitate to bring a legal challenge.

Thank you again for your leadership on this issue. We look forward to continuing to work together to protect civil liberties and civil rights.
