 - This website is categorized as "Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual" and is blocked. Any user can request that a website be unblocked at any time. Based on our records and recollection, no one has requested that the Technology Management Systems (TMS) department unblock this website.

2. All information regarding the District's use of internet filter software to block the following websites:

- This website is categorized as "Advocacy Group" and is unblocked.


c. The It Gets Better Project: <http://www.itgetsbetter.org/>


- This website is categorized as "Uncategorized" and is blocked. Any user can request that a website be unblocked at any time. Based on our records and recollection, no one has requested that the TMS department unblock this website.

3. All information regarding any request to block or unblock specific websites and the resolution of such requests. Attached is a spreadsheet titled mem040811 pir #3 that shows the list of websites that have been blocked or unblocked based on user requests.

4. All information regarding which categories of websites were selected to be blocked pursuant to the default configuration of the internet filtering software (i.e. the configuration in place at the time the software was initially installed); In the initial configuration and setup of Websense, our Internet filtering software, we had one group of filtering categories, both for students and staff. In 2009, the district reviewed the blocking categories and decided to create two groups - a group for students and a group for teachers/staff. Attached are three documents that describe the blocking categories for both groups. Website blocking categories associated with human sexuality have been blocked since 1997, with the option to unblock websites upon request.

7. Communications between the internet filtering provider(s) and any representative or agent of the District concerning which categories of websites had been (or would be) blocked; and Same as #4 and #5.

8. Contracts and agreements, including service and maintenance agreements, between the internet filtering provider(s) and any representative or agent of the District. Attached is a copy of our Websense subscription for 2010-2011.

Rick Kirk asked us to form a team to discuss our current levels of network access and restrictions. Our first meeting is December 10, 2008 at 9:00 at the E.F. Green Center. Our team is comprised of Diana Cox, Bruce Davis, Suzanne Heinrich, Rick Kirk, Steve Koester, Greg Lynd, Candace Ochoa, Pete Pape, and Alicia Brooks. Our goal is to have an in depth technical discussion about our network access policy and what we can do to improve and/or communicate the need for network restrictions. To increase meeting coordination, the following is a guide to be used during our discussion.

Background – Our Current Network Access Policy

Our GCCISD network is based on Microsoft's standard network design. It is estimated that Microsoft maintains 90% of the network market share. Other popular products are Linux and Novell. We use both Microsoft's Operating System for clients (computers and laptops) and servers (network servers). In doing so we are bound to the security capabilities that Microsoft has developed within their products. Microsoft Windows XP has predefined network security settings built-in to the operating systems and there are four (4) types of predefined security groups: Guest, Users, Power Users, and Administrators. The following is a summary of each user group's network access levels:

- **Guests** - The Guests group grants limited access to occasional or one-time users. Once a Guest logs out, all files created by the guest is deleted.
 - **Guests Can:** Log in and out, Run installed applications, Navigate through the file system, and Shut down the system
 - **Guests Cannot:** Do anything else
- **Users** - Users can perform common tasks, but have little power to affect the computer outside of their own account. The Users group is the most secure environment in which to run programs, since a User cannot affect the operating system or program files.
 - **Users Can:**
 - Create, modify, and delete their own data files
 - Run system-wide or personally installed applications
 - Change their personal settings and Install programs for their own use only
 - Access the network, print to local or networked printers
 - Do anything a Guest can
 - **Users Cannot:**
 - Modify system-wide settings, operating system files, or program files
 - Affect other users' data or desktop settings
 - Install applications that can be run by other users
 - Add printers and Configure the system for file sharing

- **Power Users** - The Power User group can perform any task except for those reserved for Administrators. They are allowed to carry out functions that will not directly affect the operating system or risk security.
 - **Power Users Can:**
 - Create local user accounts
 - Modify user accounts which they have created
 - Change user permissions on users, power users, and guests
 - Install and run applications that do not affect the operating system
 - Customize settings and resources on the Control Panel, such as Printers, Date/Time, and Power Options
 - Do anything a User can
 - **Power Users Cannot:**
 - Access other users' data without permission
 - Delete or modify user accounts they did not create
 - Install programs that affect the operating system
- **Administrators** - Members of the Administrator group have total control over the computer and everything on it.
 - **Administrators Can:**
 - Create, modify, and access local user accounts
 - Install new hardware and software
 - Upgrade the operating system
 - Back up the system and files
 - Claim ownership of files that have become damaged
 - Do anything a Power User can

We primarily use the Power User and Administrator groups. As an example, everyone on this team is assigned to the following groups:

- Bruce Davis – Power User
- Suzanne Heinrich – Power User
- Rick Kirk – Power User
- Steve Koester – Power User
- Greg Lynd – Power User
- Candace Ochoa – Power User
- Pete Pape – Power User
- Alicia Brooks – Administrator Group – Only in Educational Technology Lab and on Teacher Computers.
- Frankie Jackson – Power User
- Matt Flood – Administrator Group
- Joe Tesar – Administrator Group
- PC Technicians, other TMS LAN Managers – whose main function is to support, maintain, and repair district computers – Administrator Group.
- Campus CTS – Administrator Group – Only for their assigned campuses.

Basis for our Network Access Design

Advances in networking technology such as permanent connectivity to the Internet have introduced enormous network access challenges. A connection between a computer and any network, especially the Internet, increases the level of risk from malicious software and external attackers, and as old risks are managed, new ones are discovered or created. It is estimated that the number of malicious programs detected increases 10% every year since 1999.

A significant factor that increases the risks from malicious software is the tendency to give users administrative rights on their client computers. When a user or administrator logs on with administrative rights, any programs that they run, such as browsers, e-mail clients, and instant messaging programs, also have administrative rights. If these programs activate malicious software, that malicious software can install itself, manipulate services such as antivirus programs, and even hide from the operating system. Users can run malicious software unintentionally and unknowingly, for example, by visiting a compromised Web site or by clicking a link in an e-mail message.

Malicious software poses numerous threats, from intercepting a user's logon credentials with a keystroke logger to achieving complete control over a computer or an entire network by using a rootkit. Malicious software can cause Web sites to become inaccessible, destroy or corrupt data, and reformat hard disks. Effects can include additional costs such as to disinfect computers, restore files, re-enter/re-create lost data or worse, bring down the network. Our network access structure is based on the Department of Defense Trusted Computer System Evaluation Criteria, (DOD-5200.28-STD). It is the accepted industry standard for computer security. The design is based on the Least-Privilege User (LUP) account approach. See **supporting documentation A** for a complete description of how LUP works. In short, it is a principle that limits the network/computer damage that can result from an accident, error, or unauthorized use. Benefits of this strategy include: increased security, increased manageability, increased productivity, reduced costs, reduced piracy, and reduced legal liability issues. Microsoft has taken this strategy and applied it to windows XP, TMS has taken this strategy and applied it to the GCCISD Network. Our average network up time has been consistently at 99.8% for the past 10 years. Our district has not been plagued by a malicious attack in 5 years. We attribute our success to our network access design.

If the LUP account approach is not used, it will open our district up to network security vulnerabilities in an uncontrolled environment and from a legal perspective, may lead to pirated software being installed on district computers.

Another Type of Network Access Policy - Internet Content Filtering

Another type of network access policy is Internet content filtering, which is different than how the user's physical network policy is defined, such as their login id and the credentials authorized for that user. Internet content filtering monitors the user's Internet access and blocks them from accessing inappropriate websites. There are a number of products on the market. We use WebSense www.websense.com. The following is supporting documentation about our current process.

Examples of Tasks That You Are Unable to Perform and What We Can Do to Improve/Change:

1. Network Access Rights

- Ability to download the most recent version of Flash player
- Ability to download updated CPS (e-instruction) software
- Ability to defragment laptop or run system utilities
- Ability to load updates for programs (ie., Adobe, Adobe Flash Reader, Java) on the desktop as well as laptop.
- Ability to add printer to desktop and laptop computers.
- Ability to download Microsoft Compatibility Pack for Microsoft 2007.
- Issues/Concerns with wireless connectivity while out of town.
- Ability to load personal and/or business software on computers.

What we can do to compromise or identify the risk.

- Look at assigning a CTS to the service centers that do not have one - would provide building support not just departmental support.
- Mandate that anyone granted administrator rights sign Attachment T (see supporting document G).

2. Internet Content Filtering Rights

- Website blocked and must request Principal approval to unblock
- Website blocked and Principal must get TMS to unblock in WebSense

What we can do to compromise or identify the risk.

- Set policies based on user groups (Teacher, Administrator, Student...)

What Should Districts Do About Internet Content Filtering?

When it comes to giving students and employees Internet access, most districts are faced with the question of whether or not to monitor Internet access and block access to inappropriate sites. Most districts are finding that a balanced approach is required, combining different Internet content filtering technologies with monitoring, and a well-advertised Internet usage policy that creates the right balance between freedom and control. This article will explain what Internet content filtering is in hopes to help you make the right decision for your district.

Why should districts consider Internet monitoring and blocking? Because network traffic can increase, productivity can dip, and most important, districts may find themselves sued. Also, in July of 1998, the federal government added a proposal to a spending bill requiring schools and libraries that receive federal money for Internet connections to install filtering software to block inappropriate material for students. The amendment requires use of filtering by all institutions receiving money under a subsidy program called the education rate, or E-rate, that was established in the 1996 Telecommunications Act.

What is Internet Content Filtering? It is a combination of hardware and software products that monitor where users are going on the Internet and block users from going to inappropriate websites. Filtering products emerged three years ago, however only within the last year has filtering become commonly used. Districts that have had Internet access for one or two years are now seeing that they need filtering products to ensure that the Internet is being used as an educational tool.

There are a variety of products available to help districts monitor Internet usage and/or block access to certain Web sites. Products such as NetPartners' WebSENSE, Spyglass' Surfwatch, N2H2, and Elron's Internet Manager, just to name a few, help districts turn access on and off to sites by category or by keyword. Typically, organizations seek to block pornographic, racist, and terrorist sites, and in some cases, they also block sports, travel, and hobby sites. These products can be loaded on firewall, proxy, or stand-alone servers and contain reporting features to help determine how much Web traffic is going to non-work-related sites.

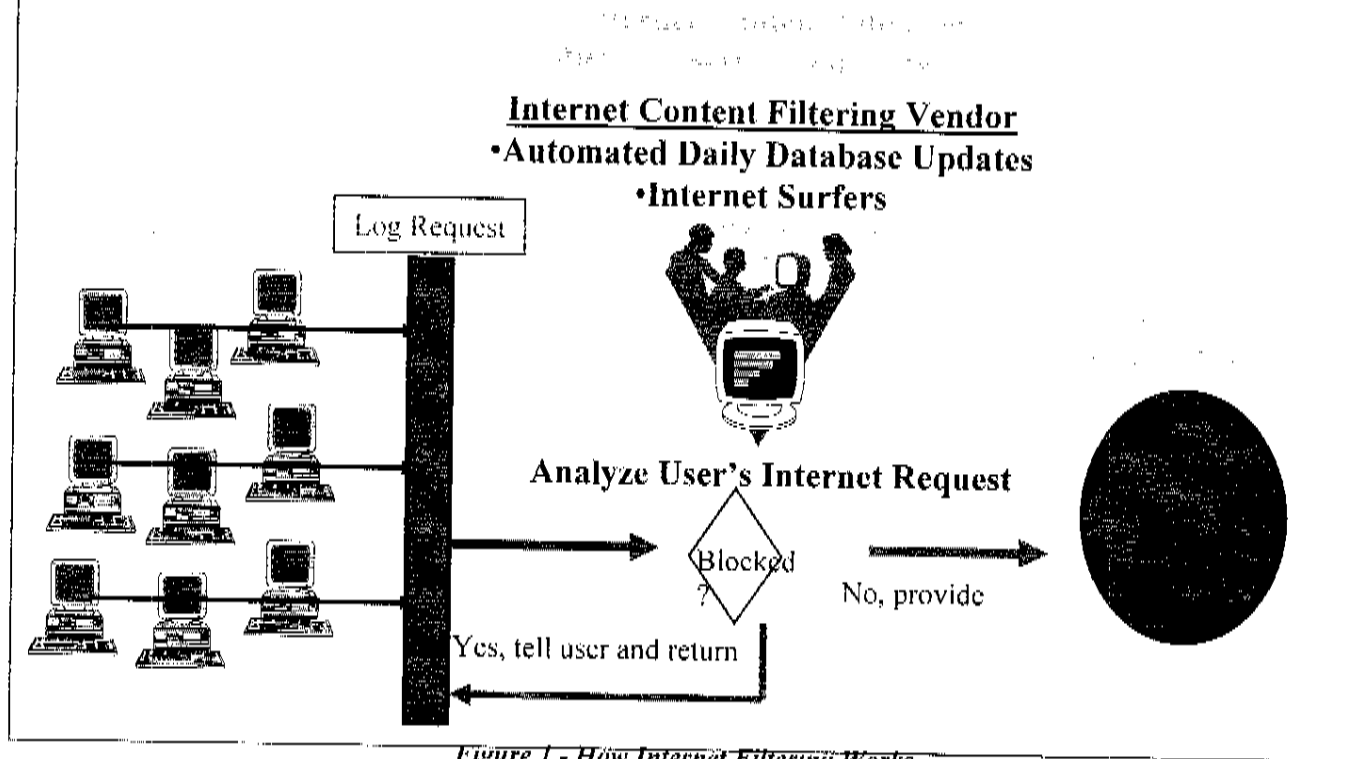


Figure 1 - How Internet Filtering Works

How Does Internet Filtering Work? Though there are a variety of Internet filtering products on the market, the easiest type of product to manage is one that is network server based. This is commonly referred to as a "proxy" server that requires both hardware and software components. Once the filtering product is installed on the network server, it works by analyzing each Internet request and compares the request to a list of "designated blocked websites by screening categories". Screening categories normally include sites related to websites that are related, e.g. religion, education, travel, etc. System administrators can decide which screening categories to block. Attempts to access blocked sites are rejected by the Internet filtering software. Most products contain an activity log so management can see what sites have been accessed and/or blocked. Figure 1 is a representation of how filtering works.

1. A user requests access to a website.
2. The user's request is routed through a network proxy server
3. The network proxy server software analyzes, logs, and filters the user's request. Logging normally includes who the user is, what site is being requested, the date and time, etc.
4. If the user's request is not designated as a "blocked" website, access to the Internet is given.
5. If the user's request is designated as a "blocked" website, the user will be given a message and will not be given access to the Internet website.
6. If the user request is not blocked, access to the Internet is provided and the user's request is fulfilled.

The filtering software determines which sites are inappropriate by consulting a database, which is organized into screening categories. The database is kept current automatically by the software vendor program, which downloads a new copy of the database every day (at a configurable time interval) via the Internet.

Most filtering companies employ full-time "Internet Surfers" that continually scan the Internet looking for new sites to be added to the database. It is estimated that there are thousands of new sites per day available on the Internet. Automated tools are used to retrieve the new Internet sites. Each day Internet Surfers review, rate, and categorize each new Internet site. The sites are rated based on key words and categories. Most filtering companies provide the flexibility to override access or customize the master database. This is an important feature because your district may not agree with the how Internet Surfers rate websites.

What Did Goose Creek Do? Internet monitoring and blocking was a requirement at Goose Creek before Internet access could be provided to any student. In September of 1997, a computer Internet access planning team spent six months evaluating Internet content filtering hardware and software products. The team conducted an in-depth product analysis, went on several site visits, and did internal hands-on product evaluation. We even brought in high school students to put the product to test. The team identified our needs and selected a product based on the following requirements.

- Customizable Internet accesses by topic and category.
- Ability to add or delete sites as the districts sees fit, regardless of how the filtering vendor set access privileges.
- Full set of monitoring and reporting of Internet access activity by user or groups of users.
- Capability for management override.
- User-friendly product that was easy to administer, maintain, and support.
- Personal rating system performed by filtering vendor employee(s), e.g. "Internet Surfers". We wanted personal intervention, not just a piece of software that automatically scans Website pathnames.
- Filtering for full pathnames not just Website names.

- Use of advanced screening technology to make certain as many inappropriate sites as possible are found.
- Solution that is transparent to the user.
- Daily database updates automatically sent from the vendor.
- Good vendor reputation in the industry with large marketshare to ensure product success.
- Solution that forces users to go through the filtering process regardless of how their computer settings are configured; only provide one exit point out onto the Internet.

Which Internet Filtering Product did Goose Creek Select? After extensive analyses, Goose Creek selected NetPartner's WebSENSE product. Though there are many suitable products on the market today, WebSENSE met most of our requirements. The product has been running successfully since July 1998. We are projecting that WebSENSE blocks 90% of inappropriate Internet sites. Acceptable use policies, student discipline, and teacher and management oversight are managing the remaining 10%. With a strict acceptable use policy and WebSENSE's reporting tools to monitor and report on Internet activity, we are keeping students safe and ensuring employee productivity on the Internet.

What should you do about Internet content filtering? You must assess the risks associated with Internet access and decide for your district. Regardless if you implement Internet content filtering, safety on the Internet is only successful if you have a formal acceptable use policy, training about acceptable use, an agreement from the user (in writing), and a disciplinary method of enforcing the policy.

Subject: Public Hearing for the Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA)

The **Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA)** went into effect on April 20, 2001. This new law places restrictions on the use of educational funding that is available through the Library Services and Technology Act, Title III of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, and for the Universal Service discount program known as the E-rate (Public Law 106-554). These restrictions mandate requirements for Internet safety policies and technology, which blocks or filters inappropriate material from being accessed through the Internet. Public schools receiving government funding for technology must comply with the newly enacted CIPA. The CIPA requires that districts hold a public hearing to review its Internet safety policy and technology protection measures.

Approval is requested to conduct a public hearing to review how Goose Creek is complying with the CIPA at the November 12, 2001 school board meeting. It is proposed that the following items be reviewed: 1) student Internet Acceptable Use Policy, 2) technology safety measures used at Goose Creek, 3) the list of Internet website categories that are blocked and unblocked, 4) the process used to block or unblock sites, and 5) the monthly review process to review Internet concerns.

It should be noted that Goose Creek was one of the first districts that proactively set into place content filtering and an Acceptable Use Policy (AUP). In 1997, prior to the CIPA and granting any use of Internet access for students, monitoring and blocking was set into place.

1. Student Internet Acceptable Use Policy

The student Internet Acceptable Use Policy (AUP) is defined in Administrative Guideline Code AG: 4.40A under the Security Policy for Personal Computing and Electronic Communications. It is also included in the student handbook and is distributed to parents and students at the beginning of each year. Students are required to sign an agreement stating that they will comply with the Internet AUP. A parental objection form is also included in the handbook so that the parent can object to his or her child having access to the Internet. A copy of the student Internet AUP is included on Attachment 1 and a copy of the parental Internet access objection form is included on Attachment 2.

2. Technology Safety Measures Used at Goose Creek

Goose Creek uses a balanced approach for keeping students safe on the Internet. Combining an Internet content filtering technology with monitoring and blocking, and a well-defined Internet usage policy, we believe the right balance between freedom and control is provided to students.

Internet content filtering is a combination of hardware and software products that monitor what websites students access on the Internet, and block students from going to inappropriate websites. There are a variety of products available to help districts monitor Internet usage and/or block access to certain Web sites. These products provide the capability to turn access on and off to sites by category or by keyword. These products are installed on proxy servers and contain reporting features to help determine how much Web traffic is going to all websites, including sites that are blocked.

2. Technology safety measures used at Goose Creek (continued)

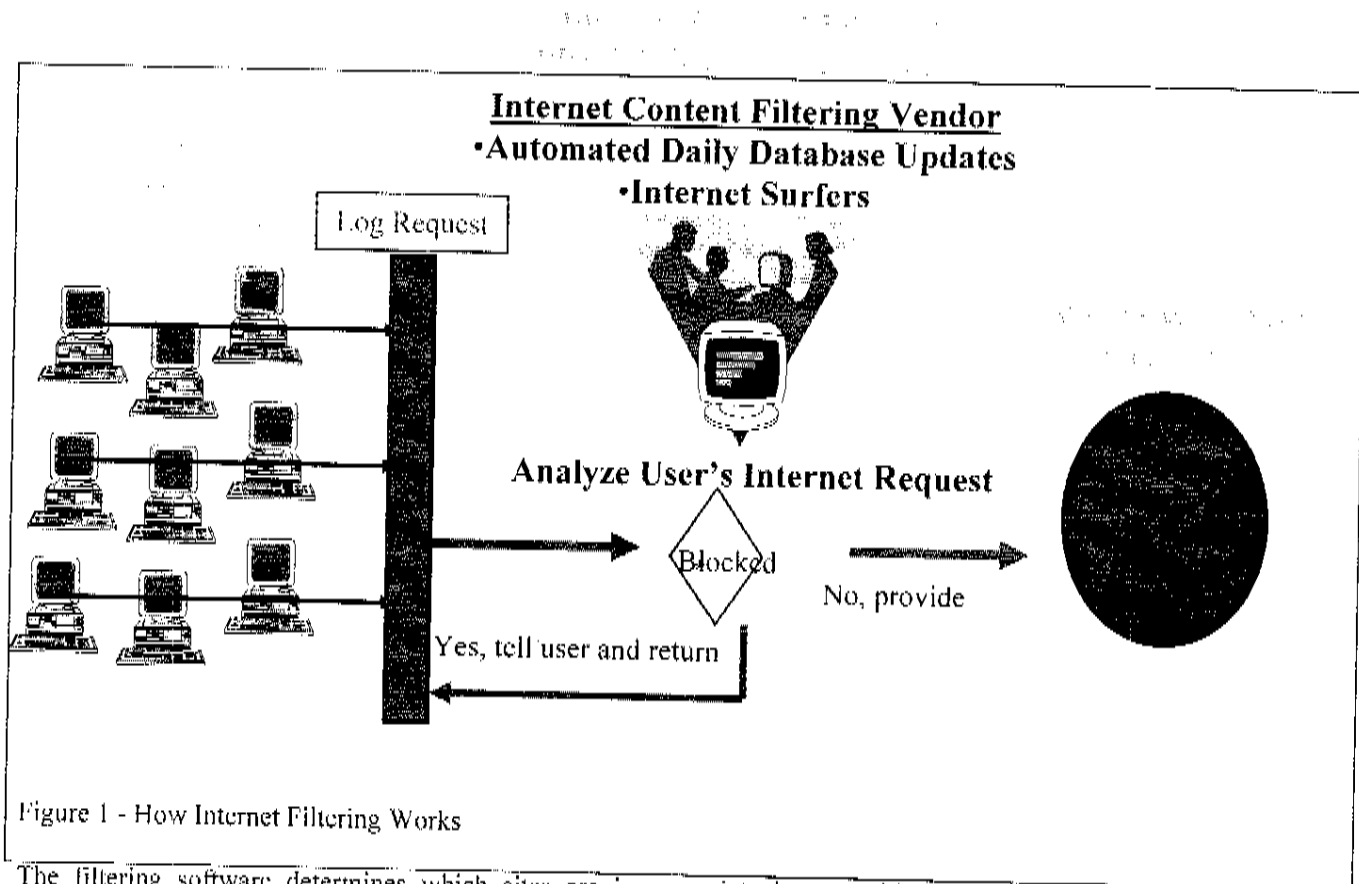


Figure 1 - How Internet Filtering Works

After careful analysis and evaluation, Goose Creek selected WebSense, a leading in Internet filtering software. It works by analyzing each Internet request and compares the request to a list of "designated blocked websites by screening categories". Screening categories normally include sites related to websites that are related, e.g. religion, education, travel, etc. System administrators can screen which categories to block. The WebSense Internet filtering software rejects attempts to access blocked sites. The software also produces an activity log so management can see what sites have been accessed and/or blocked. Figure 1 is a representation of how filtering works.

- A user requests access to a website.
- The user's request is routed through a network proxy server
- The network proxy server software analyzes, logs, and filters the user's request. Logging includes who the user is, what site is being requested, the date and time, etc.
- If the user's request is not designated as a "blocked" website, access to the Internet is granted.
- If the user's request is designated as a "blocked" website, the user will be given a message and will not be provided access to the Internet website.
- If the user request is not blocked, access to the Internet is provided and the user's request is granted.

3. The list of Internet website categories that are blocked versus those that are unblocked

The Internet websites are categorized based on the definitions defined in attachment A. These categories are broken down to provide the ability to adjust the level of access. The categories used by Websense sort out the millions of websites on the Internet. The categories are designed to collect together in useful groupings the kinds of sites of interest and concern. The categories tagged as *(BLOCKED)* are the categories that Goose Creek is currently blocking. At any time, these categories can be blocked or unblocked.

4. The Process Used to Block or Unblock Sites

If a student accesses a website that is *(BLOCKED)* by the district's Internet filtering software, he or she will receive an Internet security warning (see Figure 2). If the website is inappropriately blocked, the employee (teacher) can submit a Website Review Request form (see Figure 3). If an inappropriate website is NOT blocked, then the user can request immediate blockage by contacting the TMS Help Line or the TMS User Access Coordinator. These requests are worked as a top priority in the TMS department.

Philosophy

The purpose of this guideline is to establish a uniform TMS method for having web sites blocked or unblocked. TMS recognizes the precedence of the GCCISD guidelines, as outlined in the Administrative Guidelines, specifically the Security Policy for Personal Computing and Electronic Communications (Goose Creek CISD Acceptable Use Guidelines). This procedure is designed solely to extend the District guidelines to meet the specific needs of TMS, and should not be interpreted as being either independent of or superior to the District guidelines.

The TMS department will appoint a committee called the Computer Internet Access (CIA) Committee to select, implement, and maintain appropriate technology for filtering Internet sites containing material considered inappropriate or harmful to students. All Internet access will be filtered on computers with Internet access provided by the district. TMS seeks to block any web site that is inappropriate in a learning environment, or that is unreasonably distracting or offensive. When there is a need to evaluate whether a website should be blocked or unblocked, the CIA will use the following process.

Specific Guidelines

	Step	Responsibility
1	Teacher or administrator realizes that an inappropriate site is available to students. If the website content is inappropriate (obscene, contains child pornography, or is harmful to students) the teacher or administrator is to call the TMS Help Desk at 281-420-4499 and request that the site be blocked immediately.	Teacher or Administrator
2	Otherwise, the teacher or administrator contacts their campus principal or site administrator to request that the site be blocked or unblocked, using the <u>Internet Website Request Form for Blocking or Unblocking Websites</u> . The form must include both the web site address and the reason it should be blocked or unblocked.	Teacher or Administrator
3	The teacher or administrator calls or e-mails the TMS Technology Access Coordinator (TAC), or submits a TMS work order.	Teacher or Administrator
4	The TMS Technology Access Coordinator (TAC) checks the web site to ensure that the address is accurate, not currently blocked or unblocked, and that appropriate or inappropriate material is present. If so, an e-mail is sent to the CIA committee to request a majority vote.	TMS Technology Access Coordinator
5	The CIA committee reviews the website for appropriateness or inappropriateness. Each member casts their vote for blocking or unblocking the website to the TAC.	Computer Internet Access (CIA) Committee Member
6	The TMS Technology Access (TAC) Coordinator tallies up the votes and either blocks or unblock the website, as decided upon in step 5. The result is communicated to the CIA committee members and to the requesting Teacher or Administrator.	Technology Access Coordinator

The third meeting to discuss our current levels of network access and restrictions was held on Thursday, March 12, 2009 at 2:00 p.m. in Frankie Jackson's office. Our goal is to update our network access policy and improve and/or communicate the need for network restrictions. We are working in two categories of improvement: 1) Content Filtering, and 2) Network Access. Action items are as follows.

Internet Content Filtering

1. Discussed the new initiative to create an additional blocking category for Internet filtering. Currently we have one filtering group with 28 categories that suits all GCCISD students, teachers, and administrative staff. Created a second category for all district staff. Now we have two groups: Spent time during the meeting and reviewed the blocking categories. Made the following changes:
 - o Under the Student and Guests blocking categories:
 - Blocked the category Illegal and Questionable
 - o Under the Staff blocking categories:
 - Unblocked Abortion, Weapons, Racism & Hate, Games, youtube, and google images.
 - o A copy of both blocking categories are attached:
 - Blocking Categories for Students and Guests (Attachment A)
 - Blocking Categories for District Staff (Attachment B).
 - The new category for District staff is available for use at the following sites: E.F. Green Center, Administration, Lamar, Baytown Junior, and Goose Creek Memorial.
2. Alicia has the action to review the current process to request a site to be blocked or unblocked.
3. Alicia also has the action to rework the current message that appears when a web page is blocked.

Network Access

1. Continued to discuss expanding the computer rights for district staff.
 - Reviewed the AUP Computer Based Training for Administrative Computer Access. This can be referenced online at: <http://www.gccisd.net/default.aspx?name=TMSIHOMEPAGE>
 - Reviewed Attachment T (see attached), which is the current Acceptable Use Policy (AUP) used for technology staff and other District Staff needing increased Computer Access.
