The ACLU Foundation Immigrants' Rights Project is excited to present the newly updated version of our *Immigrant Services Directory: A National Guide of Service Providers*. The directory was originally designed for our own use through collecting information about various service organizations in all 50 states. We used the information to provide referrals to outside parties who needed immediate, direct services that we could not offer. Upon reflection we realized that grassroots organizations could benefit greatly from having directory of other similar groups in and around the states. We are hoping that this directory leads to coalition building and better grassroots organization for immigrants' rights.

The directory includes over 400 organizations from all fifty states. The guide is organized geographically, followed by an alphabetical index of organizations by name. Information about each organization is displayed in a standard one-page format with various fields indicating the services provided, the area and detention facilities served, non-English language services and other relevant information. The end of the directory includes a list of organizations with contact information for which we did not have completed forms.

I apologize to any entities that were overlooked and encourage organizations to contact us for inclusion in the next edition or to correct any of the information in the listing. Through a state-wide network of 21 offices, our staff conducts litigation, outreach and legal education on the most pressing issues facing low-income communities: housing; employment; education; workplace safety; discrimination; income maintenance and healthcare access. CRLA has developed initiatives that deal with many complex and persistent problems for rural communities: protecting the health and safety of farmworkers; guaranteeing that workers receive proper wages; protecting individuals from predatory lending; fighting for communities that lack basic infrastructure; advocating for indigenous Mexican farmworkers; providing education and training to prevent sexual harassment in the workplace; enforcing fair housing practices; supporting victims of domestic violence; guaranteeing the rights of children to a quality education; and increasing access to healthcare among California's low-income families.**
