Dear Ms. Rich,

On Wednesday, August 1st the Longmont Police Department (LPD) received your request for records related to our department's use of an automated license plate reader. We do in fact, have one (1) automated license plate reader (ALPR) unit that has been in use since August of 2011. This unit was obtained through a grant funded by the Colorado Auto Theft Prevention Authority (CATPA) as a cooperative initiative between several other Boulder County law enforcement agencies.

As such, some of the records that you are requesting will be provided by the Boulder County "host agency" which is the Boulder Police Department (BPD) as they maintain some of these records, and some records that are specific to the Longmont Police Department, will be provided by us. The records that are maintained at the Longmont Police Department (LPD) will be answered or provided electronically in this e-mail, and those which will be provided later by the Boulder Police Department will be so noted as "BPD".
