**Subject:** ALPR information request for the Louisville Police Department

The Louisville Police Department is one of several Boulder County law enforcement agencies that jointly participated under the aegis of the Boulder Police Department in applying for a grant for the purchase of ALPR technology. The Boulder Police Department received the grant through the State of Colorado, under the authority of the Colorado Auto Theft Prevention Authority. The Boulder Police Department was the grant applicant and served as the managing agency for the grant. It continues to host the computer server for the ALPR technology. Virtually all of the records or documents that are mentioned in your recent request reside there.

It is my understanding that the Boulder Police Department has received a request from the ACLU regarding the ALPR system. Further, it is my understanding that they are in the process of preparing and making available all information that you requested. I believe that the information that they will make available should be adequate for your purposes as it applies to our agency as well as to a host of other Boulder County law enforcement agencies who received the information request from ACLU and who participate in our count-wide ALPR.

To the extent that your request might address our individual agency, I believe that the only one that I noted was a reference to department rules or policies about the use of the ALPR. Our department does not have a specific policy regarding the use of the ALPR. Instead, since the data that is used through the ALPR network comes through NCIC and CCIC, we require all of our personnel who access such information understand and comply with the terms and conditions of use for CCIC and NCIC data. Those terms and conditions are established by and enforced through the State of Colorado. We comply with those requirements in all ways throughout our department. I have attached a scan of those for your request.
