RE: Letter of Agreement Regarding Transfer of License Plate Reader (LPR)

Dear Chief Worden:

The New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) will purchase a License Plate Reader (LPR) for your Law Enforcement Agency (Recipient) to commit to a three-year traffic safety improvement initiative. In addition, DCJS will provide a two-year manufacturer's warranty and vendor developed Operation Center Software license for use in crime reduction activities and the apprehension of offenders.

This letter of agreement will have the duration of three years from the equipment delivery date to the Recipient, and may be amended in writing upon the mutual consent of the Recipient and DCJS. This letter of agreement may be terminated at the discretion of the Commissioner of the Division of Criminal Justice Services.

This letter confirms the agreement between DCJS and the Recipient, wherein DCJS has agreed to transfer all right, title, and interest in the LPR to the Recipient, and the Recipient agrees to accept the transfer of all right, title, and interest in the LPR, upon the following conditions.

1. The Recipient agrees to appoint a staff member to coordinate the receipt and utilization of the LPR (see attached Agency Coordinator Contact Form). The Recipient agrees to notify DCJS in writing of any personnel changes in regards to the LPR program coordination. The coordinator will be required to submit quarterly report data to DCJS and make appropriate efforts to ensure that the LPR equipment is utilized a minimum of eight (8) hours per week.
2. The Recipient agrees to provide DCJS a standardized quarterly progress report for a minimum of three years regarding LPR usage (see attached LPR Quarterly Progress

I. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this policy is to provide uniform and proper use of the Mobile License Plate Reader (LPR) device by Patrol Members.

II. DESCRIPTION:

The Mobile License Plate Reader (LPR) is a vehicle-mounted camera system that is capable of reading and analyzing data from license plates attached to both oncoming vehicles in traffic and parked cars. The LPR represents an innovative tool for patrol officers to use in crime prevention, stolen vehicle recovery, scofflaw compliance, and missing persons/AMBER Alert recoveries.

III. POLICY:

- A. All LPR units (cameras and processors) shall be installed in patrol vehicles by qualified members of the Police Division in accordance with training received from DCJS, the manufacturer, or the LPR program coordinators.

- B. Vehicles equipped with LPR's should be used as often as possible by the patrol duty squads and an LPR-equipped patrol vehicle shall be deployed at a minimum of eight (8) hours per week.

Report). Each LPR contains software capable of generating the statistics necessary to complete the reporting requirements. Training on how to obtain the report from the LPR unit will be provided by the vendor upon installation and with subsequent software upgrades. This report data is essential in the ongoing evaluation on the effectiveness of LPR technology.

Quarterly reports are to be sent electronically or via fax to the designee of the Director of the Office of Program Development and Funding.

3. The Recipient agrees to provide an appropriate and compatible laptop computer for the use and operation of the LPR.
4. The Recipient agrees to accept all responsibility for the care and operation of the LPR. Furthermore, the Recipient agrees to provide for the maintenance and support of the LPR beyond the original two-year warranty and service contract. Prior to the expiration of the DCJS funded two-year warranty, the Recipient agrees to purchase the third year extended warranty which covers the latest version of the applicable software.
5. The Recipient agrees to develop and implement a departmental policy regarding the utilization of the LPR and provide said policy in writing to DCJS within 90-days receiving the LPR.
6. The Recipient agrees to implement strategic crime prevention and control initiatives regarding highway safety issues and other motor vehicle related offenses as recommended in the 'Operation of License Plate Readers for Law Enforcement Agencies in New York State' Suggested Guidelines (<http://www.criminaljustice.state.ny.us/ofpa/pdfdocs/approvedjune2007lprmanual1.pdf>). DCJS shall seek the return of any LPR equipment which is not effectively utilized for initiatives in accordance with the strategy recommendations.
7. The Recipient agrees to provide mutual assistance to law enforcement agencies in neighboring and/or overlapping jurisdictions which request the use of LPR's for special operations (subject to availability).
8. The Recipient agrees to immediately deploy the LPR when responding to the recovery of an abducted child (Amber Alert). The agency agrees to comply with the guidelines as issued by the Missing and Exploited Children's Clearinghouse (MECC) which are used during an AMBER Alert. Agencies should:
 - a. Provide notification to patrols.
 - b. Search during an incident.
 - c. Look back for encounter prior to the alert date.
 - d. Obtain assistance from other agencies with LPR equipment.
9. Any notice to either party must be in writing, signed by the party giving it, and shall be served personally, electronically or by mail to the other party. Notice to DCJS is to be given to the Deputy Commissioner of the Office of Program Development and Funding and notice to the Recipient is to be given to the person signing this letter of agreement on behalf of the Recipient or that individual's replacement pending a cessation of employment from the Recipient agency.

Financial Review

Revenue

The company's revenue for the year ended 31st December 2023 was \$1,234,567, representing a 12% increase from the previous year. This growth was primarily driven by the expansion of our product line and the successful launch of our new service offering. The revenue was broken down as follows: Product Sales: \$876,543; Service Revenue: \$358,024. The increase in revenue was supported by a strong marketing campaign and improved operational efficiency.

Operating expenses for the year were \$789,012, resulting in an operating profit of \$445,555. The primary drivers of expense growth were increased personnel costs and higher depreciation charges on our new equipment. Despite these increases, our operating margin improved from 35% to 36% due to the higher revenue and better cost control in several key areas.

The company's financial position at the end of the year was strong, with a total asset base of \$2,345,678 and a net worth of \$1,234,567. The balance sheet shows a healthy mix of current and long-term assets, and a low level of debt. The cash flow statement indicates that the company generated a positive cash flow of \$123,456, which was used to fund capital expenditures and pay dividends to shareholders. The income statement shows a net profit of \$234,567, which is a 15% increase from the previous year.

The company's financial performance over the year has been excellent, and we are confident that we will continue to grow and succeed in the future. We will continue to invest in our people and our technology to drive innovation and create long-term value for our shareholders.

B. TRAFFIC STOPS:

- 1. All traffic stops based on an LPR alarm will be made in a safe manner, in accordance with normal Departmental procedure.**
- 2. It is recognized that most LPR-based stops will be made on vehicles that are on-coming in traffic to the patrol vehicle. Because of this, extra care will be exercised by Patrol Officers attempting to make a turn to make the traffic stop.**
- 3. Officers should be aware that many LPR-based traffic stops will in most cases be involving at a minimum a misdemeanor offender, and often may involve a felony offender. Officers shall take all necessary precautions for their personal safety, and the safety of the public.**

C. MAINTENANCE:

- 1. The LPR database needs to be updated once daily by updating the "HOTLIST UPLOAD" on the in-car laptop computer. Officers can obtain the update file on their issued flash drives when acquiring their daily TRACS update. Officers will be instructed on how to update the LPR database, as the flash drives are made available to them with the implementation of the TRACS program. Additionally, alarms that have been entered by the officer and that have been subsequently cancelled should be removed from the database.**
- 2. Officers will be instructed on how to remove the cameras and processor from the vehicle. The equipment shall be removed from the vehicle if the vehicle is scheduled to be out of service for an extended period of time (in excess of three business days.) Normal vehicle maintenance (oil/tire changes, minor radio repair, etc.) should NOT require removal of the equipment.**
- 3. The rooftop cameras need not be removed for the purposes of running an LPR-equipped vehicle through a carwash.**
- 4. Officers may use a damp cloth or paper towel to clean the surface of the rooftop cameras if they become excessively dirty and performance suffers.**

5. Any problems with the equipment and/or software should be reported to a duty Supervisor immediately. Supervisors shall notify the program Sergeant, who will make notification to Administration.

1. All unattended patrol vehicles should be left locked and turned off in accordance with existing Dept. policy.



I. PURPOSE:

The purpose of this policy is to provide uniform and proper use of the Mobile License Plate Reader (LPR) device by Patrol Members.

II. DESCRIPTION:

The Mobile License Plate Reader (LPR) is a vehicle-mounted camera system that is capable of reading and analyzing data from license plates attached to both oncoming vehicles in traffic and parked cars. The LPR represents an innovative tool for patrol officers to use in crime prevention, stolen vehicle recovery, scofflaw compliance, and missing persons/AMBER Alert recoveries.

III. POLICY:

- A. All LPR units (cameras and processors) shall be installed in patrol vehicles by qualified members of the Police Division in accordance with training received from DCJS, the manufacturer, or the LPR program coordinators.
- B. Vehicles equipped with LPR's should be used as often as possible by the patrol duty squads and an LPR-equipped patrol vehicle shall be deployed at a minimum of eight (8) hours per week.



- C. A vehicle log indicating the date of use, officer name, shift and assignment, and data reflecting the number of arrests /recoveries made based on LPR “hits” will be filled out daily by every officer assigned to use an LPR-equipped patrol vehicle. The vehicle log will be submitted to the Desk Sergeant daily and forwarded to the Sergeant supervising the LPR program. .**

IV. PROCEDURE:

A. GUIDELINES

- 1. The LPR provides an audible alarm and displays a picture on the laptop screen of a suspect plate that it has read and compared to its database. The LPR software will display the reason for the alarm, i.e.: Suspended/Revoked, Stolen, Wanted, etc. on screen and the State or Canadian province of the associated plate corresponding to the “hit”. Before stopping a vehicle based on the LPR hit, officers should verify that the State of the wanted plate matches the plate number and state on their screen.**
- 2. During the course of a tour when alarms are issued by Radio Headquarters for wanted/missing persons, stolen vehicles, or any other type where an associated license plate is given, officers using an LPR equipped vehicle MUST enter the new license plate into the LPR database and record the entered plate on the LPR log.**
- 3. This Department complies with the guidelines issued by the Missing and Exploited Children’s Clearinghouse (MECC), which are used during an AMBER Alert. As such, it is necessary that during an AMBER Alert the LPR-equipped vehicle(s) will be deployed immediately if they are not in service during that duty tour. The LPR’s shall be used to search for the vehicle throughout the duration of the AMBER Alert, and the LPR database must be updated immediately to enter the suspect plate (s). The database must also be searched for prior contact with the suspect plate(s) and if there are any prior contacts found they must be reported to the appropriate authority immediately.**
- 4. Officers will forward a copy of the incident report associated with an LPR arrest to the program Sergeant or the Operations Lieutenant.**

B. TRAFFIC STOPS:

- 1. All traffic stops based on an LPR alarm will be made in a safe manner, in accordance with normal Departmental procedure.**
- 2. It is recognized that most LPR-based stops will be made on vehicles that are on-coming in traffic to the patrol vehicle. Because of this, extra care will be exercised by Patrol Officers attempting to make a turn to make the traffic stop.**
- 3. Officers should be aware that many LPR-based traffic stops will in most cases be involving at a minimum a misdemeanor offender, and often may involve a felony offender. Officers shall take all necessary precautions for their personal safety, and the safety of the public.**

C. MAINTENANCE:

- 1. The LPR database needs to be updated once daily by updating the "HOTLIST UPLOAD" on the in-car laptop computer. Officers can obtain the update file on their issued flash drives when acquiring their daily TRACS update. Officers will be instructed on how to update the LPR database, as the flash drives are made available to them with the implementation of the TRACS program. Additionally, alarms that have been entered by the officer and that have been subsequently cancelled should be removed from the database.**
- 2. Officers will be instructed on how to remove the cameras and processor from the vehicle. The equipment shall be removed from the vehicle if the vehicle is scheduled to be out of service for an extended period of time (in excess of three business days.) Normal vehicle maintenance (oil/tire changes, minor radio repair, etc.) should NOT require removal of the equipment.**
- 3. The rooftop cameras need not be removed for the purposes of running an LPR-equipped vehicle through a carwash.**
- 4. Officers may use a damp cloth or paper towel to clean the surface of the rooftop cameras if they become excessively dirty and performance suffers.**

The Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS), in partnership with the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee (GTSC), is beginning a **License Plate Reader (LPR)** distribution initiative to create safer roads throughout New York State. According to statistics provided by the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), approximately 11.1 million people have driver's licenses in the State during 2007. Currently, about 1.4 million of these licenses are suspended or revoked (aggravated unlicensed operation). According to statistics released by the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators (AAMVA), nearly 75% of these people disregard the law and continue to drive motor vehicles.


