Subject: Demonstration of the (Open Situation Room Exchange) OSRx - Using Data to Support Countering Violent Extremism (CVE):

On Behalf of the Director, JCTD Programs, Mr. Elmer Roman, Please join us for a demonstration of the OSRx capability and its potential use in addressing CVE. The OSRx is a publicly accessible data portal developed for the peacebuilding community and was developed by the PeaceTech Lab, an organization created by the U.S. Institute of Peace.

Capability: The OSRx capability provides a baseline view of conflict across the globe. It has a global outlook page to explore events and protests around the world as they unfold and compare levels of fragility across countries. The site's country dashboards allow users to view details of violent events, access visualizations of conversations in social media within each country, and explore longer-term trends in instability to place recent events in context.

Use of the OSRx for Countering Violent Extremism (CVE)

The demonstration will describe how the PeaceTech Lab plans to further develop the OSRx to support local and international researchers, practitioners and policymakers in CVE. In partnership with DoD and the U.S. Institute of Peace, the PeaceTech Lab aims to enable the production of new knowledge through sharing of relevant, usable data on violent extremism from structured and unstructured data sources. The data will be integrated into a collaborative and interactive environment that will enable the sharing of information and insights. The OSRx will leverage research methodologies, analytical tools, and existing data to provide a network of researchers and practitioners with the capabilities necessary to better understand and address CVE.
