1. The grantee will use the JAG grant to support law enforcement initiatives. Specifically, funds will be used to purchase two portable Automatic License Plate Reader Systems. By providing law enforcement personnel with the necessary equipment, personnel will be better prepared to detect, identify, prevent and disrupt acts of violence throughout the City.

Goals of the Project:

2. **Improved Traffic Enforcement Initiative:** The funding of two additional portable ALPR's will support the department's ability to detect additional traffic violations, stolen vehicles and citizens with outstanding arrest warrants.

- **Project Objectives: (Expand Upon Automatic License Plate Reader (ALPR) System Capability)**
The primary objective of this project is to expand upon our Department's ALPR capability.

- Funding two portable ALPR systems. Providing these additional state of the art electronic detection systems will significantly expand upon our officers ability to identify stolen traffic violations, stolen vehicles and citizen outstanding arrest warrants.
- This equipment will significantly increase our ability to improve vehicle operator safety as well as general overall public safety by detecting and arresting citizens with outstanding warrants.
- Our long term goal would be have several additional portable ALPR's available to each patrol shift as well as our agency's Narcotics/Vice Unit. Because our operational budget can not support the procurement of this equipment we will have to incrementally purchase this equipment as grant funding becomes available.

TITLE: PROVIDING TWO PORTABLE AUTOMATIC LICENSE PLATE READER SYSTEMS			
<p>NARRATIVE: This project will provide two additional portable Automatic License Plate Reader Systems (ALPR's). We currently have one fixed and one portable ALPR system in use. They were purchased with funding provided by grant award 2010-ARRC-SEMI-6-W7-016. These state of the art systems have served us very effectively. These violation detection systems are usually operated from a police vehicle. With their high resolution cameras they are capable of reading a license plate on a moving or stationary vehicle. The collected license plate information is then instantly compared to multiple law enforcement data bases including outstanding traffic violations, stolen vehicle lists, and outstanding warrants. As a result of the two previously purchased systems hundreds of citations have been issued, dozens of stolen vehicles recovered and numerous arrests made. We have found that the portable ALPR systems provide the greatest flexibility for the user. They can easily be moved from one police vehicle to another or can be operated at a stationary location. We firmly believe that the purchase of two more portable ALPR systems will enable our officers to increase their ability to detect many additional violations, as well as stolen vehicles and citizens with outstanding arrest warrants.</p>

Resolution No. 2305

A resolution of the City of Sanford, authorizing the submission of a grant application for the 2012 Edward Byrne Memorial Assistance Grant Program; providing for legislative findings and intent; providing for implementing administrative actions; providing for a savings provision; providing for conflicts; providing for severability and providing for an effective date.

Be it adopted and resolved by the City Commission of the City Of Sanford, Florida as follows:

Section 1. Legislative Findings And Intent.

(a). The City of Sanford has complied with all requirements and procedures of Florida law in processing and advertising this Resolution as may be necessary or required.

(b). The Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance (JAG) Grant Program (Title 42, *United States Code*, Section 3751 (a)) is the primary provider of federal criminal justice funding to state and local jurisdictions. The Byrne JAG Program is administered by the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs and was created in 2005 by merging the Byrne JAG Program with the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant Program. Byrne JAG Program funding can be used to support a broad range of state and local government projects, including those designed to prevent and control crime and to improve the criminal justice system. To ensure that each state and territory receives an appropriate share of JAG funds, allocation to state and local governments is based on a formula using population and crime statistics in combination with a minimum allocation. Funds are split 60/40 between state and local recipients within states.

The expansion of this capability will significantly enhance the City's detection capability.

(d). The Grant Program is named after Edward "Eddie" R. Byrne (February 21, 1966 – February 26, 1988) who was a police officer in the New York City Police Department. Around 3:30 a.m, on February 26, 1988 Byrne was sitting in his marked patrol car on 107th Avenue and Inwood Street in South Jamaica, Queens. He was assigned to keep an eye on the house of a local Guyanese immigrant named Arjune who had repeatedly called the police to report on illegal activities in the area. The house had been previously firebombed on two separate occasions and the owner repeatedly threatened. As Byrne sat in his car another car pulled up beside him. Two men exited and one of them knocked on the passenger side window of Byrne's cruiser while a second man crept up on the driver's side and shot Byrne in the head five times with a .38

caliber pistol. Two other men acted as lookouts. Byrne was pronounced dead at a hospital. He was 22 years old. It was later learned that the assailants canvassed the immigrant's house twice on preceding days before killing Officer Byrne, but decided not to kill the lone officer in the patrol car since the first officer they encountered was a young female, and the second was a black male. The murder prompted nationwide outrage. President Ronald Reagan personally called the Byrne family to offer condolences. Vice President George H.W. Bush carried Byrne's badge with him on his campaign for President in 1988.

Section 2. Approval Of Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program Application.

The City Commission of the City of Sanford hereby authorizes the submission of a grant application for the Byrne JAG Program.

Section 3. Implementing administrative actions.

The City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized and directed to implement the provisions of this Resolution by means of such administrative actions as may be deemed appropriate.

Section 4. Savings.

The prior actions of the City of Sanford relating to the Byrne JAG Program and related activities are hereby ratified and affirmed.

Section 5. Conflicts.

All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed.

Section 6. Severability.

If any section, sentence, phrase, word, or portion of this Resolution is determined to be invalid, unlawful or unconstitutional, said determination shall not be held to invalidate or impair the validity, force or effect of any other section, sentence, phrase, word, or portion of this Resolution not otherwise determined to be invalid, unlawful, or unconstitutional.


Section 7. Effective Date.


This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.




