Program Narrative – Attachment 1

The City of Clovis and Curry County, New Mexico have decided to collaborate and combine the total allocated amount of \$33,302.00. The funds will be used to purchase two license plate recognition systems. The City of Clovis Police Department will install one system in a patrol vehicle and the other system will be shared between the City of Clovis Police Department and the Curry County Sheriff's Office as needed. The license plate recognition system is an image processing technology used to identify vehicles by their license plates. Generally speaking the systems can record plates at about one per second at speeds of up to 100 MPH. The data collected can either be processed in real-time at the site or it can be transmitted to a remote center and processed at a later time. This is an important piece of equipment because it lets the officers know what they are dealing with. It can be used to help with many law enforcement activities such as AMBER alerts and missions related to missing and exploited children. Recovery of stolen vehicles and removing suspended drivers off the roads. Development and maintenance of sexual predators list and arrest of robbery suspects. This system will be able to catch data that the human eye could miss. This is another step in making our City and County a better and safer place to live. This program will last well beyond the four year grant period. The City of Clovis will be the fiscal agent and will be receiving the funds.

Review Narrative – Attachment 3

This Jag application was made available for review by the members of the Clovis City Commission and the Curry County Commission on May 18, 2010. The commissions approved the application and the activities and responsibilities set forth therein and signed the Interlocal Agreement on June 1, 2010.

The application was made public via the commission meetings. City and County Commission meetings are advertised on the local radio station and newspaper. Both meetings are televised live on the local cable network. Commission agendas are also available on line. City offices have been open to receive comments regarding this application from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. No public input or comment has been received as of this date.

The attached interlocal agreement was reviewed, approved and signed by both the City of Clovis and Curry County representatives.

**INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT
BETWEEN THE CITY OF CLOVIS, NEW MEXICO
AND THE COUNTY OF CURRY, NEW MEXICO**

2010 BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) PROGRAM AWARD

This agreement is made and entered into this 1st day of June, 2010 by and between THE COUNTY OF CURRY, acting through its governing body, the Board of County Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as COUNTY, and the CITY of CLOVIS, acting by and through its governing body, the City Commission, hereinafter referred to as CITY, both of Curry County, State of New Mexico, witnesseth:

WHEREAS, each governing body, in performing governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental functions hereunder, shall make that performance or those payments from current revenues legally available to that party; and

WHEREAS, each governing body finds that the performance of this Agreement is in the best interests of both parties, and that the undertaking will benefit the public; and

WHEREAS, the CITY agrees to be the fiscal agent and use the funds to purchase two license plate recognition systems; and

WHEREAS, the CITY and COUNTY believe it to be in their best interests to reallocate the JAG funds.

NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNTY AND CITY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.

COUNTY agrees to give the \$33,302.00 joint allocation to the CITY.

Section 2.

CITY agrees to use the entire \$33,302.00 in joint allocation funds to purchase two license plate recognition systems and make one available to the County on request.

Section 3.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against COUNTY other than claims for which liability may be imposed by the New Mexico Tort Claims Act.

Section 4.

Nothing in the performance of this Agreement shall impose any liability for claims against CITY other than claims for which liability may be imposed by the New Mexico Tort Claims Act.

Section 5.

Each party to this agreement will be responsible for its own actions in providing services under this agreement and shall not be liable for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services by the other party.

Section 6.

The parties to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this Agreement.

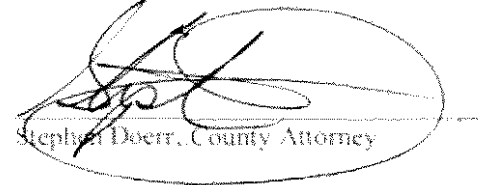
