STIPULATION REGARDING **FUNDING TO TRANSACTION** 17 RECORD ANALYSIS CENTER VS. 18 Western Union Financial Services, Inc. Assigned to the Hon. Warren 19 Defendant. Granville 20 The State of Arizona ex rel. Mark Brnovich, Attorney General ("State"), and 21 Western Union Financial Services, Inc. ("Western Union") respectfully move the 22 Court to enter an order in the form of the attached proposed order deleting and 23 removing paragraph 12.9 of the Settlement Agreement Amendment dated January 31, 24 2014, as amended. 25 The Settlement Agreement Amendment requires Western Union to fund the 26 Transaction Record Analysis Center ("TRAC") for five years with payments of 27 \$150,000.00 per month. Amendment ¶ 12.7. The Settlement Agreement Amendment 28

further provides that if the expenses of TRAC in any year except 2014 were below the amount paid by Western Union to fund TRAC, the difference would be credited to Western Union's obligation to fund TRAC the following year. Amendment ¶ 12.9, as amended by Order Granting Stipulation to Extend Time for Production of Data filed Oct. 17, 2014.

The State and Western Union have agreed to remove and delete paragraph 12.9 of the Settlement Agreement Amendment. In effect, the parties have agreed to remove the obligation for TRAC to credit or return excess funds to Western Union. All other obligations regarding TRAC funding, including Western Union's obligation to fund the Center (Amendment ¶ 12.7) and TRAC's obligation to provide quarterly financial reports detailing expenditures (Amendment ¶ 12.8) remain the same. As the Court retained jurisdiction over the matter for the limited purpose of remaining available to assist with the continuing obligations regarding funding and information provided to TRAC, the parties respectfully request that the Court approve of the modification. See Final Order Accepting Monitor's Final Report of the Secondary Recommendations Term and Concluding Matter, filed June 9, 2017. The modification to the Settlement Agreement Amendment is reflected in the attached proposed order.
