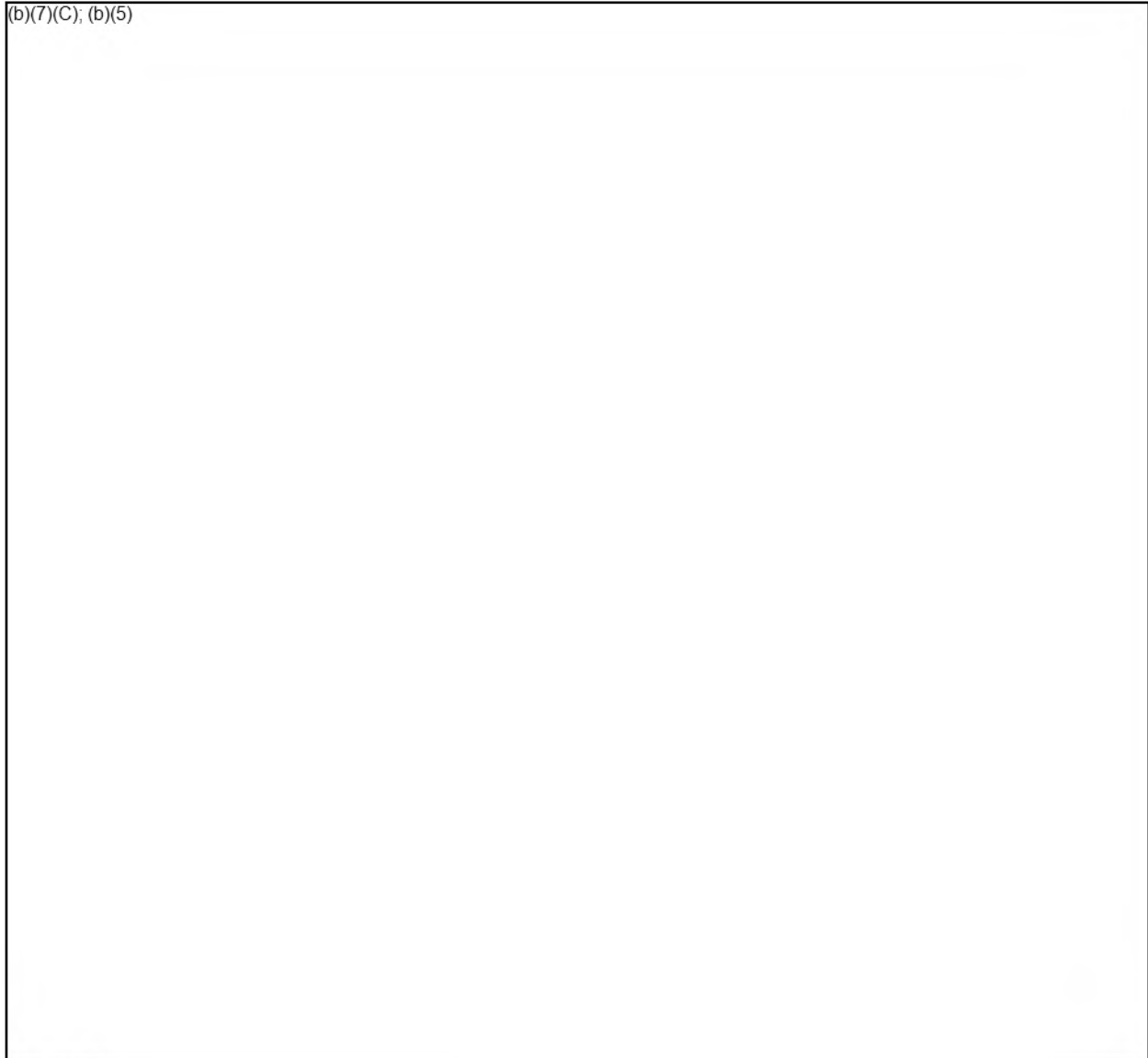

DECLARATION OF ASSISTANT FIELD OFFICE DIRECTOR

(b)(6); (b)(7)(C)

Pursuant to the authority of 28 U.S.C. § 1746, I, (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) an Assistant Field Office Director for U.S. Department of Homeland Security, United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement, Enforcement and Removal Operations, Burlington, Massachusetts, declare as follows:

1. I am an Assistant Field Office Director (“AFOD”) for U.S. Department of Homeland Security, United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (“ICE”), Enforcement and Removal Operations (“ERO”). I have held this position since August 2017.
2. In my official duties as an AFOD in Burlington, Massachusetts, I am responsible for managing the detention of individuals in order to initiate removal proceedings or to

effectuate removal orders and for scheduling and execution of removal orders for aliens in ICE custody. I am familiar with ICE policies and procedures for detaining individuals as well as releasing individuals from ICE custody.

3. I have experience utilizing ICE record systems to obtain information regarding specific aliens.¹ ICE maintains electronic and paper records on aliens in the course of its regularly conducted business activity. These records are made in the course of regularly conducted business activity at or near the time of relevant events by a person with knowledge of these events. In preparing this declaration, I have examined ICE official records, including the Enforce Alien Removal Module (“EARM”) and PLANet. EARM is the ICE electronic database utilized by ERO to maintain information regarding the custody and removal status of aliens. PLANet is the system used by ICE attorneys to track cases in removal proceedings. These databases are the electronic records ordinarily relied upon to ascertain an alien’s immigration and criminal history, current case status, and plans for removal, if any.
4. I provide this declaration based on my personal knowledge, belief, reasonable inquiry, and information obtained from various records, systems, databases, other ICE employees, employees of ICE contract facilities, and information portals maintained and relied upon by ICE in the regular course of business.
5. ICE has the statutory authority to “arrange for appropriate places of detention for aliens detained pending removal or a decision on removal.” See 8 U.S.C. § 1231(g)(1).

¹ Under the Immigration and Nationality Act, “alien” is defined as “any person not a citizen or national of the United States.” 8 U.S.C. § 1101. As a native of the Dominican Republic and conditional resident of the United States, the plaintiff, Anthony Jose Canela-Rodriguez, is an alien.

6. Under this authority, ICE ERO Boston is responsible for the placement of approximately 280 aliens detained in its custody as of October 23, 2020.
7. Within the Boston AOR, ICE ERO Boston utilizes five facilities to detain aliens in ICE custody for proceedings before the Boston and Hartford Immigration Courts. I am responsible for the placement of individuals at each of these facilities, or if necessary, at a facility outside of the Boston AOR.
8. ICE utilizes the Cumberland County Jail (CCJ), in South Portland, ME as a short-term holding facility, generally less than seven days and most often less than three days. CCJ houses no more than 10 ICE detainees on a space available basis. As such, the necessary technology necessary to conduct video teleconference removal hearings with the Boston and Hartford Immigration Courts is not available at Cumberland County Jail. Installation of the necessary technology would require a considerable amount of time and significant cost which would be unjustifiable given the very short length of stay for detainees at CCJ. Given acquisition regulations that apply to federal agencies such as ICE, even assuming CCJ would agree to the additional cost and resource requirements that installation of VTC equipment for immigration hearings would impose on CCJ, and even assuming the Immigration Court would agree to holding hearings from CCJ, it likely would take months to obtain the equipment needed to begin VTC immigration hearings from CCJ. Given that ICE uses CCJ as a short-term, overflow holding facility, it would be a highly inefficient use of the Government's resources to attempt to establish VTC hearing capabilities for ICE detainees.

16. Due to lack of available bed space ICE made arrangements for detention outside the Boston AOR and intended to transfer (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) on Tuesday October 27, 2020.
17. In accordance with ICE guidance, prior to departing a facility all detainees are symptom screened and to include having their temperature taken, and a COVID-19 Transfer, Removal, and Release Check sheet completed. Any detainee who presents with a temperature in excess of 99 degrees or does not clear the check sheet procedure will not be transferred until cleared by the facility medical provider.
18. During transport, ICE, to the greatest extent possible, encouraged social distancing by arranging seating so as to allow the greatest amount of space possible between detainees. In accordance with ICE ERO Boston procedures, all detainees are required to wear a facial mask covering at all times during transportation.
19. All detainees and staff conducting transport are required to wear facial masks. Staff applying restraints will also wear disposable gloves. To the extent possible, alcohol-based hand sanitizer is made available to detainees by staff; however, due to safety and security reasons, detainees cannot be provided individual bottles of hand sanitizer.
20. ICE has decided and I have directed that (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) be moved from CCJ on Tuesday October 27, 2020, and placed in a facility in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts (Franklin County Jail), where ICE has longer term detention facilities and where (b)(6); (b)(7)(C) can be housed during the pendency of his removal proceeding before the Hartford Immigration Court.

21. Franklin County Jail requires that all new intakes be tested for COVID 19 and are held in a quarantine unit for a period of 14 days. Franklin County Jail has no active COVID -19 cases.

22. (b)(6);
(b)(7)(C) will not be transferred from the Franklin County Jail unless required for health, safety, or disciplinary reasons. Should that transfer become necessary, (b)(6);
(b)(7)(C) will be transferred to another facility with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts unless the lack of available beds requires ICE to place him in New Hampshire.

23. If an executable final order of removal is in place ICE will take all necessary steps to effectuate the lawful removal including transfer to a staging facility once removal is scheduled.

As you know on Friday November 13, 2020, the Bristol County Sheriff's Office arrived at our facility at approximately 19:00 hours with three ICE inmates.

Our staff followed our long standing protocol of testing ALL inmates in the vehicle prior to entering the Cumberland County Jail. Consequently, one of the inmates tested positive for COVID-19. Given that some, if not all of the inmates had been transported from a holding facility and were in close contact with each other for 2 hours plus, it was safe to assume that given we had one positive COVID test and it is likely the two others who were exposed for a long period of time would have tested positive after a period of incubation. Their entrance was ultimately refused.

Our staff has been very aggressive in accommodating various law enforcement agencies, but the movement of inmates is extremely concerning and very risky to our staff and our inmate population

The short notice of transfers of any inmate, ICE inmates, Federal inmates or other County Jail inmates were pretty benign prior to COVID-19, but give the current circumstance and the increasing number of COVID cases popping up, we are forced to set a new process for accepting ICE inmates from an interfacility transfer.

Effective immediately, the process for inmate transfer will be enforced.

We have a total of 5 employees who have tested positive (that is up by one, but he was pending results and was symptomatic, so was expected). All employees are Transport Officers. The Agency conducted a review of the positive employees for "contact tracing", as a result 49 employees and 37 Inmates were tested, ALL tested negative, testing was done on Monday 12/14. (The review showed employees and Inmates were both wearing masks and using proper COVID guidelines so close contact definition was not met, we decided to do testing as a precaution.)

All areas used by the Officers were professionally cleaned on 12/14.

The Agency has worked with the Jail Medical Team and CDC Epidemiologist assigned to this case, throughout the outbreak.

ALL Inmates and Staff who were tested on 12/14 are being retested on Friday, 12/18, CDC requirement.

Inmates have been in a modified lock-down since Monday and will continue until retesting is completed. Inmates are still being allowed: showers, Medical Pass, Commissary, phone calls. Recreation, Programs and general free-time are currently suspended, meals are being taken in their rooms. Routine outside Medical appointments are suspended until Outbreak has cleared.

We are continuing Agency services, Intake was closed on Monday for cleaning but reopened to full operations that afternoon. Due to staffing and cleaning, we were not able to do court on Monday or Virtual Professional visits on Monday and Tuesday, but both have resumed.

We are NOT taking any new Boarders from other County Jails, nor are any CCJ Inmates currently being moved to other facilities, until Outbreak is cleared. Cumberland County Arrests (WOA's), made in other Counties who cannot make bail are being asked to handle the Virtual Court with the CC DA's/Clerk's Office.

Friday's retests will assist in next step decisions that will be decided by CDC, I will update you after Friday's retests.

The following will need to be done when attempting placement of CAP local/State jail arrests, at CCJ:

1. Notify CCJ with a 24-hour notification of the transfer request, which is required; **Handled by** (b)(6);
2. CCJ will need to acknowledge and accept the transfer but only by CCJ supervisor; **Handled by** (b)(6);
3. Before transferring the inmate, the inmate needs to be quarantined. The transferring facility needs to advise in writing how many days the inmate was quarantined; **Local office work with your local facility**
4. The transferring facility must test the inmate for COVID 72 hours prior to transfer with a negative result and/ or the inmate needs to be asymptomatic. **Local office work with your local facility**

Please review your detainers that you have placed with the possibility of detainees rolling to ICE custody in the next 30 days, or have knowledge of a detainee rolling to POM in the near future. Given the increasing surge of COVID-19 within the State of Maine and throughout the country, it is apparent that the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office will need to adjust its procedures for accepting inter-facility transfers of inmates. If there is a requirement for an inmate or inmates to be transferred from one facility to another, the following must occur prior to acceptance:

1. 24-hour notification of the transfer request is required.
2. The acknowledgment and acceptance of the inmate(s) transfer will be approved by a Cumberland County Sheriff's Office Corrections supervisor as soon as possible.
3. The inmate(s) must have been quarantined prior to transfer and the number of quarantine days must be declared upon making the request for the transfer.
4. The inmate(s) must be tested by the sending correctional facility and have tested negative prior to transfer.
5. MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS:
 - 72 hours prior to transfer, the inmate must meet the following criteria:
 - Negative COVID test
 - Be asymptomatic

ALL inmates coming into the Cumberland County Jail are and will continue to be tested prior to entering the jail. As we continue to operate in this high-risk environment, I hope that you will understand that we are doing everything we possibly can to provide correctional services, yet also keep our employees and those we are incarcerating from becoming seriously ill.

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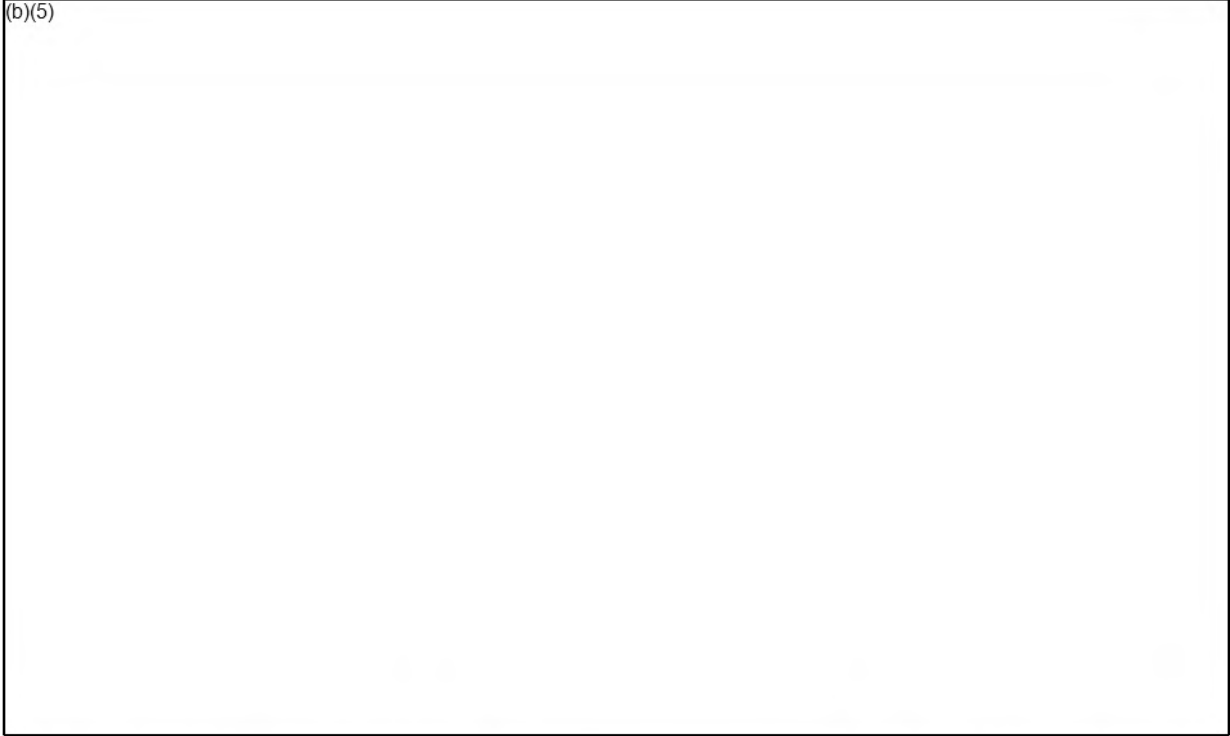

All of the inmate transfers in Maine are pre-planned before the transfer is done. Even before COVID inmate transfers were planned as a courtesy to the receiving agency. Earlier this year, due to COVID especially early on, we did not transfer inmates. In essence we don't transfer individuals unless absolutely necessary.

Currently any citizen who is coming into Maine from any state other than VT and NH must quarantine for 14 days or show a positive test to enter Maine. Why wouldn't this work for inmates? Additionally, we are not doing out of state extraditions unless absolutely necessary due to COVID. It is not worth the risk to our staff.

As of late we have been getting 3-4 hour notification of an ICE inmate transfer??? That might be acceptable under "normal" circumstances, but not now. There is no urgency on inmate transfers.

The bottom line is that in Maine, we have been conscientious in being extremely careful and aggressive in preventing virus transmission between facilities. I won't get into the state transfers as we are extremely limited and controlled by how and when we transfer inmates. I will not get as restrictive as the state, but I must protect my staff and facility. The continual movement of inmates into our facility from out of state is a HUGE risk for the jail. Unless we (collectively) do everything we can to prevent an outbreak, it will happen.

I don't believe inmate transfer unless ABSOLUTELY necessary is a wise decision for either of us.

As for arrests in the field, we will accept inmates just like I accept every other law enforcement arrest. Including inmates that test positive.
