
National Threat Evaluation and Reporting Threat Evaluation and Reporting Course





(U) The National Threat Evaluation and Reporting (NTER) Program's Threat Evaluation and Reporting Course (TERC) trains federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial (F/SLTT) homeland security partners on applying behavioral threat assessment approaches, as it relates to tips and leads, to prevent targeted violence in their areas of responsibility. The TERC teaches students to utilize a four-step threat assessment model to identify, investigate, assess, and manage an individual who presents behaviors of concern.

The TERC ensures all participants are equipped with the necessary tools to empower others in their communities to identify and report potential threats. In addition, the TERC prepares threat assessment teams to minimize potential threats of targeted violence and to move concerning individuals off the pathway to violence and away from an attack.



The TERC is interactive and challenges participants to apply threats sessment methodology to real-world scenarios. The target audience for TERC is F/SLTT public safety partners involve the reviewing, assessing, and investigating potential threats of target edviolence.
