This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) appeal dated November 17, 2012. Your original request was assigned FOIA Case Number TSA12-0730 in which you requested documents pertaining to TSA's "use and/or funding of automatic license plate readers ('ALPRs')".

Your request was processed under the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552. TSA responded on September 19, 2012, and informed you that a reasonable search was conducted and no responsive records were located. You filed an administrative appeal challenging the adequacy of the search conducted by TSA.

TSA conducted a second search for records and located documents responsive to your FOIA request. Accordingly, I have determined to grant your appeal and have remanded your request back to the FOIA Office for the processing of these records. Once the processing is complete, the FOIA Office will respond to you directly using FOIA case number TSA12-0730.

Fees
