On June 4, 2013 the Deputy Attorney General (DAG), hosted the Countering Violent Extremism (CVE) Quarterly Deputies Breakfast. All Deputies from the "Group of 4" (DHS, DOJ, FBI, and NCTC) were in attendance.

Summary of Discussion

The Deputies discussed the following:

- The notable increase in interest on issues related to CVE among communities, state and local law enforcement, and the White House following the attack in Boston.
- The need to (a) collectively share more information with the WH on CVE; (b) prioritize possible solutions for online radicalization and to coordinate these efforts with the NSS; (c) develop a common set of talking points to discuss CVE with community groups and empower them to take action; and (d) provide federal, state, and local government officials access to the NCTC Community Awareness Briefing (CAB), which they can then provide – as appropriately modified and tailored – to a wide range of stakeholders.

Staff from the four agencies provided updates on the following lines of effort:

- Engagement (DOJ): US Attorneys are beginning to contemplate direct CVE conversations, but these are sometimes challenging and often best done in small groups.
- Research & Analysis (DOJ): We need a platform to share the findings of the substantial CVE research that is occurring.
- Training (DHS):
 - HSN has 900 users, but DHS wants to learn more about how these users are using the training products placed on that portal.
 - DHS research has surfaced common indicators applicable to a range of violent extremists.

- Common Online Portals (NCTC): Approval for a .gov site has still not been granted. NCTC needs the help of the other agencies in increasing active users.
- Strategic Focus - domestic and overseas - (DHS): The goal of these visits is to learn from the respective cities, highlight best practices, and potentially identify and share resources. Deputies asked for two city visits to be completed by the next meeting.

Summary of Agreements

- Deputies approved the existing 2013 goals, but asked for additional bullets on community engagement and online radicalization, which NCTC will provide and disseminate to the Group of Four for consideration.
- On behalf of the Deputies, DAG Cole will (a) ask for a meeting to discuss CVE and the 2013 goals; and (b) call GSA about the denial of a .gov platform. Regarding the latter, NCTC will prepare the necessary background materials and provide a POC.
- NCTC will draft a summary of current work to address online radicalization and possible future options and disseminate this to the Group of Four for comment. NCTC will reach out to the NSS to connect this work with its Online Radicalization Working Group.
- Deputies agreed on the (a) need to engage community leaders on the threat of violent extremism; and (b) value of a CVE Leadership Forum to bring U.S. Government and national-level community leaders together quarterly to discuss how to collaborate on CVE. In support, NCTC will:
 - Disseminate a proposal to the Group of Four outlining the CVE Leadership Forum, the first iteration of which NCTC plans to host later this summer;
 - Provide a draft set of community engagement talking points on CVE for consideration; and
 - Finalize the CAB and make it available as soon as possible.
- DHS will select two cities and work with the Group of Four to complete visits before the next Deputies Breakfast.
- The Group of Four will search for existing research or products on common indicators of violence before the next Deputies Breakfast. DHS will present its findings at the next Deputies Breakfast.
- DOJ will work with NCTC to place its CVE research on the Online Resource Center.
- The Deputies will discuss disengagement at the next breakfast.

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
