Lastly, the Deputies agreed to send a joint memo about the CVE efforts to John Brennan, Assistant to the President for Homeland Security and Counterterrorism.

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

Summary of Discussion

- FBI has reorganized and the CVE Office is now under the National Joint Terrorism Task Force. The new leadership was introduced to the group.
- NCTC updated the Deputies on new developments regarding crisis communications since the last meeting.
- Deputies shared their perspectives on collective accomplishments as well as individual department/agency progress since these breakfast meetings first began in late 2009.
- Deputies discussed the need to plan domestic CVE efforts and activities in 2013. They
 also discussed including all forms of violent extremism, not just those related to al
 Qa'ida.
- Deputies revisited their discussion from the 25 October 2012 breakfast regarding the
 possibility of providing information to American citizens to help counter the terrorist
 narrative.
 - DOJ provided an update on the legal issues regarding such an idea. Deputy
 Attorney General Cole advised the group that a specific proposal would be easier
 to evaluate than a theoretical campaign.

Summary of Agreements

• Deputies agreed to send a joint memo to Assistant to the President for Homeland Security and Counterterrorism John Brennan highlighting their work as a group. This would include a cover memo as an executive summary as well as an appendix that

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includes each memo already submitted to the NSS by each agency. NSS Senior Director Quintan Wiktorowicz agreed to provide what he has already prepared for the Deputies' consideration. NCTC agreed to take the lead in consolidating the input and circulating the memo for Deputies' as soon as possible.

- Deputies agreed to develop a plan to guide domestic CVE efforts and activities in 2013. The plan should:
 - build on what has already been accomplished in 2012;
 - set priorities for what the group will accomplish in 2013;
 - o expand the focus to include other forms of violent extremism;
 - o be based in part on input gathered from the field;
 - o include a concentrated effort in a certain number of cities/regions;
 - o include at least two strategic exchanges with foreign governments; and,
 - o emphasize the whole-of-government approach.
- Deputies agreed to accelerate their meeting schedule in order to review and approve the plan for 2013. NCTC will host the next breakfast with a target date of late February.
