Pursuant to the above-captioned civil action, the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), conducted a litigation review of potentially responsive records in compliance with the Joint Status Report dated April 23, 2013. As a result of that review, enclosed please find twenty-one pages.

Portions not released are being withheld pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, and/or the Privacy Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552a. Please refer to the list enclosed with this letter that identifies the authority for withholding the deleted material, which is indicated by a mark appearing in the block next to the exemption. An additional enclosure with this letter explains these exemptions in more detail. The documents are being forwarded to you with this letter.

### The EPIC LPR Watch

The LPR Watch at the El Paso Intelligence Center (EPIC) is a 24/7 operation with real time response to queries, alerts, and tactical queuing. Once the Watch receives an alert message on a subject vehicle, the Watch Officer will view the license plate image and confirm the number and state. Upon confirmation, the law enforcement officer who placed the alert will immediately be contacted and provided with the location, direction of travel, and corresponding LEA point of contact information. Subsequently, the Case Agent/Requesting Officer can coordinate enforcement activities.



## **NS NEDRS Fiscal Year 2010 Summary Report**

 NS drove the DEA National License Plate Recognition (LPR) Program to exceed original deployment goals by incorporating 31 LPR device systems that are owned by other Law Enforcement Agencies into the DEA National LPR Program.



During FY 2010, LPR achieved the following milestones:

  - 8336 KG Marijuana
  - 17 Pills Misc. Pharmaceuticals
  - \$866,380 US Dollars
  - 0.23 KG Valium/Diazepam
- o Identified vehicle used to assault offices at a Marfa CBP checkpoint using partial plate information.
- Thru partnership with Florida Agricultural Law Enforcement, NS added the ability to track containerized cargo in LPR.

- NS added the DOJ Amber Alert email feed as a source for LPR to provide for automated creation, modification, and deletion of Amber Alerts in the LPR system providing a mechanism for Law Enforcement to be notified within 15 seconds of the detection of the suspect vehicle at any DEA or partner LPR device.
- NS coupled DARTS Deconfliction functionality with LPR to provide DARTS users with LPR system plate intersection information.
