**Title of Project:** Scan the city

**Goals of the Project:**

- 1- Identify stolen vehicles and reduce the number.
- 2- Identify person with no drivers license, insurance, or wanted.
- 3- Provide tracking on the back end of persons committing crimes by creating custom lists such as as "meth area" frequenters, etc.
- 4- Identify vehicles and suspects in BOLOs, Amber Alerts,
- 5- Virtually any process where an officer was previously required to "read a plate" or a system was required to compare that plate to a database, read it to locate a specific vehicle or "question" suspect behavior, can now be automatically processed.

**Strategies:**

The system will be placed into two marked patrol units, one on the day shift and one on the night shift. The officer utilizing the equipment will be viewing the environment within view of one or more cameras mounted inside and / or outside a vehicle, finding license plates, repeatedly analyzing successive images of all of the plates it finds, and then compares the license number reads to an on-board hotlist (database) with the goal of finding a match.

The user has a number of important functions that are available in the interface, including:

- The ability to see the historical listing of plate captures, with a color thumbnail image of each vehicle.
- A manual hotlist page where plates may be manually added to the scanning system.
- A hotlist maintenance page for maintaining and monitoring hotlists.
- An alarm page where hotlist hits are managed (display of hit information, etc).
- Camera selection page where the operator can enable and disable individual cameras, the proposed system consists of:
  - A Forward facing Color camera
  - Dual Side facing Cameras (Optimized for Parking Lot Patrolling)
- An IR Camera (Optimized for Nighttime Operation)
- TheBack Office Software (allowing you to analyze historical trends in the office)



##### Program Narrative

Applicants Name: City of Winter Haven Police department

Project Title: Scan the City

The Winter Haven Police department is proposing a License plate reader project. Funds provided to the Winter Haven Police Department through the FY2011 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) local solicitation programs would be utilized to purchase a 2 new NDIRS License Plate Readers for our sworn personnel.

Once funds are made available, a purchase order will be issued to the chosen vendor and the equipment ordered. Once equipment is received, it will be installed in officer's vehicles. The new equipment will benefit our officers by saving time from manual data entry and eliminate errors. With the License Plate Readers officers in the field would be able to access various databases. Users on the back end would also be able to utilize data collected by field officers for investigations. This saves time for the officers and in investigations. It also promotes officer safety: the officer will be able to know almost instantly if the vehicle they are with is wanted.

We will be purchasing the equipment from NDI Recognition Systems. The awarded grant money of \$21,230 will be used to purchase the Veriplate In-Car Rapid Deployment License Plate Reader, to include the software, predator upgrade package, and training and maintenance agreements.

##### Budget Narrative

Once the funds are made available, a purchase order will be issued to the chosen vendor and equipment ordered, once the equipment is received, it will be installed into the marked vehicles and issued to sown personnel.

The grant money of \$21,230 will be used to purchase 2 Veriplate in-Car rapid Deployment License Plate Readers from the most competitive vendor, also to include the software, predator upgrade package, and training and maintenance agreements.

The additional monies not covered by the grant will be drawn from a combination of funds that includes the police department budget, forfeiture funds and capital depletion funds.
