Dear Ms. Choudhury:

While responding to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated March 1, 2010, and received in this Office on February 8, 2012, for records pertaining to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's eGuardian Threat Tracking System, by letter dated February 11, 2013, we advised you that we would be providing you with 648 pages of material that was forwarded to this Office by the Office of Justice Programs (OJP) under separate cover. Upon further review of this material, we have determined that twelve pages are not responsive to your request. As such, please find enclosed 636 pages of material.

As indicated previously, the documents forwarded to this Office by OJP are being provided to you with excisions made pursuant to Exemptions 3, 5, 6, 7(C), and 7(E) of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(3), (5), (6), (7)(C), (7)(E). Exemption 3 pertains to information exempted from release by statute, in this instance 50 U.S.C. § 403g. Exemption 5 pertains to certain inter- and intra-agency communications protected by the deliberative process privilege. Exemption 6 pertains to information the release of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties. Exemption 7(C) pertains to records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, the release of which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of third parties. Exemption 7(E) pertains to records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, the release of which would disclose certain techniques or procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions.

Although I am aware that your request is the subject of ongoing litigation and that appeals are not ordinarily acted on in such situations, I am required by statute and regulation to inform you of your right to file an administrative appeal.
