
Arabic Names


Names/Titles

- Hajji - a person who has completed the pilgrimage

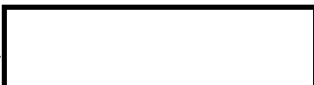


Date of Birth

- Most of the world writes DD/MM/YY






- Masjid/mosque

- No tight clothing (modest)
- No shorts
- Shoes off
- No tight clothing (modest)
- Most skin must be covered
 - No shorts or short skirts
 - No short sleeve tops
- Cover hair







European Influence

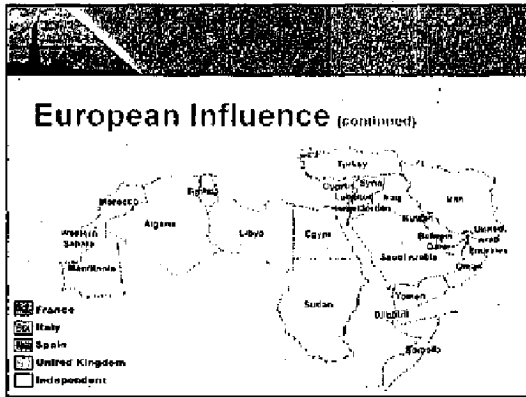

Interaction/Investigations


- Small talk is essential—family/culture

- White lies to protect honor and image

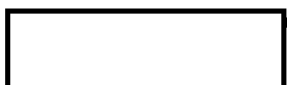

- Handshake


