(CWSI) During this quarter, the Office of Inspector General (OIG) reviewed various intelligence activities of the National Security Agency/Central Security Service (NSA/CSS) to determine whether they were conducted in accordance with applicable statutes, Executive Orders (E.O.s), Attorney General (AG) procedures, and Department of Defense (DoD) and internal directives. With few exceptions, the issues presented were routine and indicated that the operating elements understand the restrictions on NSA/CSS activities. b. (TS//SI//NF) In the first quarter fiscal year 2006 (report dated 28 February 2006) we reported misuse of the U.S. SIGINT System. An investigation substantiated the allegation that an NSA employee used the SIGINT System to target his foreign (b)(3)-P.L. 86-36 girlfriend in The matter has been referred to the NSA Office of Security, Office of Employee Relations and the Office of General Counsel (OGC) for appropriate action. 2. (U) GENERAL COUNSEL ACTIVITIES -(C//SI) The NSA/CSS OGC reviewed various intelligence activities of the NSA/CSS to determine whether they were conducted in accordance with applicable statutes.
