Summary of Conclusions

Observations:

- Ambassador Wells has green-lighted the USG study moving forward.
- DCM offered to contact the RHC to request the data from their study, knowing that there are questions about the quality of the research conducted by RHC and CSS (contracted by RHC), both within the Mission and from outside contacts.
- The Scope of Work for the USG-funded study is being re-worked, and will ask for budget proposal that includes a supplemental module targeting secondary school teachers, that could be pulled out if the budget comes out higher than funds available. RHC could approach other donors with a discrete, already-designed concept if we decide not to fund it.
- Post will raise the possible take-aways from 15 STATE 21636 in meetings with GOJ interlocutors, and we believe they will have something announcement-worthy by September in areas such as: Supporting Youth, Women, and Religious Leaders as CVE Actors, Support Prison and other Rehabilitation and Reintegration Programs, and Identifying Political and Economic Opportunities for Communities Potentially Vulnerable to Radicalization.\
- WEF CVE Special Program was viewed as a generally positive step, with few tangible take-aways. Feedback from Al-Momani's office focused on the absence of Jordanian panelists. More feedback to be gathered this week from other participants.
- SCP is going well, with visits to WORDE being a highlight. Still trying to overcome the idea that there is one single profile of youth vulnerable to extremist recruiting, and that Facebook, Twitter, and other platforms can simply push a button and turn off Da'esh-related accounts/content.
- Two PAS proposals to CT were approved for funding – the imam training and young social media expert pairing program, and the PSAs (to be developed in coordination with the participants in the imam training program). We can circulate the proposals again for reference if requested.
- OCP youth event will not be USG-branded at all, perhaps supported. UN is discussing with Andy Rabens at State.

Action Items:

- Ragini will draft an email for DCM with input from POL, USAID, CMSE
- For 15 State 53608 post will recommend Musa Shtieweh, Ayman Khalil, and Oreib Rintawi
- Will request a visit to the MRU once Naimat returns from the SCP, as well as a DCM-hosted debrief with the whole group
