Abstract

The Waukegan Police Department and the Lake County State's Attorney's Office have teamed up to enhance crime prevention efforts to benefit the citizens of Lake County and the City of Waukegan, the County Seat.

The Lake County State's Attorney's Office (LCSAO) proposes to use JAG funding in the amount of \$18,603 to enhance their Sexual Assault and Domestic Violence Victim's Unit. Funding will allow the LCSAO to produce informational materials for victims and law enforcement officers. Funding will also permit the Victim's Unit to transmit documents and photographs securely to prosecutorial divisions. The program, titled Sexual Assault and Domestic Violence Unit Enhancement, will be implemented through equipment purchases as listed in attached budget documents. Our goals are to make the public, and especially the victims of these types of crimes, aware of the services offered by the LCSAO and to make these victims as comfortable and safe as possible while their case is being adjudicated.

The Waukegan Police Department intends to use funding of \$49,045 to purchase equipment that will allow the deployment of squad cars outfitted with license plate recognition technology, to purchase two overt, pole-mounted camera systems to be placed in high-crime areas, and to purchase and train a canine for drug, person, and item searches. The programs entitled, ALPR Patrol Project, Operation Welcome Home Expansion, and Police K-9 Unit, respectively, will be implemented through the purchase and deployment of specialized equipment. The goal of the ALPR Patrol Project is to use license plate recognition technology to scan vehicle plates in volume to identify suspected criminals and stolen vehicles. The goal of the Operation Welcome Home Expansion is to purchase and deploy two new overt surveillance cameras in high-crime neighborhoods to deter criminal activity. The Department has already deployed three of these cameras with great success. The Police K9 Unit program is meant to equip a third patrol shift with a police canine to be utilized for drug detection, item recovery and person searches. The goal is to expand the Department's canine availability to avoid draining this resource from other area departments.

Program Narrative

Within the scope of the JAG Grant program, these funds will help the Waukegan Police Department, a municipal law enforcement agency, to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime.

All of the funds allocated to the Waukegan Police Department will be used to enhance law enforcement activities. Two projects are already in place and need further funding to expand. A third project is new and will greatly enhance the capabilities of the Department.

The Waukegan Police Department recently retired one of our three patrol division K-9 animals. We are seeking to spend a portion of the funding on the purchase and training of a new dog to bring our Department back up to three K-9 units. Our K-9 units are all assigned to the Patrol Division and are trained to detect drugs and to locate persons and evidentiary objects. Without grant funding this purchase would be unfunded and therefore not achieved.

As part of our 2007 JAG award we purchased 3 overt, pole-mounted, surveillance cameras. These cameras have been a strong deterrent to crime in the neighborhoods where they are deployed. We are seeking funding to purchase a 4th camera and to have a 5th camera refurbished and placed into service. All of the cameras are easily moved from one neighborhood to another and can be monitored in real-time from the Waukegan Police Department dispatch center.

Finally, our new project is to outfit one of our Patrol Division squad cars with Advanced License Plate Recognition (ALPR) cameras and equipment. Grant funds would be used to install a fully operational system in one of our Patrol Division squad cars. The outfitted squad car will be equipped with several databases or "hot lists" and will have the ability to scan upwards of 1,500 license plates in a single 12-hour shift. The plates are scanned and then matched to the databases in an attempt to locate vehicles that may be listed as stolen, used in the commission of a crime, associated with a wanted or missing subject, and parking scofflaws.

Funds awarded to the Waukegan Police Department will be used to enhance the Patrol Division K-9 program and to expand Operation Welcome Home, an overt, pole-mounted surveillance camera program used in high-crime neighborhoods as a deterrent to criminal activity. A newly created program based on Advanced License Plate Recognition technology will be funded from these funds as well.

Program Narrative

Within the scope of the JAG Grant program, these funds will help Lake County State's Attorney's Office, a county governmental law enforcement and prosecution entity, to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime.

All of the funds allocated to the lake County State's Attorney's Office will be used to enhance the newly created Sexual Assault Unit and the Domestic Violence Unit. The funds will also allow us to enhance our victim waiting areas and work towards educating the public on the services our office provides.

The Lake County Sexual Assault Coordinating Council has been created to develop a comprehensive county-wide program to work effectively with the widespread issue of sexual assault and abuse. The funds will allow us to create a brochure that will be distributed county wide which will educate victims and the public on the steps taken by the justice system in a sexual assault case. It will have the process outlined along with terms and definitions that are often associated with these types of cases. Currently our office has no material to provide to victims of sexual assault or abuse that is exclusive to our office. Often times there is a significant amount of confusion victims feel when working with the criminal court system and it is our hopes that providing the information at the onset of the case will help to alleviate some of that anxiety.

The State's Attorney's Office feels very strongly that education is essential in working toward effective prosecution. Some of the funds have been allocated to create a Law


Enforcement Sexual Assault Response card that will be distributed to all law enforcement departments in the County. This card will outline what evidence needs to be collected and who need to be notified in the event of a sexual abuse case. Promoting proper law enforcement response when confronted with a sexual assault crime makes a significant difference when prosecuting the case.

The Lake County State's Attorney's Office takes strides to make victims comfortable and heard within the court system. Over the course of the next few years the Office will be relocating to accommodate the growing needs of the Office. The change will provide secure areas for victims to wait while their case is being heard and to spend time with the attorneys and counselors while preparing their case. These JAG funds will allow us to appropriately display all the educational materials we have in those areas and allow victims to reach out to the resources that are available to them.

Currently our domestic violence response protocols require a complete risk assessment on every domestic violence case, which includes capturing color photos of any visible wounds on the victim. Color-capacity digital scanners/senders will assist our Felony Review Division and our Misdemeanor Division in forwarding this evidence along with color photos of the scene to the parties involved in the cases. A procedure is being put in place to make sure the assessments are forwarded to the various divisions of our office, along with the probation department, who will receive these essential tools in a timely fashion and assist in determining a defendant accurate bond.

Similar to the digital senders, the color copier will provide the Misdemeanor Division with more effective means to produce documents or photos that will be used in domestic violence or sexual assault criminal cases. Best-evidence rules recommend color photos to be printed and presented in color to the Court. Currently the Misdemeanor Division has no color copier. The copier will assist them in working in a timely fashion to forward pertinent materials to the people that are assisting the victim. This equipment will enhance a vital part of successful prosecution.

Training the public has become a part of our everyday existence, given the importance of public education and awareness to successful prosecution. Many professionals, among which are community groups, churches and law enforcement, have reached out to us requesting assistance with training. Some of the JAG funds have been designated to create a brochure that will explain and outline the topics that we offer as no-charge public presentations. This will encourage awareness of crime prevention and awareness trainings including but not limited to Safe Kids Online, Identity Theft Prevention, Teen Dating Violence Awareness.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CITY OF WAUKEGAN AND COUNTY OF LAKE 2010 BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) PROGRAM AWARD

State of Illinois, witnesseth:		

WHEREAS, this agreement is made under the authority of the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 *et seq.*: and

WHEREAS, the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistant Grant Program (the "Program") is a United States Department of Justice program that provides grant monies to local governments to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime and to improve the criminal justice system: and

WHEREAS, the CITY and the COUNTY are eligible for a joint award of \$67,648 in FY2010 grant monies under the Program: and

WHEREAS, the potential allocation of the eligible funds under the funding disparity provisions of the Program is \$18,603 to the COUNTY and \$49,045 to the CITY and the CITY and COUNTY agree that is in their best interests to allocate the Program fund in this manner: and

WHEREAS, each governing body finds that a joint application for the Program funds and the performance of this Agreement is in the best interests of both the CITY and the COUNTY, that the allocation and undertaking will benefit the public, and that the allocation of grant monies as provided for herein is fair and appropriate: and

WHEREAS, in order to receive any Program funds, the CITY and COUNTY must submit an executed memorandum of understanding in connection with the joint application for Program funds, indicating which party will serve as the Fiscal Agent for all Program funds received and agreeing to an appropriate allocation of Program funds.

NOW THEREFORE, the COUNTY and CITY agree as follows:

Section 1.

CITY agrees to serve as the Fiscal Agent with respect to the Program, to submit a joint application on behalf of the CITY and the COUNTY for the Program funds, and to administer all funds received through the Program in accordance with all applicable Program rules and requirements.

Section 2.

The CITY agrees to pay the COUNTY \$ 18,603 of the Program funds within thirty (30) days of the CITY's receipt of the Program funds. In the event the CITY receives less than the full \$67,648 in eligible Program funds, the COUNTY shall be entitled to receive its proportionate twenty-six percent (26%) share of the Program funds actually received by the CITY.

Section 3.

The CITY and the COUNTY agree to use the Program funds received only for proper Program purposes.

Section 4.

Each party to this Agreement will be responsible for its own decisions and actions with respect to its share of the Program funds and neither party receiving Program funds under this Agreement shall be liable for any civil liability or penalty that may arise from the use of such funds or the furnishing of services by the other party.

Section 5.

The parties to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this Agreement.

Section 6.

By entering into this Agreement, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those set out herein; further, this Agreement shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CITY OF WAUKEGAN AND COUNTY OF LAKE 2010 BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG) PROGRAM AWARD

This agreement is made and entered into this 2¹⁰ day of 100, 2010 by and between The COUNTY of Lake, acting and through its governing body, the County Board hereinafter referred to as COUNTY, and the City of Waukegan, acting through its governing body, the City Council, hereinafter referred to as CITY, both of Lake County, State of Illinois, witnesseth:

WHEREAS, this agreement is made under the authority of the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq.: and

WHEREAS, the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistant Grant Program (the "Program") is a United States Department of Justice program that provides grant monies to local governments to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime and to improve the criminal justice system: and

WHEREAS, the CITY and the COUNTY are eligible for a joint award of \$67,648 in FY2010 grant monies under the Program: and

WHEREAS, the potential allocation of the eligible funds under the funding disparity provisions of the Program is \$18,603 to the COUNTY and \$49,045 to the CITY and the CITY and COUNTY agree that is in their best interests to allocate the Program fund in this manner; and

WHEREAS, each governing body finds that a joint application for the Program funds and the performance of this Agreement is in the best interests of both the CITY and the COUNTY, that the allocation and undertaking will benefit the public, and that the allocation of grant monies as provided for herein is fair and appropriate: and

WHEREAS, in order to receive any Program funds, the CITY and COUNTY must submit an executed memorandum of understanding in connection with the joint application for Program funds, indicating which party will serve as the Fiscal Agent for all Program funds received and agreeing to an appropriate allocation of Program funds.

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Section 5.

The parties to this Agreement do not intend for any third party to obtain a right by virtue of this Agreement.

Section 6.

By entering into this Agreement, the parties do not intend to create any obligations express or implied other than those set out herein; further, this Agreement shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.
