

Below are answers to frequently asked technical questions on the website. If you do not see the answer to your question here, please contact the <u>community outreach specialist in your local field office</u>.

Why is the website not loading on our school computers?

The most likely reasons are:

- 1) Your school's web browser (Internet Explorer, Chrome, Firefox, Safari, etc.) is out of date. The Don't Be a Puppet website works best in the more current versions of web browsers. Contact your school's IT administrator and ask that the browser be updated in your classroom or school.
- 2) Your school computers' firewall or security features may be blocking access to the site. You can check this by going to the settings page or tab in your web browser and clicking the "security" link. Find the section where your browser blocks websites and click "Let the FBI see my computer."

Why won't the YouTube videos play on our school computers?

Many schools block the YouTube website on their computers. Contact your school's IT administrator and request that the FBI's YouTube channel be unblocked.

Why is the site stalled or stuck?

You may need to refresh the web browser's cache. To do this, go to the URL in your web browser (Internet Explorer, Chrome, Firefox, Safari, etc.) and type in any characters or symbols at the end of the web address—for example, https://cve.fbi.gov?888. Then, hit enter on your keyboard. This will refresh the cache.

Why isn't the site displaying correctly on my mobile device?

The site was built for a desktop computer experience. Some devices may not display certain sections of the site properly.
