Component 1 (\$16,287) Johnson County Sheriff's Office IPVision Covert Pole Camera and Internet Based GPS Remote Tracking System

The objective for the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant was presented to the Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) June 18, 2009 and approved on June 25, 2009. The activity allowed for citizen comment and to obtain the BOCC's approval with the BOCC's chairwoman's signature on the MOU.

<u>Component 2 (\$71,833) Olathe Police Department AR15 Rifles and License Plate Reader</u> Software

The Edward Byrne Memorial Grant was presented to Olathe City Council, June 16, 2009. The activity allowed for citizen comment and to obtain the Council approval with the Olathe City Mayor's signature on the MOU.

Component 3 (\$14,044.85) Lenexa Police Department Training Software and Digital Evidence Equipment

The (JAG) application grant was made available for review to the Lenexa Governing Body on June 8, 2009. This was placed on the agenda for the regular City Council Meeting on June 16, 2009. On June 16, 2009, the Governing Body authorized the Mayor to sign the memorandum of understanding with the Johnson County Sheriff's Office and participating cities.

The application was made public on the City website (http://www.ci.lenexa.ks.us) on June 9, 2009 with a notice for the opportunity for public comment on the application to be held at the Lenexa City Council meeting on June 16, 2009.

Component 4 (\$64,976) Overland Park Police Department Hybrid Vehicles

The Edward Byrne Memorial Grant was presented to the Overland Park City Council on June 15, 2009. This activity allowed for citizen comment and to obtain the Council approval with the Overland Park Mayor's signature on the MOU.

Component 5 (\$18,230) Shawnee Police Department Technology Based Programs

The Edward Byrne Memorial Grant was presented to the Shawnee City Council on June 22, 2009. This activity allowed for citizen comment and to obtain the Council approval with the Shawnee Mayor's signature on the MOU.

EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JAG GRANT 2009 LOCAL SOLICITATION ABSTRACT

The Johnson County Sheriff's Office will be the administrative and fiscal reporting agency for the disparity funding grant on behalf of the cities of Olathe, Lenexa, Shawnee and Overland Park for the Edward Byrne Memorial Grant. The projects funded through this program include replacing AR15 weapons, purchasing and upgrading software programs and replacing outdated vehicles with new "green" hybrid vehicles, as well as a covert pole camera and GPS tracking equipment.

The Johnson County Sheriff's Office acknowledges that a disparity exists between the cities of Olathe, Lenexa, Shawnee and Overland Park and Johnson County in Kansas.

Programs funded through this grant are faceted for law enforcement and will cover a range of areas. Johnson County activities include purchasing a covert surveillance pole camera and GPS tracking system to aid the Investigations Unit and reduce overtime. Olathe's program includes License Plate Reader software and replacement AR15 weapons. Lenexa's program includes Department Training software and in-care video equipment to upgrade their systems. The Overland Park Police's program will purchase hybrid vehicles to cut fuel costs and lower ozone emissions. Shawnee's program includes the purchase of several GPS tracking devices and navigation systems to help utilize technology to investigate criminal activity.

The timeline for grant programs has been established with programs commencing thirty to sixty days after grant awards. Most programs have target dates for final equipment purchases no later than December 2010. Funds provided for the programs will improve the quality of service each agency provides to its community through their activities, upgrades and equipment purchases.

The funding provided from the Edward Byrne Memorial Grant will support United States manufacturers whenever possible and increase economic capacity by using local service companies. The Johnson County Sheriff's Office and the cities of Olathe, Lenexa, Shawnee and Overland Park recognize the importance of supporting and encouraging local economies whenever possible.

Component 1 (\$16,287) Johnson County Sheriff's Office IPVision Covert Pole Camera and Internet Based GPS Remote Tracking System

The covert pole camera and internet based GPS remote tracking system will allow the Investigations Division to accurately record and monitor criminal activity. Acquiring the equipment will increase our ability to produce video recordings of crimes and assist in the prosecution of criminals. This will help recover stolen property via the internet based GPS remote tracking system and the covert pole camera.

Integrating this equipment into the Investigations Division will allow for remote video surveillance, as well as internet GPS tracking, which will allow for a higher case clearance and thereby freeing up detectives for additional cases. This in turn helps maintain public safety at the high standards already existing in Johnson County.

Additionally, by integrating a new covert pole camera surveillance system and the internet based GPS remote tracking system, this provides better utilization of the Investigations Unit as well.
