Pursuant to Rule 13(b) of the Rules of Procedure for the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Court, effective November 1, 2010, this letter provides preliminary notice of two compliance incidents. Specifically, on April 11, 2011, the National Security Agency (NSA) initially reported to the National Security Division (NSD) and the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) two incidents involving communications that were overcollected as a result of NSA's upstream collection pursuant to Section 702.
