Objective: Deputy Assistant Secretary Flynn has been invited to provide brief comments regarding an updates on Department of Homeland Security (DHS) efforts related to gun safety.

Background: The CVE/Gun Safety Working Group is a local, shared effort by the City of Dearborn Mayor and Chief of Police to address gun safety issues and initiatives. The Working Group meets twice a quarter; membership consists of mayoral office staff, local universities, DHS, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), the Secure Community Network, local law enforcement, local Congressional staff, and private sector stakeholders.

Introduction

Good afternoon, my name is Bill Flynn, the Assistant Secretary for the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Office of Infrastructure Protection (IP). I would like to discuss DHS efforts to reduce gun violence including our recent outreaches, completed activities, and planned activities for 2014.

- IP also developed and featured a new Active Shooter Preparedness Webpage consolidating DHS programs and activities into a single, centralized location. Since its release on January 16, 2013, the site has been accessed more than 319,000 times and has helped facilitate the following:
 - More than 9,700 individuals have viewed the Active Shooter Webinar.
 - More than 9,000 attendees have participated in 104 Active Shooter Workshops nationwide.
 - Over 306,000 individuals have taken the DHS “Active Shooter: What You Can Do” course.

 - Seven FLETC-conducted Active Shooter Threat Training Programs.
 - Over 500 Active Shooter Tenant Awareness Training sessions, provided in Fiscal Year (FY) 2013 by FPS to Federal agencies occupying space within FPS-protected facilities.
 - The Joint Counterterrorism Awareness Workshop Series, sponsored by the National Counterterrorism Center, DHS, and the FBI, which seeks to address this partnership among all stakeholders. The multi-city series is a collaborative effort among Federal, State, local and private-sector entities that empowers cities to provide the best response to an organized, coordinated and multi-site terrorist attack.

- FEMA active shooter and mass casualty training, hosted through online and in-person opportunities with the Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Education.

- 56 regionally-based Table-Top Exercises, conducted by DHS and the FBI, with State and local first responders, shopping mall security directors, and operations managers.
- In FY 2014, DHS plans to continue its active shooter preparedness and training efforts through a number of activities:
 - IP will conduct 26 Active Shooter Training Workshops in FY 2014; eight have already been completed.

 - The FLETC Active Shooter Threat Training Program and First Responder Program will train approximately 950 individuals.
 - NPPD Multi-Jurisdictional Security Planning Training will train approximately 900 individuals in FY 2014.
 - NPPD Surveillance Detection Training will train approximately 1,500 individuals in FY 2014.
 - NPPD Active Shooter Workshops will train approximately 3,750 individuals in FY 2014.
 - DHS, in coordination with the Department of Justice and FBI, will train approximately 14,000 law enforcement officers, first responders, and school officials.
