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Definitions:

CSQ: violence motivated by an extremist ideology and committed or willingly supported by non-state actors to further political goals

<u>USAID:</u> "Violent extremism refers to advocating, engaging in, preparing or otherwise supporting ideologically motivated or justified violence to further social, economic and political objectives."

<u>USIP</u>: "Counter Violent Extremism is a realm of policy, programs, and interventions designed to prevent individuals from engaging in violence associated with radical political, social, cultural, and religious ideologies and groups."

<u>ORL</u>: "violent extremism is any movement that promotes violent means to advance its ideology, political goals, or religious interpretation."

NSS: "....individuals who support or commit ideologically-motivated violence to further political goals."

NCTC: "Extremist violence is violence committed by non-state actors in the name of a political, ethnic, or ideological cause and includes recruiting as well as facilitating violence."

<u>UK:</u> "Violent extremism can be defined as the use of and facilitation of violence targeted on civilians as a means of rectifying grievances, real or perceived, which form the basis of increasingly strong exclusive group identities."




