

MSA will follow its targeting procedures, adopted by the Attorney General, in consultation with the Director of National Intelligence, pursuant to subsection 702(d) of the Act, for determining that the user of the reasonably believed to be located outside the United States and is not a United States person. NSA will also be responsible for determining that a significant purpose of the acquisition is to obtain foreign intelligence information.

(S//NF) NSA will provide the FBI with identifying information of any together with an explanation of NSA's conclusion that the user of the is a person reasonably believed to be located outside the United States and its determination regarding the non-United States person status of the user. NSA will also represent that a significant purpose of is to obtain foreign intelligence information and that the purpose of such acquisition is not to intentionally target a particular, known person reasonably believed to be in the United States.



II. (U) DOCUMENTATION

10. (S//NF) The FBI will ensure the retention of information it receives from NSA concerning the non-United States person status of the user of the the factual basis for NSA's determination that the user of the reasonably believed to be located outside the United States in accordance with the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) and, as appropriate, the FBI's Records Management Division and/or Security Division standards, policies, and guidelines.

III. (U) COMPLIANCE AND OVERSIGHT

12. (S//NF) The FBI will develop and deliver training regarding the applicable procedures to ensure that all personnel responsible for under these procedures understand their responsibilities with respect to The FBI has established processes for determining which and for ensuring that and the related and the proper training.

- 13. (S//NF) The FBI Inspection Division will conduct oversight of the FBI's exercise of these procedures. This oversight will include periodic reviews by FBI Inspection Division personnel to evaluate the implementation of the procedures and the training given to relevant personnel. Such reviews will occur at least once every calendar year.
- 14. (S//NF) DOJ and ODNI will conduct oversight of the FBI's exercise of the authority under section 702 of the Act, which will include periodic reviews by DOJ and ODNI personnel to evaluate the implementation of these procedures. Such reviews will occur at least once every sixty days.

15. (S//NF) The FBI will report to DOJ through the Deputy Assistant Attorney General in the National Security Division with responsibility for intelligence operations and oversight, to the ODNI Office of General Counsel, and to the ODNI Civil Liberties Protection Officer any incidents of noncompliance with these procedures by FBI personnel within five business days of learning of the incident.
