Public release of this information would cause serious damage to the national security by alerting the enemy to specific aspects of our Rules of Engagement (ROE) and operational limits as to when certain kinds of ordnance may be employed and in what specific locations they may be employed. Some of these maps also contain references to specific intelligence activities, intelligence sources, and collection methods were redacted pursuant to Exemption (b)(1) to protect from disclosure national security information regarding national defense. In particular, the withheld material identifies the dates that certain special intelligence was obtained with respect to specific enemy targets. Knowing the date certain special intelligence was obtained by Coalition Forces would support enemy counterintelligence efforts and significantly increase the risk of compromise of our special intelligence sources and enhance the enemy's ability to deny our efforts at gathering intelligence. Disclosure of this information reasonably could be expected to cause serious damage to the national security.
