Summary: The reportedly "secret meeting" between senior U.S. and Pakistani generals dominated headlines in all newspapers on Friday. Newspapers quoted U.S. Joint chiefs of Staff Admiral Mike Mullen as saying that "military to military relationship between the two countries was growing every day," while a spokesman of the Pakistan Military confirmed the participation of Chief of Army Staff General Kayani in the meeting and said that "this was pre-scheduled meeting aimed at discussing security matters at the strategic level." All newspapers also highlighted government's decision of abolishing "35 Frontier Corps checkpoints in Balochistan." Also figured prominently were reports that "Senator Barrack Obama made history by becoming the first black American to win presidential nomination." Also front-paged were reports that "lawyers staged sit-ins and rallies all over the country" to protest against the non-restoration.

"After a secret meeting between senior U.S. and Pakistani generals, Chairman of the U.S. Joint Chiefs of Staff Admiral Mike Mullen told a briefing at the Pentagon on Thursday that the military-to-military relationship between the two countries was 'growing every day.' Admiral Mullen also told the briefing he believed Pakistan's focus in the war on terror was where it should have been. The meeting, held on Wednesday aboard U.S. aircraft carrier Abraham Lincoln in the Indian Ocean, considered various proposals for fighting extremists in FATA.... "Prime Minister's Adviser on Interior Affairs Rehman Malik has announced that names of all political leaders of Balochistan have been removed from the Exit Control List (ECL) and 35 checkpoints of the Frontier Corps in the province are being abolished."

3. "Bannu Bomb Attack Kills Seven Police Personnel" "Dawn" (08/29)

"Seven policemen and two civilians were killed and 14 people were injured when a bomb placed in a car exploded near a police bus in Bannu on Thursday."

4. "U.S. Missile Attack In Waziristan Injures Four" "Daily Times" (08/29)

"A missile fired from a United States drone injured a woman and three children in South Waziristan late on Wednesday night, officials and residents told 'Daily Times' on Thursday."

## 6. "Taliban Ask People To Leave Troubled Area" "Dawn" (08/29)

"The Taliban have asked the people to leave the troubled areas of Swat and move to safe places as five more people were killed in the valley on Thursday. Sources said that militants had erected barricades on different roads and were targeting pro-government people."

7. "Obama Creates History By Winning Presidential Nomination" "Dawn" (08/29)

"Senator Barack Obama made history on Wednesday night, becoming the first black American to win presidential nomination of a major U.S. party."

8. "Lawyers Stage Sit-Ins, Rallies All Over Country" "The News" (08/29)

"The lawyers on Thursday staged two-hour sit-ins and took out protest rallies across the country to put pressure on the government for the early restoration of the deposed judges, including Chief Justice Iftikhar Muhammad Chaudhry."

9. "U.S. Pledges Close Ties With Pakistan" "The News," "Daily Times" (08/29)

"The United States said it has longstanding interests with Pakistan and pledged close cooperation with the elected government while acknowledging the key importance of the country's cooperative role in the fight against extremism, State Department Deputy spokesman Robert Wood said."

11. "For The Sake Of A Chief Justice," an editorial in the centrist national English daily "The News" (cir. 55,000) (08/29)

Till now the PPP has consistently held that the measures taken on November 3 were illegal. It is possible of course that this too was just a false promise, no different to other 'agreements' that Zardari has said he had no problem with breaking. But the PPP must realize there is a limit to the length of time it can keep taking people for a ride.... A failure to restore the deposed Chief Justice would be an act violating all principles and would confirm suspicions that we seem to be headed into a political abyss where deceit rules and decency has no place."

15. "Looking Back At Our Role In Afghanistan," an op-ed by Najmuddin A. Shaikh in the Lahore-based liberal English language daily "Daily Times" (cir. 10,000) (08/29)

"Let us be clear that the direction of the anti-Soviet Jihad was determined by us. We decided after the Soviet withdrawal from Afghanistan not to dismantle the Jihadi network and to use it for other purposes. We decided to support the Taliban and thus furthered the spread of extremism in our border areas. The American abandonment of the area was criminally negligent; their actions in other parts of the Muslim world were equally harmful; their decision to let Usama bin Laden seek asylum in Afghanistan after his expulsion was inexplicable. Much other blame can be apportioned to America but we too must acknowledge that the misguided policies and ambitions of our leaders have played the principal part in bringing us to our present sorry pass."
