SUMMARY: Reports that the Islamabad Police put the capital on 'Red Alert' following reports that "three vehicles laden with explosives have sneaked into the city" received prominent front page coverage in all newspapers on Friday. Foreign Minister Qureshi's statement that the "government is seeking opposition's help in framing new anti-terror policy to tackle frequent violation of the Pakistan-Afghanistan border and U.S. missile attacks in the tribal areas" received prominent coverage in most dailies on Friday. U.S. Chairman Joint Chiefs of Staff Admiral Mike Mullen's statement that "Pakistan was fighting terrorists bravely" also figured prominently. Newspapers also highlighted the Government of Pakistan's statement that the "Danish embassy blast would not affect the reconciliation process with tribal militants." Also highlighted were reports that government released 64 Swat militants following a peace accord."

The English daily, "The News," and six of Account Tanguage publication, "Jang" ran an exclusive interview of nuclear scientist Dr. A. Q. Khan in which he blamed President Musharraf and his associates "for being too weak to defend Pakistan's nuclear program."

Varying themes got reflected in editorials in different newspapers. Most dailies continued to run editorials on the success of Barack Obama as the Democratic front-runner for the U.S. presidential elections. The English daily, "The News," noted that "while Obama has termed himself a candidate for change there is no indication that he plans to bring any radical adjustments in the U.S. foreign policy. Indeed regarding Israel, the war on terror and Pakistan his tone throughout has been hard-line." Another English daily, "The Post," observed that "the future president of the U.S. will have to work to reverse policies that have proved harmful to the interests of the U.S. as well as other peace-loving countries. Commenting on the impending delivery of F-16 aircrafts to Pakistan the Urdu daily, "Islam," wrote: "The American firm manufactured these F-16 aircrafts for Pakistan in 1980s, but the U.S. Administration stopped the company from providing these jets to Pakistan. Ultimately these aircrafts were used by the U.S. Air Force in 1990s, and now the U.S. is giving us these second-hand aircrafts. Now these old and used jets are of no use for Pakistan Air Force. "The National Assembly was concerned over border and air-space violations by coalition forces from Afghanistan, Qureshi said 'We have to sit collectively and devise a strategy.'"

6. "Qureshi Seeks Unity Against Border Violations" "The News" (06/06)

"Foreign Minister Shah Mahmud Qureshi on Thursday told the National Assembly that the government would not allow foreign interference in the Pakistan territory and would ensure that the Pakistani soil was not used for terrorism."

In an exclusive interview with 'The News,' Dr Khan thanked the Pakistani masses for recognition of his contribution in transforming Pakistan into a nuclear state."

11. "Bush Says Cooperation With Pakistan In US Interest" "The News" (06/06)

"President George W. Bush said on Thursday the United States cooperation with Pakistan and other countries facing terrorism challenges is in America's vital interest, as he highlighted the need for strengthening democratic institutions that serve as an antidote to extremism. Speaking at the US Institute of Peace, he said curbing extremism requires using the power of liberty."

12. "Peace Talks Must End Violence: US" "The News" (06/06)

"Acknowledging the enormity of challenge facing Pakistan in curbing terrorism along its rugged Afghan border, United States National Security Advisor Stephen Hadley has urged patience as the new government develops a comprehensive counter-terrorism strategy.
