SUMMARY: Reports on the PPP's "controversial" appointment of business-cum-media tycoon Salman Taseer as new Governor in the Punjab province dominated headlines in all newspapers on Friday. All dailies also highlighted reports that coalition government partner, PML-N, "reacted angrily to the nomination of a controversial person as Governor" and termed it a "conspiracy by the Presidency to topple PML-N government." The English daily, "Dawn," reported that the "U.S. is refusing to comment on the missile attack on Damadola and has toughened its stances on a proposed agreement with the militants." Also highlighted were reports that Pakistan Foreign Office spokesman said that "nobody has claimed responsibility for the Bajaur attack therefore no speculation can be made in this regards." Ambassador Patterson's meeting with former Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif also received prominent coverage.

Most major dailies ran critical editorials on the alleged U.S. missile attack in Damadola killing at least 20 people. The English daily, "The News," noted that "the fact that the attack coincides with an exchange of prisoners between Baitullah Mehsud and the government is worrying. It suggests that the purpose behind it may have been to sabotage such deal-making." Another English daily, "Pakistan Observer," noted that "earlier too the United States had been violating Pakistan's sovereignty by similar attacks and intrusions into its air space on one pretext or the other thus increasing anti-American feelings. The latest attack was definitely aimed at subverting the process of talks." The Urdu daily, "Mashriq," wrote: "The U.S. must understand that after bombing the peaceful civilians of an independent and sovereign country, the Americans must not expect garlands from the aggrieved people in return."

Ambassador Patterson's recent address at Management Association of Pakistan in Karachi continued to resonate in the media. Two Letters to the Editor in the English daily, "Dawn," pointed out that "if she (Ambassador Patterson) looks at the overall trend in the U.S. policies over the years, she should not be surprised at the unhappy feelings not only amongst average Pakistan and Muslims generally but also in a number of European nations against American arrogance. Ambassador Anne Patterson needs to focus on these things and rather than draw her own conclusion." End Summary.
