Thank you so much for your help this morning. The ADIC, Diego Rodriguez, and SAC Greg Ehrie (who happened to be down at HQ involved in some of the initial stages of developing this project) addressed our Muslim Leaders' Council, after which I walked them through the "Don't be a Puppet" program.

To say that it was well-received would be an understatement. They all felt that it was exactly the kind of thing they wanted to see in the public and private (including Islamic) schools. The only suggestion that they had, was that on the

They're eager to go out and dispel the rumors and promote it within their own communities. They also hope that perhaps a version for even younger individuals might be developed. One member, and African Muslim, informed us that there's a "Peace in Schools" bill in New York State right now that includes a similar, but not as well done program re: CVE. He's hoping that the local politicians at some point could see the FBI's presentation and also suggested that we bring in groups of teachers and community leaders to introduce the program to them prior to its release to the public.

It was the general consensus that they would like to see the FBI in front of the issue that popped up in the news about it. That they don't want to see it held up because of self-proclaimed activists who are providing incorrect information to the media. One of our members who is very active in his community, went so far as to say that if we changed the one slide, he would reach out to his many media contacts and start talking up the program immediately.

I hope you find this feedback useful. Thank you again for your help.

Subject: Update re congressional briefings on new website

This week, we've had an aggressive schedule of outreach meetings re our website "Don't Be a Puppet: Pull Back the Curtain on Violent Extremism." These meetings have included Muslim leaders and inter-agency partners.

In talking with [redacted] from the CVE Section and with AD Kortan, we now feel comfortable providing a briefing/demo of the site to respond to congressional inquiries. We can discuss the best strategy for doing this.

Just a couple scheduling considerations - Most of the teams working on this will be doing other briefings the later part of next week, so any congressional briefings should be early next week or the following week (or later). Second, when scheduling demos of the website, more time is preferable to less. There is a lot of content to go through and once people start asking questions it can be challenging to cover everything. Too short of a discussion can lead to misunderstandings, but we've been consistently able to turn skeptics into supporters in our longer discussions.

Just give me shout when you have a few minutes to discuss the way forward.

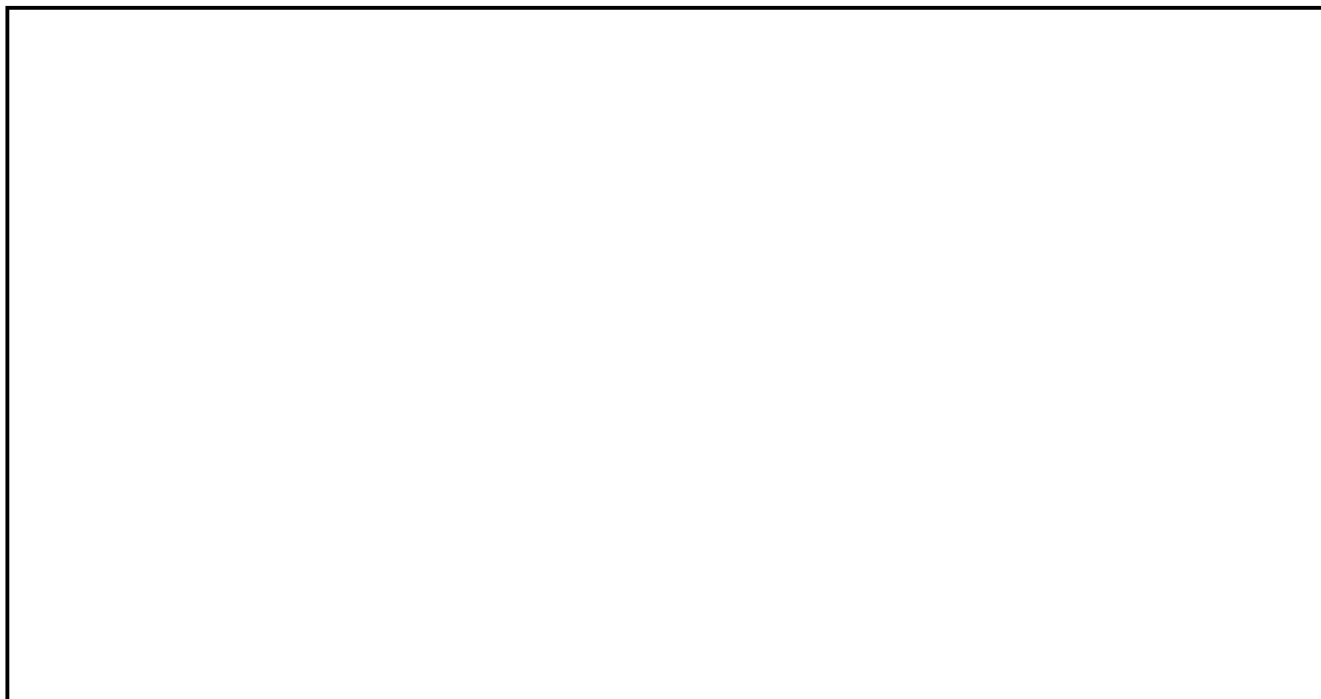

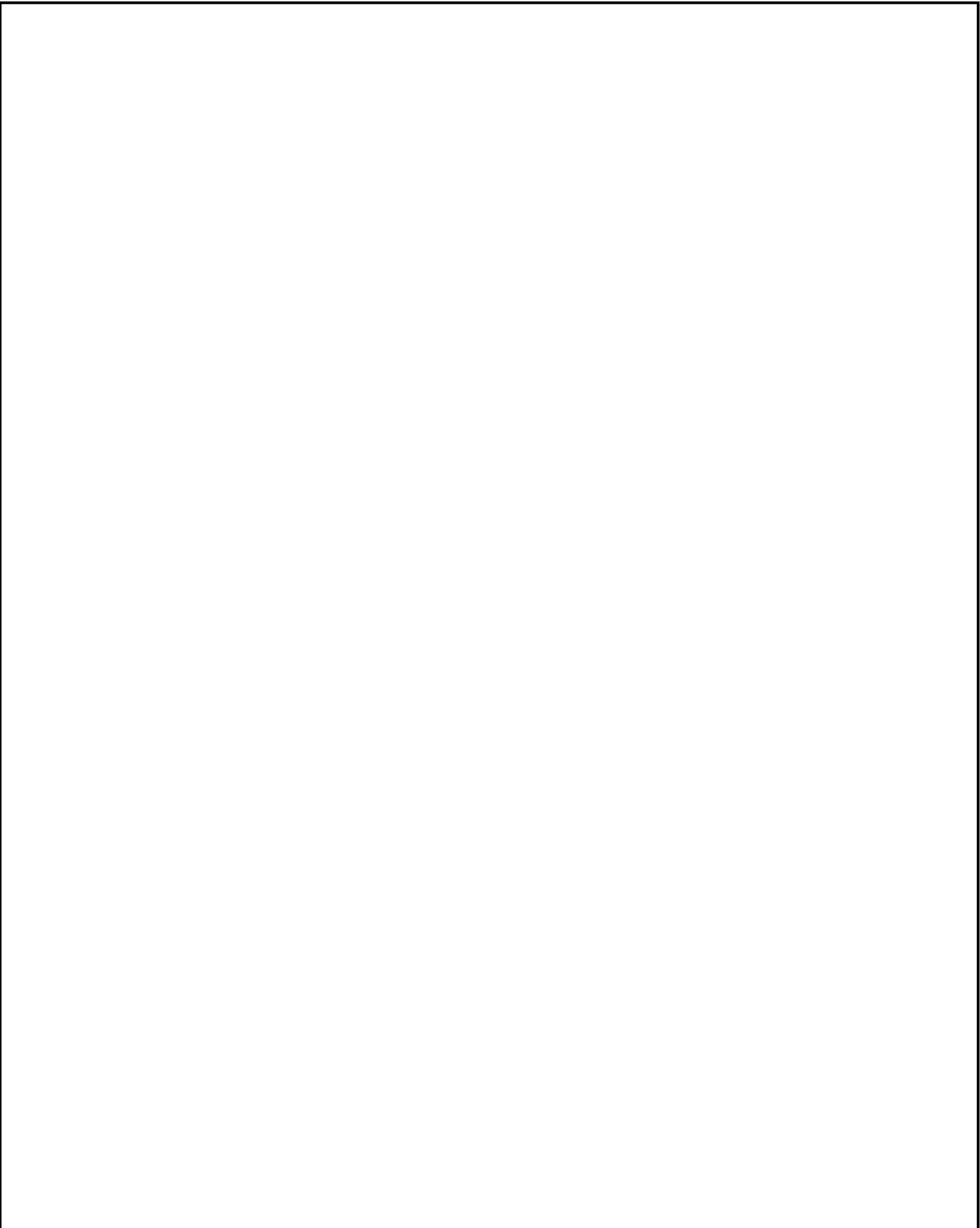
