


Surveillance is the surreptitious, systematic, and generally discreet observation of a person, place, or activity to obtain information not otherwise available from other sources.



### Red Balled:

Traffic light that is red.

• "Target is red balled at Gallows and Lee"

## Fresh Light:

Traffic light that has just changed.

- "Target is passing through a fresh green at Essex"
- "Target is about to come up to a fresh red at Main"

## Stale Light:

Traffic light that has been that color for a while.

- "Stale green"
- "Stale red"

# Lane Numbering:

Travel and turning lanes are numbered starting from the left.

- Number 1 lane
- Number 1 turning lane
- "Target is northbound in the Number 3 lane"








FIGURE 2: LANE NUMBERING EXAMPLES
