AGREEMENT

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KENOSHA COUNTY SHERIFF TACTICAL RESPONSE TEAM & PLEASANT PRAIRIE POLICE DEPT.

The Sheriff of Kenosha County, Wisconsin, David G. Beth, on behalf of the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department (hereafter referred to as the KSD), and the President of the Village of Pleasant Prairie, Wisconsin, John Steinbrink Sr., by their respective signatures below and in accordance with Wisconsin Statute 59.28(2), do hereby enter into and accept as binding upon themselves and their respective departments the following Agreement to integrate police officers of the PPPD into the Tactical Response Team (hereafter referred to as TRT) of the KSD.

Police officers of the PPPD may make application to the KSD for membership in the TRT of the KSD through the Administration of the PPPD. Police officers doing so will be given equal consideration by the KSD for full membership and participation in the TRT of the KSD. Any police officer of the PPPD seeking such membership will be required to undertake and successfully complete the course of testing and screening as established by the KSD as applied to all officers seeking similar membership and participation. The Sheriff will have final judgment on whether a position on the TRT will be offered to any police officer of the PPPD except that the PPPD may, at its discretion, veto the membership of any PPPD police officer on the TRT.

The common public name of the TRT will remain the "Kenosha County Sheriff Tactical Response Team" (hereafter referred to as KCSTRT). The leadership and management of the KCSTRT will remain with the KSD. The PPPD will accept full costs associated with training of the PPPD police officers accepted for membership in the KCSTRT and agree to release those officers from normal duty assignment(s) when needed for TRT operations. Common or Team equipment used by various or all members of the KCSTRT will be purchased/supplied by and remain the property of the KSD unless other arrangements are agreed to in advance between the Chief of Police and the Sheriff. Should the KCSTRT be dissolved at any time in the future, all participating agencies will retain that equipment which they have purchased and provided for the use of their members of the KCSTRT, unless other arrangements have been agreed to in advance by the Chief of Police and the Sheriff.

PPPD shall pay the salary, overtime and expenses of any Officer participating in the KCSTRT, along with any wage, disability payments, pension and worker's compensation claims for injuries incurred while on the KCSTRT. Any deployment of the KCSTRT will be in accordance with the laws and provisions of Wisconsin Statute § 66.0313, Law Enforcement Mutual Assistance and Wisconsin Statute § 66.03125, Fire Departments; Mutual Assistance, and questions of liability for actions of all members of the KCSTRT will be considered in light of these statutes whenever appropriate. In all situations not sufficiently addressed by the provisions of these statutes or this Agreement, the actions of each member of the KCSTRT will be the responsibility of the contributing agency from which the individual member came.

This Agreement remains in full force and effect binding upon all subsequent officials of the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department and the Village of Pleasant Prairie Police Department unless modified by mutual agreement at some future time. Any member agency may request reopening of negotiations on this Agreement by written request to the other agencies who are a party to this Agreement and all other parties must meet to commence negotiations within thirty (30) calendar days of the receipt of such written notice.

Any agency providing members to the KCSTRT may withdraw from this Agreement no sooner than sixty (60) calendar days after providing written notice to all other member agencies of the intent to do so.
