Section 48.27 covers this optional method of appointing certified process servers circuit-wide. The additional burden on the court system of administering such a system is probably why it has never been done here. Additionally, the same type of appointment system is available on a county by county basis for each of the Sheriffs in the circuit (48.021(2)). I would think that if we were really interested in appointing permanent process servers, we would want to carefully explore this idea with each of our Sheriffs to see if they would have any objection, or whether any of them have already appointed process servers in their counties. I don't think our Alachua County Sheriff has done so. There may be good reasons for not wanting to do this, or at least reasons to consider before doing so. I don't know if our local Sheriffs want or do not want the business, for example. My understanding about Broward is that the Sheriff got so inundated that process wasn't being served in a timely or efficient manner. This may not be the case in this circuit, although I've never myself hesitated to appoint when asked as long as I know that it is a trustworthy outfit. I agree with Bob that a ton of these orders come through the civil division and it would facilitate things to have the trustworthy one or two process servers that are typically appointed in these cases established as the ones to use without needing an order in every case.

He asked whether these requirements would be applied to existing cases or just new cases. The proposed administrative order from the Florida Supreme Court states, "Upon the effective date of this Administrative Order, all <u>newly filed</u> mortgage foreclosure actions filed against a homestead residence shall be referred to the RMFM Program ..."

It goes on to say, "At the discretion of the presiding judge, compliance with this Administrative Order may also be required for homestead residential mortgage foreclosure actions filed prior to the effective date of the Administrative Order, to residences which are not homestead residences, and any other residential foreclosure action the presiding judge deems appropriate."

We would like to get your opinion as to how that policy will be applied in this circuit. Will it be that groups of cases (i.e., all homestead residential mortgage foreclosure actions, regardless of when filed) will be subject to the new mediation program or will it be that a judge has the discretion to refer an individual case to mediation even if it is not newly filed or not homestead?
