There is no presumption of credibility, however, if no adverse credibility determination is explicitly made, the applicant or witness shall have a rebuttable presumption of credibility on appeal.







• Once the applicant has been informed about a particular issue, it is your duty provide the applicant a meaningful opportunity to explain the issue set forth, understanding that it is possible that the applicant does not have any explanation for the problematic testimony.

Provide the applicant an opportunity to explain

• Does the applicant's explanation of the problematic testimony make sense in light of the circumstances?

Assess the reasonableness of the explanation

• Remember, the applicant is not your opponent.

 existing FDNS-DS user guidance and training materials, and provided users access to training
 resources as of September 30, 2016.
- 3. The Asylum Division and FDNS are coordinating to identify, develop, and procure the appropriate tools to aid officers in the detection of fraud.
- 4. Regarding prescreening efforts, the Asylum FDNS Chief is reviewing current fraud trends to develop a standardized prescreening plan for all asylum offices.

This next slide is just a breakdown of anecdotal evidence received from the offices about identified fraud and security risks. As you can see Boston is not separately mentioned as we are included inwith ZNK and this is not entirely accurate bc ZNK is not mentioned for gang affiliation, even though we have a good chunk of cases in which the applicants are gang members. Looking at this list, I think everything on here has popped up in Boston more than once.





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

Common Diagnoses

- **PTSD** – 3 Main categories – it is natural response to something that is overwhelming to the body (flight, fight or freeze, most torture survivors freeze), this happens when they are out of the traumatic situation and certain triggers continue to put them back in that state

o Re-experiencing

- Recurrent, intrusive recollections and dreams about the traumatic event(s)
- Disassociative episodes (e.g., flashbacks)
- Intense distress (psychological and physiological when exposed to reminders or symbols of the events

Avoidance/ numbing

- Avoidance of thoughts, feelings, and activities associated with the trauma
- Difficulty remembering important aspects of the trauma
- Restricted range of feeling ("numbing")
- Feeling detached/estranged from others
- Sense of foreshortened future
- O Hyper-arousal (body preparing for a flight or fight response)
 - Difficulty falling or staying asleep
 - Irritability or anger outbursts
 - Difficulty concentrating
 - Hyper-vigilance
 - Continually watchful of surroundings
 - Exaggerated startle response
- **Depression** (many times coupled with PTSD)

Stress, Burn Out & Secondary Trauma

Pamela H. Elizabeth, ED.D.

- Stress, burn out, and secondary trauma

Stress Symptoms:

- can be
 - o physical upset stomach, constipation
 - o mental forgetful, indecisive
 - o emotional crabby, hopeless, hostile
 - o behavioral drug taking, argumentative, critical
 - o environmental financial, health, relationships, work, family, care-taker
- all though the symptoms can be similar, they can vary in magnitude, duration, intensity, long term effects, and treatment options
- stress is a fact of life and work that must be acknowledged and managed for individual well-being
- 1967 (about 40 years) stress was introduced into medicine as an important factor in our well being
- The Holmes Stress Point Scale
 - o Developed by Thomas H. Holmes M.D.
 - o Published in 1967
 - Predicts risk of serious illness based on stress causing factors
- one indicator of stress is evidenced by sleep disturbances
- stress related sleep problems in US culture
 - o difficulty falling asleep
 - o frequent awakenings
 - o wake up early and can't get back to sleep

- o wake up un-refreshed
- since the *Holmes* scale
 - o many measures of psychological stress have been developed
- effects of long term stress
 - o contributes to nearly 50% of our illnesses,
 - o major risk factor in heart disease and cancer
- effects of acute and long term stress on the body
 - Acute stress at the present
 - Respiration increase
- strongest predictor of heart disease is hostility
 - high levels of hostility can greatly increase you chances of dying from heart disease and cancer
- the concept of hostility included the tendency to
 - o feel anger, annoyance, resentment and contempt
 - o to be cynical and negative about human nature and
 - o to believe disagreeable behavior is directed towards them
- Major Research Findings...
 - o role/ work overload related to emotional exhaustion
 - o stress is acknowledged only when someone is on verge of collapse
 - o burnout in business and public sector are similar
 - o there is a strong connection btw work and health
 - o more work hours often does not equal greater productivity
 - women often require super-human effort to reach parity with male colleagues
 - o the greater job autonomy, the greater job satisfaction, the greater positive mental health outcome
 - job satisfaction=flexible work hours, varied work load = greater employee retention
 - o Burnout is associated with lack of role clarity and conflicting needs
 - o Burnout widespread in many occupations
 - Perceived inequality = fast track burnout!
 - o Burnout crosses back and forth from one partner to the other
 - Burnout relief= satisfactory vacation time
- Situational/Organizational Risk Factors
 - Excessive and continuous hours with applicants
 - Excessive responsibilities/ inadequate resources w/out authority to make decisions
 - o Etc,...
- Personal (Internal) Risk Factors
 - Over commitment
 - Inability to delegate
 - Over identification with applicants
 - o Job is primary source of fulfillment
 - Job is substitute for social life
 - Unrealistic goals and expectations
 - High control needs

- Population/ Applicant Risk Factors
 - o High need/chronically ill population
 - Overly homogenous applicants
 - Applicant problems/ low chance of resolution
 - o Emotional stress of constant involvement in other peoples needs
 - Over work to the point of fatigue
 - o Applicant management issues greater than what can be addressed

So today's training will be on Eliciting Testimony during while interviewing minors, more specifically UACs.

- I'm not going to spend time on this because that was the focus of last week's training, but just to refresh your memory here are the basics about UACs
- 2. You already know that UACs are a type of minor principle applicant.
- 3. Some minors are determined to be UACs by ICE or CBP after being apprehended at the border. However, for those minors who have not been determined to be UACs, AO's must make a determination as to whether a minor is a UAC, based on the applicant's age at the time of filing, the applicant's currently immigration status and whether the applicant has a parent or legal guardian that can provide care and physical custody. Most of this information is going to come from the applicant's testimony.
- 4. But, please note that if an applicant is not a UAC, but is in removal proceedings the Asylum Office does not have original jurisdiction.
- 5. Also, note that the asylum office still retains initial jurisdiction over UACs, even if the applicant is currently in proceedings, that includes proceedings that have been administratively closed
- 6. This is not the case if proceedings have been terminated; however, in cases where there is some sort of continuance or the case was administratively closed, the Immigration Court retains jurisdiction.

7. Today we are going to focus on how we would actually obtain the information to determine whether an applicant is a UAC through the interview and also in general how to proceed when interviewing a minor.

8. Basic Interviewing Tips –

- a. Provide applicant an opportunity to be heard- This will allow the applicant to fully and completely tell his or her story and to provide details that may not be included in the written statement. This is also a good opportunity for you to elicit necessary details that are essential in determining credibility
- b. Listen to what the applicant is saying This will allow you to ask follow-up questions based on the applicant's responses
- c. Avoid Red Herrings Focus on the issues that are necessary so you have sufficient time to ask appropriate questions relevant to the applicant's claim

9. Interactions with Third Parties

- a. Who is present? Take note of who came to the interview with the applicant. How do they interact with each other? Identify any suspicions and address them immediately
- b. It is best practices to go to the waiting room and introduce yourself and have those present introduce themselves. This will help you to quickly assess any relationships and determine what questions you will need to ask during the interview.
- c. If you suspect child abuse, trafficking, or if you have any other concerns about a minor, please let your supervisor know while the person is still in office.







Subject: Recent Case Law

Here are some recent case law updates. None of these cases are 2nd Circuit cases, so the law is not binding on us. However, they may be helpful with analysis in some instances.

Nongovernment Actors and Internal Relocation - Russia

<u>Doe v. Holder</u>, 2013 WL 6182985 F.3d (9th Cir. Nov. 27, 2013). The Ninth Circuit held that an applicant does not bear the burden of establishing that the Russian government sponsored or condoned the persecution of homosexuals, or was unwilling to control the persecution <u>because the applicant was a homosexual</u>. The court held that where a nongovernment actor is the source of the persecution, an applicant must present evidence (1) that the nongovernment actor persecuted the applicant on account of a protected ground, and (2) that the government is unable or unwilling to control the nongovernment actor. Court noted that the applicant raised the issue of the harassment and discrimination he faced in Moscow because of his ethnicity, not as a separate ground for asylum, but to establish he could not reasonably relocate within Russia. The court remanded the case for a determination of whether there has been a change in Russia regarding the persecution of homosexuals and whether it would be reasonable for the applicant to relocate within Russia.

Credibility and Past Persecution - China

Qing Hua Lin v. Holder, 2013 WL 6136413, F.3d (4th Cir. Nov. 22, 2013). The Fourth Circuit relied on discrepancies between the applicant's statements at various stages of the asylum process in upholding the BIA's adverse credibility determination. Those discrepancies included inconsistencies between the applicant's statements during the Border Patrol interview and her later testimony and application materials. The court noted that the foundation of the applicant's claim was that she was subjected to a forced abortion, but that she failed to mention it when initially interviewed. The court found that her explanation for the omission, i.e. that the Border Patrol Agent told her he could not record the details of her claim, was undermined by the fact that she was able to mention several other details of her past and had already obtained an abortion certificate with an eye towards applying for asylum. The court also refused to accept her explanation of why she told the Border Patrol Agent she was unmarried, but referred to herself as married throughout the asylum process. The court noted that it was hesitant to rely on statements made in the Border Patrol setting, given after long and dangerous journeys to the United States, noting that its sister circuits caution against using such statements. Keeping those considerations in mind, the court held that the allegation of a forced abortion was not a minor evidentiary detail in the applicant's case. Her omissions and inconsistencies, coupled with her demeanor and non-responsiveness during questioning led the court to find that the evidence supported the agency's adverse credibility finding. The court also held that the applicant failed to present any independent evidence of past persecution. The court found the abortion

certificate to be suspect because of the applicant's unreliable testimony. The court also rejected her evidence of a fine, holding that it was contrary to country condition information from the Department of State. One judge wrote a concurring opinion which stressed that airport and border interviews should be carefully scrutinized, but concurred in the result.

Persecution - Mexico

Rodriguez v. U.S. Att'y Gen., 2013 WL 6068465, F.3d (11th Cir. Nov. 19, 2013). Applicant, subject to reinstatement of removal, sought withholding of removal based on his family's ownership of farmland and the resulting attempts by drug traffickers to use the land. The applicant's father was killed by a two individuals for refusing to grow illegal drugs on his land. The two individuals were arrested, but later released and later started a "vendetta" against the applicant and his family. The applicant's uncle was kidnapped and tortured by the family of the individuals arrested and the applicant's family paid a ransom to secure his release. The BIA held that the harm to the applicant's family members did not constitute persecution to the applicant and that the applicant failed to show he had a well-founded fear in Mexico upon return. The BIA also rejected the applicant's social group comprised of members of a family targeted by a drug-trafficking organization because a family member sought criminal justice against a member of the drug trafficking organization because the applicant failed to show it was recognized as a group in Mexican society. The BIA also found that the applicant failed to show he was a member of his other proposed group, landowners in a Mexican state.

The Eleventh Circuit upheld the BIA finding that the applicant failed to show past persecution based on the acts committed against his family members because he did not show any acts by the persecutors that threatened or harmed him personally. In reaching this conclusion, the court relied on decisions in the 7th, 8th and 9th Circuits. With regard to future persecution, the court held that the applicant failed to show that it was more likely than not he would suffer future persecution based on his membership in a particular social group. The court agreed with the BIA that the applicant failed to establish his membership in the social group of landowners. With regard to the social group of family members, the court held that the defining attribute of the group was its persecution by the drug trafficking organization and that risk of persecution alone does not create a social group. Lastly, even assuming the applicant was a member of a particular social group, the court held that he did not show that he would be persecuted on account of his membership, noting that the family members were harmed due to their failure to cooperate with the drug traffickers or were victims of criminal activity.

Nongovernment Actors - Honduras

<u>Urbina-Dore v. Holder</u>, 2013 WL 6052166, ___ F.3d ___ (7th Cir. Nov. 18, 2013). The applicants, owners of timberlands in Honduras, claimed that they feared squatters who had taken over their lands. The Seventh Circuit faulted the applicants for failing to address the BIA's holding that the government of Honduras is both willing and able to control the trespasses and other threats of misconduct by the squatters. The court noted that the BIA has applied the "unwilling or unable to control" formula since 1964 but has not attempted to quantify just how far a nation may depart from perfect law enforcement. Since the applicant's did not address how the government's actions were inadequate, the court found the BIA's decision was supported by substantial evidence.

Harm Rising to the Level of Persecution / Nexus / Religion - Russia

Ivanov v. Holder, 2013 WL 6037164, F.3d (1st Cir. Nov. 15, 2013). The applicant, a Pentecostal Christian from Russia, suffered several incidents of mistreatment over a four year period. He was heckled by bystanders who threw bottles at him and others celebrating the applicant's baptism. He was attacked by skinheads on Hitler's birthday upon leaving a drug rehabilitation center run by his church and where he volunteered. On this occasion the skinheads knocked him down, dragged him for blocks, took him to a basement where he was chained and beaten, subjected him to electric shocks and cigarette burns, and deprived of food and water for several days. They told him to close the church's "satanic" dispensary. Later, the applicant was summoned to the local police station and asked to give false testimony against his pastor who was accused of extorting 10% tithe from his congregants. When he refused to cooperate, he was told by police official he "would be sorry." A few days later the applicant was attacked by skinheads in his apartment building lobby who beat him severely. When the applicant called the police, no one came. He believed this incident was in retaliation for not cooperating with the police earlier. The next month, Molotov cocktails were thrown at the applicant's home, resulting in a fire his parents were able to put out. The applicant believed this incident was also done by skinheads, as well.

The First Circuit found that the harm experienced by the applicant rose above ordinary harassment, mistreatment and suffering, particularly when the applicant was detained for several days. The court noted that the applicant only had to show that the government was unable or unwilling to control the skinheads. With regard to nexus, the court noted that even if the skinheads had an economic motive in closing the church's drug rehabilitation clinic (because of their own drug sales), at their core they also opposed the church center's religious mission and message. The court looked at the totality of the incidents and found that the attacks, at least in part, were on account of the applicant's religion, which was a central motive underlying the group's identity, and that no reasonable adjudicator would be compelled to conclude to the contrary. One judge dissented and stated that the record did not compel a rejection of the IJ's finding.

Harm Rising to the Level of Persecution / Religion - Indonesia

<u>Supangat v. Holder</u>, 2013 WL 5942628, ___ F.3d ___ (8th Cir. Nov. 7, 2013). The applicant, a Christian convert, stated that as a student Muslims would demand money from him, steal his book bag, call him names and harass him on his way to and from school. On one occasion three Muslim men kidnapped him from a mall, drive him to a cemetery where he was threatened with a knife and all of his belongings were taken except his pants. Later, when he opened a business, the applicant stated that Muslims intimidated him and demanded money. The applicant stated that he did not report any of the incidents to the police because he believed they were also Muslim and did not care. The Eighth Circuit affirmed the BIA and IJ's determination that the harm suffered did not rise to the level of persecution because they lacked severity and were isolated acts of criminal conduct. Relying on Department of State reports on Indonesia, the court also upheld the BIA's and IJ's finding that the applicant failed to demonstrate a well-founded fear of persecution

CB

 ≈ 1951 Convention Related to the Status of Refugees/1967 Protocol Relating to the Status of Refugees

a refugee is one who is outside his or her former home country owing to a well-founded fear of persecution for reasons of race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion, and who is unable or unwilling to avail himself or herself of the protection of that country, or return there for reasons due to a fear of persecution.

Non-refoulement

CB

○ Article 3 of the Convention Against Torture provides:

☑ No State Party shall expel, return ("refouler") or extradite a person to another State where there are substantial grounds for believing that he would be in danger of being subjected to torture.

US Treaty Obligations vs. Asylum

OB

- ™ Three forms of relief that an individual can seek if fearing harm:
 - - ☐ Does not require a nexus, no bars apply, must show that there are substantial grounds for believing would be subjected to torture, fulfills treaty obligations
 - Withholding of Removal
 - Requires a nexus, no one-year filing deadline, but criminal bars apply, more likely than not to face persecution (51 % preponderance of the evidence), fulfills treaty obligations under the 1951 Convention Relating to the Status of Refugees
 - - Refugee definition, bars apply, reasonable possibility of facing persecution, discretionary

Asylum – Who is an asylee?

 \bowtie INA § 101(a)(42)(A) defines a refugee as:

or any person who is outside any country of such person's nationality or, in the case of a person having no nationality, is outside any country in which such person last habitually resided, and is unable or unwilling to avail himself or herself of the protection of, that country because of persecution or a well-founded fear of persecution on account of race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion.

Who is an asylee? Cont'd

- - who ordered, incited, assisted, or otherwise participated in the persecution of any person on account of race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion." INA § 101(a)(42); INA § 208(b)(2)

Who is an asylee? Cont'd

$\bowtie INA § 101(a)(42)$:

cs a person who has been forced to abort a pregnancy or to undergo involuntary sterilization, or who has been persecuted for failure or refusal to undergo such a procedure or for other resistance to a coercive population control program, shall be deemed to have been persecuted on account of political opinion, and a person who has a well founded fear that he or she will be forced to undergo such a procedure or subject to persecution for such failure, refusal, or resistance shall be deemed to have a well founded fear of persecution on account of political opinion.

Past Persecution – General Elements

- ≈ Elements:
 - ☑ **Degree of Harm** severity of the harm
 - Nexus- is the persecutor motivated to harm due to at least one central reason linked to a protected ground
 - ☑ **Identity of the Persecutor** gov't or entity gov't is unwilling or unable to control
 - CS Location harm must have occurred in the applicant's country of citizenship or last country of habitual residence

Past Persecution – What the BIA says

- "punitive" or "malignant" intent is not required for harm to constitute persecution. <u>Matter of Kasinga</u>, 21 I&N Dec. 357 (BIA 1996); <u>Pitcherskaia v. INS</u>, 118 F.3d 641 (9th Cir. 1997).
- can consist of objectively serious harm or suffering that is inflicted because of a characteristic (or perceived characteristic) of the victim, regardless of whether the persecutor intends the victim to experience the harm as harm. Matter of Kasinga, 21 I&N Dec. 357 (BIA 1996); for additional information, see RAIO Training module, Nexus and the Five Protected Grounds.
- encompasses more than physical harm or the threat of physical harm so long as the harm inflicted or feared rises to the level of persecution. *Matter of T-Z-*, 24 I&N Dec. 163, 169-71 (BIA 2007).

Supreme Court and Circuit Courts on Persecution

- The Supreme Court has held that persecution is a broader concept than threats to "life or freedom." *INS v. Stevic*, 467 U.S. 407, 428 fn. 22 (1984).
- There is no requirement that an individual suffer "serious injuries" to be found to have suffered persecution. *Asani v. INS*, 154 F.3d 719, 723 (7th Cir. 1998); *Mihalev v. Ashcroft*, 388 F.3d 722, 730 (9th Cir. 2004); *Sanchez-Jimenez v.U.S.Atty Gen*, 492 F.3d 1223 (11th Cir. 2007); *Ruiz v. Mukasey*, 526 F.3d 31, 37 (1st Cir. 2008).
- Non-physical harm may include "the deliberate imposition of severe economic disadvantage or the deprivation of liberty, food, housing, employment or other essentials of life." <u>Matter of T-Z-, 24 I&N Dec. at 171, citing Laipenienks v. INS, 750 F.2d 1427</u>, (9th Cir. 1985).

Past Persecution Established – Burden Shift

- Once applicant satisfies burden and past persecution is established, then there is a rebuttable presumption of a well-founded fear.
- ™ Burden shifts to DHS to rebut the presumption of a WFF.
 - © Presumption rebutted if there is a fundamental change in circumstances or
 - © Could internally relocate

Well Founded-Fear ("WFF")

Subjective fear required

Primary motivation (although may not be only motivation) for seeking asylum must be a genuine fear of persecution

Must have an objective basis

✓ Not any statistical basis, but whether the facts as they are presented would lead a reasonable person in similar circumstances to fear persecution

Matter of Chen

CB

An applicant who has experienced severe persecution is entitled to a discretionary grant of asylum based on a subjective fear of future harm even if no objective fear of harm exists.

Cases in which applicants granted under this theory:

- 1. *Matter of Chen*, 20 I&N Dec. 16 (BIA 1989).
- 2. *Matter of B-,* 21 I&N Dec. 66 (BIA 1995).
- 3. *Matter of N-M-A-*, 22 I&N Dec. 312 (BIA 1998).

More On WFF -Mogharrabi Test

CB

™ Matter of Mogharrabi – PACI

- Possession (imputed possession) of a protected characteristic which the feared *persecutor seeks to overcome*
- Awareness or ability to become aware of the protected characteristic by the feared persecutor
- © Capability of the persecutor to persecute the applicant; and
- Inclination the persecutor has to persecute the applicant

Pattern or Practice

CB

- The applicant is not required to show that she will be singled out for persecution, if she can show that there is a pattern or practice of persecution experienced by those similarly situated to her.
- Consider if there is a reasonable possibility that those similarly situated to the applicant will experience persecution
- ™ There is no established rule regarding this principle; however,
 - Members of the group must have a shared characteristic that falls within one of the protected grounds that a persecutor seeks to overcome
 - 8th Circuit says the persecution of the group must be systemic, organized or pervasive; 1st, 3rd, and 7th Circuits agree (nothing binding on this issue from 2nd Circuit or BIA)??

WFF Case Law

OB

Kone v. Holder, 596 F.3d 141 (2d Cir. 2010) – "The government urges that the fact that Kone was able to return to Côte d'Ivoire on several occasions without incident is sufficient to meet its burden to show a fundamental change in circumstances." "The simple fact of a safe return on a particular occasion does not negate the potential of future harm. Nothing in the regulations requires an applicant to show that she would be immediately persecuted upon return, that persecution would be likely to occur within some short time span, or that it would occur in regular intervals. To the contrary, the regulations speak broadly of the future; 'to rebut the regulatory presumption, the government must show that changed conditions obviate the risk [of future persecution] related to the original claim'... While return trips may provide some evidence of a relevant change in circumstances, they do not supply the requisite preponderance of evidence. The government cannot satisfy its burden to demonstrate that Kone will not be threatened simply by showing that she enjoyed periods with no new persecution or that she will not perpetually be persecuted in her native country."

More WFF Case Law

OB

- *Jian Hui Shao v. Mukasey*, **546 F.3d 138**, **169 (2d Cir. 2008)** (Chinese with U.S.-born children claiming violation of family planning policy − finding that petitioner failed to demonstrate an objectively reasonable well-founded fear of returning to China (too speculative to show objective fear)
- Y.C. v. Holder and X.W. v. Holder (December 18, 2013, 2d Cir) petitioner claiming a WFF of persecution because he was active in prodemocracy activities in the U.S. Court found there was insufficient evidence to establish that Chinese authorities are aware or likely to become aware of petitioner's pro-democracy activities and that there was insufficient evidence to show that petitioner would be targeted on that basis. (IJ in prior decision found that the applicant did not establish that her fear was objectively reasonable, noting the applicant's scant and general testimony in support of her claim.)

Other Serious Harm

OB

™ If the applicant has established past persecution, but unable to establish a well-founded fear of persecution, noting that persecution is harm on account of a protected ground, then determine whether there is a reasonable possibility that an applicant would face any other type of harm, if returned.

Other Serious Harm Case Law

- Matter of L-S-, 25 I&N Dec. 705 (BIA 2012) Interim Decision #3742
 - An asylum applicant who has established past persecution but no longer has a well-founded fear of persecution may nevertheless warrant a discretionary grant of humanitarian asylum based not only on compelling reasons arising out of the severity of the past persecution, but also on a "reasonable possibility that he or she may suffer other serious harm" upon removal to his or her country under 8 C.F.R. § 1208.13(b)(1)(iii)(B) (2011).
 - "Other serious harm" may be wholly unrelated to the applicant's past harm and need not be inflicted on account of race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion, but the harm must be so serious that it equals the severity of persecution.
 - In determining whether an applicant has established a "reasonable possibility" of "other serious harm," adjudicators should focus on current conditions that could severely affect the applicant, such as civil strife and extreme economic deprivation, as well as the potential for new physical or psychological harm that the applicant might suffer.

Internal Relocation

U3

- Determine whether applicant could avoid persecution by relocating within the country. If it is possible for the applicant to avoid persecution by internal relocation, then
- □ Determine whether applicant's relocation, under all circumstances, would be reasonable.
- Consider the identity of the persecutor. If the government, then the presumption is that the fear of harm exists countrywide and there is no reasonable option to relocate.

Bars to Asylum

CB

- ⊗ Bars to Asylum fall into two categories:
 - Bars to applying for asylum
 - where threshold issues for asylum determinations because you do not get to the merits of the claim if the applicant is barred by one of these issues.
 - 🗷 Bars to asylum eligibility
 - ☐ Issues that arise after it is determined that the applicant meets all of the criteria to be determined a refugee

Bars to Applying

CB

- - ∽ One-year filing deadline
 - Jurisdiction
 - Safe Third Country

One-Year Filing Deadline

- Applicants who applied after April 1, 1997 must file for asylum within one year of their arrival to the United States.
- Applicants must show timely filing in one of two ways:
 - 🖙 Establish last date of entry within the year of filing, or
 - S Establish presence outside of the U.S. within the year before filing
- - "firm belief or conviction as to the allegations sought to be established," and "where the truth of the facts asserted is highly probable."
 - The degree of evidence necessary to create a firm belief that an asserted fact is true
 - Falls between preponderance of the evidence and beyond a reasonable doubt

Exceptions to the One-Year Filing Deadline

- Must show circumstances directly related to the applicant's inability to timely file
- © Occurs within first year of arrival
- Must not be intentionally created to establish an exception

- Must show changed circumstances that materially effect asylum eligibility
- cs can occur any time after applicant's arrival
- Consider whether the facts the applicant has asserted actually are a change in circumstances that falls under this category

Reasonableness of the delay

Consideration of the totality of the circumstances, must balance both positive and negative factors to determine if the delay is reasonable

Case Law on Changed Circumstances

- Mabasa v. Gonzales, 455 F.3d 740 (7th Cir. 2006) holding that applicant did not show changed or worsened circumstances because the political climate in Zimbabwe remained as oppressive as it was at the time of his departure, and the applicant's renewed political activity in the US was the very activity that caused his original flight;
- Ramadan v. Keisler, 504 F.3d 973 (9th Cir. 2007) no changed circumstances where applicant expressed her political opinions in the U.S. on women's liberty in Egypt but had already been outspoken on women's issues while in Egypt.
- Vahora v. Holder, 641 F.3d 1038 (9th Cir. 2011); see also <u>Fakhry v. Mukasey</u>, 524 F.3d 1057 (9th Cir. 2008) where there are objectively changed circumstances, "there can be 'changed circumstances which materially affect the applicant's eligibility for asylum' even if the alien always meant to apply for asylum and always feared persecution..."


- - A change in government that is now hostile to members of the applicant's profession, ethnic group, etc.
 - Applicant's involvement in activities in the US that are critical of the government in the applicant's home country
 - Applicant's conversion from one religion to another
 - Threats against the applicant's family member living abroad, etc

Extraordinary Circumstances

- Examples of extraordinary circumstances that would provide an exception to the one-year filing deadline:
 - Serious illness, mental or physical disability
 - Must be present during initial year of arrival, does not have to have been incurred during the initial year
 - OB Death, serious illness, incapacitation of legal representative or member of family
 - For family, must consider the actual closeness of the relationships. Ex: death of estranged brother might not qualify
 - Legal disability minors and those with mental impairment
 - Ineffective assistance of counsel; however must show the following:
 - the applicant must file a written affidavit explaining the agreement in detail and listing what promises the attorney made or did not make, <u>and</u>
 - testimony or documentary evidence that the accused counsel was informed of the allegation and was given an opportunity to respond, and
 - testimony or documentary evidence that indicates whether there has been a complaint filed with the appropriate disciplinary authorities and, if not, an explanation why there has been no complaint.
 - No case law is relevant in this analysis




The BIA on Credibility

OB

- 1. Matter of Pula, 19 I&N Dec. 467, 472 (BIA 1987). applicant's testimony not impeached by minor discrepancies with written statement that was prepared by interpreters
- 2. Matter of O-D-, 21 I&N Dec. 1079, 1084 (BIA 1998). IJ's adverse credibility finding upheld based on the totality of the circumstances. Applicant submitted fraudulent identity documents and provided other testimony that conflicted with I-589
- 3. Matter of B, 21 I&N Dec. 66, 70-71 (BIA 1995). negative and positive factors must be balanced even if there are factors pointing towards adverse credibility- BIA found applicant credible noting that the applicant's testimony was consistent through examination and cross-examination as well as the written application and that the applicant had provided reasonable explanations for the credibility concerns addressed by the IJ, mainly, not looking at the IJ, not being able to remember exact dates.
