Just in case some of you did not know it, the citizens of Kenosha also took on the role of superhero as well. The people of our community donated food and drink by the pallet. Many helped to prepare or serve the food to the thousands that needed to be fed every day. We could not have survived without all of these generous organizations, businesses and caring people who gave with no concern towards any recognition.

I did my best to personally thank each person that came here to help. I met many, but many also went without receiving my personal gratitude. We designed commemorative challenge coins to help remind anyone who came to Kenosha for the civil unrest. Kenosha and I thank them. These are just a small token of the heartfelt appreciation for what you have all done to help keep Kenosha safe.
