AN ACT

relating to requiring the corroboration of certain testimony in a criminal case involving controlled substances.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF

TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 38, Code of Criminal Procedure, is amended by adding Article 38.141 to read as follows:

Art. 38.141. TESTIMONY OF UNDERCOVER PEACE OFFICER

OR SPECIAL INVESTIGATOR. (a) A defendant may not be convicted of an offense under

Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code, on the testimony of a person who is not a licensed peace

officer or a special investigator but who is acting covertly on behalf of a law enforcement agency

or under the color of law enforcement unless the testimony is corroborated by other evidence

tending to connect the defendant with the offense committed.

- (b) Corroboration is not sufficient for the purposes of this article if the corroboration only shows the commission of the offense.
- (c) In this article, "peace officer" means a person listed in Article 2.12, and "special investigator" means a person listed in Article 2.122.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2001.
