Re: Public Records Request dated February 28, 2014

Dear Mr. Wessler:

In response to the above-referenced public records request, the Pensacola Police Department has identified five cases in which a cell site simulator was used in a criminal investigation. The charge for the records is indicated on the attached invoice. All invoices are payable upon receipt and checks should be made to payable to the City of Pensacola. Redactions to documents and other records have been made in accordance with the following exemptions:

1. Child abuse and sexual offense victims (§119.071(2)(h)

Additionally, the Pensacola Police Department has not acquired a cell site simulator nor do we have any records regarding any agreements with Florida Department of Law Enforcement, FBI, Harris Corporation, Boeing Corporation (DRT) or any other corporation or governmental agency to use or borrow a cell site simulator. The Pensacola Police Department does not have any records regarding policies in place governing the use of cell site simulators, communications or agreements with wireless service providers or records regarding communications or agreements with the Federal Communications Commission or Florida Public Service Commission. The affidavits and orders authorizing the use of cell site simulators are sealed in the above referenced cases.
