To Whom It May Concern:

The American Civil Liberties Union and the American Civil Liberties Union Foundation (together, the "ACLU") submit this Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") request (the "Request") for records pertaining to cooperation between federal, state, and local law enforcement entities and between federal law enforcement entities and private security companies around preparations for anticipated protests against the Keystone XL pipeline.

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I. Background

On January 27, 2017, the White House released its Presidential Memorandum Regarding Construction of the Keystone XL Pipeline, which expedited the approval process for the Canada-to-Texas oil pipeline that President Barack Obama had previously rejected. Two months later, President Donald Trump announced that his administration had formally approved the pipeline. 3

These decisions generated intense public controversy and debate. The president's approval of the Keystone XL Pipeline set the stage for renewed protest against oil pipelines, which activist groups say accelerate climate change,

threaten clean water reserves, and invade cultural sites of American Indian tribes. In response to the president's announcement, then-chairman of the Standing Rock Sioux tribe, David Archambault II, stated, "We opposed Keystone before, and we'll oppose it again." Environmental groups, too, have made clear their intention to protest Keystone XL's construction; one prominent group has invited advocates to sign a "Pledge of Resistance," which includes a commitment to "participate in peaceful direct action that may result in my arrest, should construction begin on the Keystone XL pipeline."

Government officials have consequently made clear their intention to prevent a repeat of the prolonged protests against the Dakota Access Pipeline, which drew thousands of activists to the North Dakota site, sparked physical confrontation with law enforcement authorities, and captured worldwide attention. Officials have pursued numerous strategies for impeding these protests, such as asking the federal government for guidance on the possibility of prosecuting protestors under domestic terrorism laws, enacting legislation that allows a governor or sheriff to prohibit groups numbering more than 20 from gathering on public land, and fostering cooperation between federal, state, and local law enforcement entities and private security contractors. As a

further threat to activists who may wish to repeat their actions at the Dakota Access Pipeline, the *Guardian* reports that Joint Terrorism Task Force agents have attempted to contact multiple individuals involved with the North Dakota anti-pipeline movement.¹¹

Evidence of cooperation among law enforcement officials and private corporations in the area of oil pipeline protests has been widely documented. On May 27, 2017, *The Intercept* published internal documents of the security firm TigerSwan that revealed close cooperation between TigerSwan, state police forces, and federal law enforcement in at least five states around the Dakota Access Pipeline. 12 For example, a TigerSwan situation report on March 29, 2016 explicitly named the state and federal actors in attendance at a joint meeting the day before: "Met with the Des Moines Field Office of the FBI, with the Omaha and Sioux Fall offices joining by conference call. Also in attendance were representatives of the Joint Terrorism Task Force, Department of Homeland Security . . . Topics covered included the current threat assessment of the pipeline, the layout of current security assets and persons of interests. The FBI seemed were [sic] very receptive . . . follow-up meetings with individuals will be scheduled soon[.]" is The Intercept also published communications detailing coordination "between a wide range of local, state, and federal agencies," including the revelation that the FBI participated in law enforcement operations related to the Dakota Access Pipeline protests. 14 Finally, a review of federal lobbying disclosure forms by DeSmog, a blog focused on topics related to climate change, has revealed that the National Sheriffs' Association was

lobbying Congress for surplus military gear and on issues related to the Dakota Access Pipeline.¹⁵

Law enforcement officials have signaled that such cooperation will assist them in responding to future protests against Keystone XL and other oil pipelines. For example, on April 11, 2017, the *Omaha Herald* reported that Morton County, North Dakota Sheriff Kyle Kirchmeier, whose department was involved in responding to the Dakota Access Pipeline protests, has been in communication with other states over how to respond to oil pipeline protestors. ¹⁶

Such indications and the recent existence of cooperation on this exact issue raise important questions about federal agencies' level of collaboration with state and local governments and with private security contractors in connection with oil pipeline protest actions. These questions are especially important given the uncertainty around whether and to what extent the government was engaged in surveillance of Dakota Access Pipeline protestors. The First Amendment protects political speech from the threat of undue government scrutiny, and the extent of such scrutiny is currently unknown. 18

To provide the American public with information about federal cooperation with state and local governments and with private security contractors over possible oil pipeline protests, the ACLU seeks such information through this FOIA request.

II. Requested Records

With respect to **all agencies** listed above, the ACLU seeks the release of all records ¹⁹ created since January 27, 2017, concerning:

- (1) Legal and policy analyses and recommendations related to law enforcement funding for and staffing around oil pipeline protests. Such recommendations may include, but are not limited to, declarations of a state of emergency by state and local entities in order to marshal additional funds, and requests by state or local entities for federal agencies to provide funding or personnel for counter-protest operations; and
- (2) Travel of federal employees to speaking engagements, private and public meetings, panels, and conferences on the subject of preparation for oil pipeline protests and/or cooperation with private corporations in furtherance thereof; and
- (3) Meeting agendas, pamphlets, and other distributed matter at speaking engagements, private and public meetings, panels, and conferences where federal employees are present to discuss preparation for oil pipeline protests and/or cooperation with private corporations in furtherance thereof; and
- (4) Communications between federal employees and state or local law enforcement entities or employees thereof, and between federal employees and private security companies or employees thereof, discussing cooperation in preparation for oil pipeline protests.

With respect to the **Office of the Secretary of Defense**, the ACLU seeks the release of all records created since January 27, 2017, concerning:

(5) Purchases, requests for purchase, and requests by state and local law enforcement officials of riot gear, including but not limited to tear gas, concussion grenades, and water cannons, from the U.S. Department of Defense's Law Enforcement Support Office, also known as the 1033 program.

With respect to the form of production, see 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(3)(B), the ACLU requests that responsive electronic records be provided electronically in their native file format, if possible. Alternatively, the ACLU requests that the records be provided electronically in a text-searchable, static-image format (PDF), in the best image quality in the agency's possession, and that the records be provided in separate, Bates-stamped files.

III. Application for Expedited Processing

The ACLU requests expedited processing pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(E).²⁰ There is a "compelling need" for these records, as defined in the statute, because the information requested is "urgen[tly]" needed by an organization primarily engaged in disseminating information "to inform the public concerning actual or alleged Federal Government activity." 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(E)(v)(II).

A. The ACLU is an organization primarily engaged in disseminating information in order to inform the public about actual or alleged government activity.

The ACLU is "primarily engaged in disseminating information" within the meaning of the statute. 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(E)(v)(II). ²¹ Obtaining information about government activity, analyzing that information, and widely publishing and disseminating that information to the press and public are critical and substantial components of the ACLU's work and are among its primary activities. *See ACLU v. DOJ*, 321 F. Supp. 2d 24, 29 n.5 (D.D.C. 2004) (finding non-profit public interest group that "gathers information of potential interest to a segment of the public, uses its editorial skills to turn the raw material into a distinct work, and distributes that work to an audience" to be "primarily engaged in disseminating information"). ²²

The ACLU regularly publishes *STAND*, a print magazine that reports on and analyzes civil liberties-related current events. The magazine is disseminated to over 980,000 people. The ACLU also publishes regular updates and alerts via email to over 3.1 million subscribers (both ACLU members and non-members). These updates are additionally broadcast to over 3.8 million social media followers. The magazine as well as the email and social-media alerts often include descriptions and analysis of information obtained through FOIA requests.

The ACLU also regularly issues press releases to call attention to documents obtained through FOIA requests, as well as other breaking news,²³

and ACLU attorneys are interviewed frequently for news stories about documents released through ACLU FOIA requests.²⁴

Similarly, the ACLU publishes reports about government conduct and civil liberties issues based on its analysis of information derived from various sources, including information obtained from the government through FOIA requests. This material is broadly circulated to the public and widely available to everyone for no cost or, sometimes, for a small fee. ACLU national projects regularly publish and disseminate reports that include a description and analysis of government documents obtained through FOIA requests. The ACLU also regularly publishes books, "know your rights" materials, fact sheets, and

educational brochures and pamphlets designed to educate the public about civil liberties issues and government policies that implicate civil rights and liberties.

The ACLU publishes a widely read blog where original editorial content reporting on and analyzing civil rights and civil liberties news is posted daily. See https://www.aclu.org/blog. The ACLU creates and disseminates original editorial and educational content on civil rights and civil liberties news through multi-media projects, including videos, podcasts, and interactive features. See https://www.aclu.org/multimedia. The ACLU also publishes, analyzes, and disseminates information through its heavily visited website, www.aclu.org. The website addresses civil rights and civil liberties issues in depth, provides features on civil rights and civil liberties issues in the news, and contains many thousands of documents relating to the issues on which the ACLU is focused. The ACLU's website also serves as a clearinghouse for news about ACLU cases, as well as analysis about case developments, and an archive of caserelated documents. Through these pages, and with respect to each specific civil liberties issue, the ACLU provides the public with educational material, recent news, analyses of relevant Congressional or executive branch action, government documents obtained through FOIA requests, and further in-depth analytic and educational multi-media features.

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The ACLU website includes many features on information obtained through the FOIA. detention, and interrogation.²⁷

The ACLU has also published a number of charts and explanatory materials that collect, summarize, and analyze information it has obtained through the FOIA. For example, through compilation and analysis of information gathered from various sources—including information obtained from the government through FOIA requests—the ACLU created an original chart that provides the public and news media with a comprehensive summary index of Bush-era Office of Legal Counsel memos relating to interrogation, detention, rendition, and surveillance. Similarly, the ACLU produced an analysis of documents released in response to a FOIA request about the TSA's behavior detection program²⁹; a summary of documents released in response to a FOIA request related to the FISA Amendments Act³⁰; a chart of original statistics about the Defense Department's use of National Security Letters based on its own analysis of records obtained through FOIA requests³¹; and an analysis of documents obtained through FOIA requests about FBI surveillance flights over Baltimore.³²

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The ACLU plans to analyze, publish, and disseminate to the public the information gathered through this Request. The records requested are not sought for commercial use and the requesters plan to disseminate the information disclosed as a result of this Request to the public at no cost.

B. The records sought are urgently needed to inform the public about actual or alleged government activity.

These records are urgently needed to inform the public about actual or alleged government activity. See 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(E)(v)(II). ³³ Specifically, the requested records relate to forthcoming cooperation between federal, state, and local law enforcement entities and between federal law enforcement entities and private security companies around preparations for protests against the Keystone XL pipeline. As discussed in Part I, supra, oil pipelines, protests against them, and law enforcements responses to these protests are the subject of widespread public controversy and media attention. ³⁴ The records sought relate to a matter of widespread and exceptional media interest in planned oil pipelines, protests against them, and law enforcement responses to these protests.

Given the foregoing, the ACLU has satisfied the requirements for expedited processing of this Request.

IV. Application for Waiver or Limitation of Fees

The ACLU requests a waiver of document search, review, and duplication fees on the grounds that disclosure of the requested records is in the public interest and because disclosure is "likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government and is not primarily in the commercial interest of the requester." 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(iii). The ACLU also requests a waiver of search fees on the grounds that the ACLU qualifies as a "representative of the news media" and the records are not sought for commercial use. 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(ii)(II).

A. The Request is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government and is not primarily in the commercial interest of the ACLU.

As discussed above, credible media and other investigative accounts underscore the substantial public interest in the records sought through this Request. Given the ongoing and widespread media attention to this issue, the records sought will significantly contribute to public understanding of an issue of profound public importance. Because little specific information about cooperation between federal, state, and local law enforcement entities and between federal entities and private security companies around anticipated pipeline protests is publicly available, the records sought are certain to contribute significantly to the public's understanding of what type of efforts the federal government is undertaking in preparation for protests against the Keystone XL pipeline.

The ACLU is not filing this Request to further its commercial interest. As described above, any information disclosed by the ACLU as a result of this FOIA Request will be available to the public at no cost. Thus, a fee waiver would fulfill Congress's legislative intent in amending FOIA. *See Judicial Watch, Inc. v. Rossotti*, 326 F.3d 1309, 1312 (D.C. Cir. 2003) ("Congress amended FOIA to ensure that it be liberally construed in favor of waivers for noncommercial requesters." (quotation marks omitted)).

B. The ACLU is a representative of the news media and the records are not sought for commercial use.

The ACLU also requests a waiver of search fees on the grounds that the ACLU qualifies as a "representative of the news media" and the records are not sought for commercial use. 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(ii)(II).³⁶ The ACLU meets the statutory and regulatory definitions of a "representative of the news media" because it is an "entity that gathers information of potential interest to a segment of the public, uses its editorial skills to turn the raw materials into a distinct work, and distributes that work to an audience." 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(4)(A)(ii)(III)³⁷; see also Nat'l Sec. Archive v. DOD, 880 F.2d 1381, 1387 (D.C. Cir. 1989) (finding that an organization that gathers information, exercises editorial discretion in selecting and organizing documents, "devises indices and finding aids," and "distributes the resulting work to the public" is a "representative of the news media" for purposes of the FOIA); Serv. Women's Action Network v. DOD, 888 F. Supp. 2d 282 (D. Conn. 2012) (requesters, including ACLU, were representatives of the news media and thus qualified for fee waivers for FOIA requests to the Department of Defense and Department of Veterans Affairs); ACLU of Wash. v. DOJ, No. C09-0642RSL, 2011 WL 887731, at *10 (W.D. Wash. Mar. 10, 2011) (finding that the ACLU of Washington is an entity that "gathers information of potential interest to a segment of the public, uses its editorial skills to turn the raw materials into a distinct work, and distributes that work to an audience"); ACLU, 321 F. Supp. 2d at 30 n.5 (finding non-profit public interest group to be "primarily engaged in disseminating information"). The ACLU is therefore a "representative of the news media" for the same reasons it is "primarily engaged in the dissemination of information."

Furthermore, courts have found other organizations whose mission, function, publishing, and public education activities are similar in kind to the ACLU's to be "representatives of the news media" as well. *See, e.g., Cause of Action v. IRS*, 125 F. Supp. 3d 145 (D.C. Cir. 2015); *Elec. Privacy Info. Ctr.*, 241 F. Supp. 2d at 10–15 (finding non-profit public interest group that

disseminated an electronic newsletter and published books was a "representative of the news media" for purposes of the FOIA); *Nat'l Sec. Archive*, 880 F.2d at 1387; *Judicial Watch, Inc. v. DOJ*, 133 F. Supp. 2d 52, 53–54 (D.D.C. 2000) (finding Judicial Watch, self-described as a "public interest law firm," a news media requester). ³⁸

On account of these factors, fees associated with responding to FOIA requests are regularly waived for the ACLU as a "representative of the news media." As was true in those instances, the ACLU meets the requirements for a fee waiver here.

Pursuant to applicable statutes and regulations, the ACLU expects a determination regarding expedited processing within 10 days. *See* 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(6)(E)(ii); 28 C.F.R. 16.5(e)(4); 32 C.F.R.§ 286.8(e)(1); 6 C.F.R. § 5.5(e)(4).

If the Request is denied in whole or in part, the ACLU asks that you justify all deletions by reference to specific exemptions to FOIA. The ACLU expects the release of all segregable portions of otherwise exempt material. The ACLU reserves the right to appeal a decision to withhold any information or deny a waiver of fees.

Our FOIA office received your FOIA request, dated January 23, 2018. We have assigned it control number 2018-00388. Please cite this number in any future communications with our office regarding your request.

In your request you asked for the following:

"With respect to all agencies listed above, the ACLU seeks the release of all records[1] created since January 27, 2017, concerning:

- (1) Legal and policy analyses and recommendations related to law enforcement funding for and staffing around oil pipeline protests. Such recommendations may include, but are not limited to, declarations of a state of emergency by state and local entities in order to marshal additional funds, and requests by state or local entities for federal agencies to provide funding or personnel for counter-protest operations; and
- (2) Travel of federal employees to speaking engagements, private and public meetings, panels, and conferences on the subject of preparation for oil pipeline protests and/or cooperation with private corporations in furtherance thereof; and
- (3) Meeting agendas, pamphlets, and other distributed matter at speaking engagements, private and public meetings, panels, and conferences where federal employees are present to discuss preparation for oil pipeline protests and/or cooperation with private corporations in furtherance thereof; and
- (4) Communications between federal employees and state or local law enforcement entities or employees thereof, and between federal employees and private security companies or employees thereof, discussing cooperation in preparation for oil pipeline protests."

We have classified you as a representative of the news media. As such, we may charge you for some of our duplication costs, but we will not charge you for our search or review costs; you also are entitled to up to 100 pages of photocopies (or an equivalent volume) for free. See 43 C.F.R. § 2.39. If, after taking into consideration your fee category entitlements, our processing costs are less than \$50.00, we will not bill you because the cost of collection would be greater than the fee collected. See 43 C.F.R. § 2.49(a)(1). We do not anticipate any charges for the cost of processing this request.

You have asked us, however, to waive the fees for processing your request. Our FOIA regulations state that bureaus will waive, or partially waive, fees if disclosure of all or part of the information is:

- (1) In the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of government operations or activities, and
- (2) Not primarily in your commercial interest.

See 43 C.F.R. § 2.45(a). Our FOIA regulations also provide four specific criteria that are used to determine whether these two requirements are met. See C.F.R. § 2.48(a). Your request addresses these criteria and contains enough information to

COMMUNICATION PLAN TransCanada Keystone XL Pipeline

Introduction

TransCanada withdrew their earlier request to suspend processing of their 2012 application and submitted an updated application for a right-of-way and a temporary use permit to construct the Keystone XL (KXL) pipeline. This application is supported by the "Presidential Memorandum Regarding Construction of the Keystone XL Pipeline" dated January 24, 2017 and signed by President Donald J. Trump. On Month 00, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) issued a Right-of-Way grant (ROW) that will allow TransCanada to cross federally managed public land in eastern Montana in order to construct the Keystone XL pipeline.

Background

The Department of State (DoS) is the lead agency for environmental review for this project. The DoS published the Keystone XL (KXL) Project Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) in the Federal Register on February 5, 2014 for the 2012 KXL application. The Final SEIS analyzes the segment identified in the DoS 2012 Presidential Permit application and the BLM Mineral Leasing Act, as amended (MLA) right-of-way application.

The BLM is responding to TransCanada's ROW application, under Section 28 of the MLA, for a grant of ROW and Temporary Use Permits (TUP) on federal lands administered by the BLM and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), to construct, operate, maintain, and (eventually) decommission the Project in compliance with the MLA; BLM ROW regulations (43 CFR 2880); and other applicable federal laws, regulations, and policies.

The BLM is further guided by the Energy Policy Act of 2005, which recognized the need to improve domestic energy production, develop renewable energy resources, and enhance the infrastructure for collection and distribution of energy resources across the nation. To this end, the BLM is charged with analyzing applications of utility and transportation systems on BLM administered federal land.

Impacts

The Keystone XL Pipeline Project has been analyzed for compliance under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) through a Final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and Final Supplemental EIS. After extensive review of the analysis by the Glasgow, Malta, and Miles City Field Offices and the Montana/Dakotas State Office, the BLM has determined that all practicable means to avoid, minimize, and, if required, compensate for unavoidable impacts of the approved project route, have been considered in the Final EIS and Final Supplemental EIS, and as further refined in the Plan of Development (POD) and Approved Conservation Plans.

Potential Controversy

- 1. Montana State, County, and local governments have unanimously expressed support for the project.
- 2. Local municipalities are anticipating and planning for housing needs for construction workers and supporting contractors/businesses. As per North Dakota's experience, councilmen and commissioners are keenly aware that many small towns in the Bakken were hard-pressed to handle the increases in vehicle traffic, housing, water and sewage needs, landfill capacity, and damage to roads, highways, bridges, etc. They are also sensitive to the possible impacts that might result from large-scale demonstrations such as those experienced by towns adjacent to the Dakota Access Pipeline or near the Standing Rock Agency.
- 3. The Northern Plains Tribes are generally not in favor of the project for the following reasons: pollution risks from spills in rivers and streams; increased carbon footprint; violation of treaty rights; impacts on sacred sites; and the lack of a decision maker at past tribal consultation meetings held by the Department of State. BLM will still need to coordinate with Tribes for National eligibility determinations.
- 4. The majority of the local civil population in Montana appears to view the potential project in either a neutral or positive light, generally due to the possibility of positive economic influences from construction.
- 5. Nationally, a significant number of individuals and organizations, such as those who protested the Dakota Access Pipeline, oppose fossil fuel development and associated infrastructure. With the Department of State Presidential Permit decision to again move forward with the pipeline construction and the BLM's approval of the ROW, protestors are likely to become more vocal.



Communication Plan Goals and Objectives

This Communications Plan aims to provide BLM staff who are authorized to speak with the public and media about KXL with concise and accurate information so they can:

- Provide clear and accurate information on the BLM's role with this project
- Readily identify affected local stakeholders and reach out with appropriate messaging
- Educate the public on the BLM's role regarding U.S. energy development
- Facilitate continued public participation and engagement

Important Note: Authorized BLM staff may speak to the media only on the BLM's role in the Keystone XL pipeline ROW decision. We do not speak for other agencies, organizations or corporations. The State Department, Army Corps of Engineers, and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service will speak to their respective roles in reviewing and approving the KXL pipeline project. Do not speculate under any circumstances.

Talking Points and Key Facts

Project History

- January 26, 2017: TransCanada Corporation resubmitted a Presidential Permit application to the U.S. State Department for approval of the Keystone XL pipeline.
- February 8, 2017: TransCanada Corporation submitted to BLM a revised right-of-way application and updated Plan of Development.
- March 24, 2017: TransCanada received a Presidential Permit from the U.S. Department of State allowing for the construction, operation, and maintenance of pipeline facilities at the U.S.-Canadian border in Phillips County, Mont.
- March 31, 2017: The BLM issued a right-of-way that will allow TransCanada to cross federally managed public land in eastern Montana to construct the Keystone XL pipeline.

Project Scope

- The project could support approximately 42,100 jobs (direct, indirect, and induced). (2014 Supplemental EIS Executive Summary Section 4.3.1)
- The project could represent approximately \$2 billion in earnings throughout the United States. (2014 Supplemental EIS Executive Summary Section 4.3.1)
- The proposed pipeline would enter the United States at the International Boundary near Morgan, Montana, and cross portions of northeast Montana, western and central South Dakota and eastern Nebraska. It would terminate in southeast Nebraska near the community of Steele City.

Updated March 27, 2017

- The BLM administers about 46 miles of the proposed pipeline route on scattered parcels and sections across eastern Montana.
- The proposed pipeline route would cross about 1.5 miles of land managed by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers across the Missouri River at Fort Peck.
- The 36-inch diameter, 876-mile long pipeline is projected to transport up to 830,000 barrels of crude oil per day. Construction is predicted to last up to 2 years.

The BLM's Role

- The BLM is responsible for reviewing and granting pipeline rights-of-way on public land it administers, or if a proposed right-of-way crosses land managed by two or more federal agencies.
- Since the pipeline crosses a portion of public lands, BLM's decision on the right-of-way was
 not an approval of the project itself, but was required once the project had been approved to
 proceed.
- The KXL Project has been analyzed for compliance under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). The range of issues summarized and analyzed in the Final EIS and Final Supplemental EIS were derived from the scoping process, public involvement and agency coordination. These issues were used to identify, refine, and evaluate the proposed activities, and to direct the level of detail needed for each of the environmental resource studies completed for the EIS.
- Many issues are addressed by design features of the Project, or were found not to be substantive through the effects analysis conducted for the Project. However, several planning and resource issues proved to be pivotal to Project development and critical to the decision for the selected alternative route. These issues include public health and safety, river and stream crossings, potential impacts on sensitive species and habitats (including migratory bird habitat and greater sage-grouse and their habitat); and vegetation communities of conservation concern.
- In an EIS, the alternative that appears to have the lowest overall impact on the natural, human, and cultural environment, including resource issues, is identified as the environmentally preferred alternative. The route that exhibits the least impact overall is the project route proposed by Keystone and analyzed in the Final Supplemental EIS, as modified by the Department of State and the BLM and other cooperating agencies and incorporates required mitigation measures.
- Based on its analysis, the BLM has granted TransCanada's request for a right-of-way to cross federal land to construct, operate, and maintain the KXL pipeline for a term of 30 years, with the right of renewal.

- BLM approval of the pipeline right-of-way contains terms and conditions, including a plan for the eventual decommissioning of the pipeline.
- The approved route crosses public land managed by the BLM's Malta, Glasgow, and Miles City Field Offices.
- The BLM is responsible for reviewing and granting pipeline rights-of-way on public land it administers, or if a proposed right-of-way crosses land managed by two or more federal agencies.
- Since the pipeline crosses a portion of public lands, BLM's decision on the right-of-way was not an approval of the project itself, but was required once the project had been approved to proceed.
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Native American Tribes

• The large number of tribes involved is due to the project's scope. In 2009, the project extended from the U.S.-Canada border crossing to the Texas Gulf Coast. In 2012, the pipeline segment from Cushing, Oklahoma to the Gulf Coast was determined to not require a presidential permit and construction of that portion was completed in 2013. As a result, the

current project no longer includes a southern segment and instead runs from Montana to Steele City, Nebraska.

- The BLM Montana/Dakotas will complete the Tribal Coordination Plan for the Keystone Pipeline. Upon approval of the plan by leadership, the BLM Montana/Dakotas would initiate contact with Tribal Historic Preservation Officers prior to signing the Record of Decision (ROD) and communicate verbally and in writing regarding the plan aspects.
- Visits to sites will be conducted with the BLM and interested tribal representatives to focus
 on locations with stone features such as cairns, rock alignments and stone circles. Tribal
 input will assist the BLM in determining National Register of Historic Places eligibility for
 cultural significance.
- BLM Leadership will also reach out to Tribal Chairmen of the local tribes most affected by the route to inform them of our upcoming decision, assess their concerns, and discuss plans for coordination with them on sites identified on BLM-administered lands.

Greater Sage-Grouse:

- The BLM worked with the proponent, the Department of State, and the state wildlife agencies in Montana and South Dakota to develop conservation measures for Greater Sagegrouse, a BLM special status species.
- The BLM Miles City and HiLine Approved Resource Management Plans require that the
 percentage of surface disturbance associated with projects located in Greater Sage-grouse
 Priority Habitat Management Areas not exceed five percent of a project area.
- The surface disturbance associated with this project was submitted to the program for analysis in each Priority Habitat Management Area (PHMA) the pipeline crosses. Surface disturbance percentages for each PHMA segment were under the five percent disturbance cap.
- The updated Sage-Grouse Conservation Plan in the Plan of Development provides for avoidance and minimization measures, and also includes updated compensatory mitigation commitments to account for additionality and uncertainty.













































Proposed Keystone XL Pipeline



The Keystone XL Pipeline (the proposed Project) is a proposed 875-mile pipeline project that would extend from Morgan, Montana, to Steele City, Nebraska. The pipeline would allow delivery of up to 830,000 barrels per day (bpd) of crude oil from the Western Canadian Sedimentary Basin (WCSB) in Canada and the Bakken Shale Formation in the United States to Steele City, Nebraska, for onward delivery to refineries in the Gulf Coast area (see Figure ES-1). TransCanada Keystone Pipeline, LP (Keystone) has applied for a Presidential Permit that, if granted, would authorize the proposed pipeline to cross the United States-Canadian border at Morgan, Montana.

The proposed route differs from the route analyzed in the 2011 Final Environmental Impact Statement (2011 Final EIS) in that it would avoid the environmentally sensitive Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality (NDEQ)-identified Sand Hills Region and no longer includes a southern segment from Cushing, Oklahoma, to the Gulf Coast area.


The U.S. Department of State (the Department) prepared this Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (the Supplemental EIS) to assess the potential impacts associated with the proposed Project and its alternatives. The Supplemental EIS takes into consideration over 400,000 comments received during the scoping period and 1.5 million comments received on the Draft Supplemental EIS issued in March 2013. Notable changes since the Draft Supplemental EIS include:

Expanded analysis of potential oil releases;



Pipeline Planning Meeting Notes

February 16, 2017 Miles City MT 1030

Trans-Canada

Alan Lietz w/Trans Canada –With Executive order, they have 60 days for all federal groups to make determination and XL Keystone expects to hear in a few months, a favorable outcome. Their current Certificate dated 2012 and good till 2022 in Montana. XL folks are still working on getting the Nebraska certificate.

Alan, stated there will be no construction this year – they are currently working through the permitting process and re-negotiating. Alan said he has done this process numerous time on paper and are working to get it completed.

Construction process – Montana route is not going to change, you can go to the web site (keystone) and look at the maps on line. It starts north of Malta, cross US & Canadian border, runs 2 miles to east of Fort Peck Spillway, runs west of circle, on to Baker while missing ND.

36" pipe underground with 6 pumping stations through MT. There will be several intermediate valve locations that will be fenced in. 1 on ramp for Fallon County. 286 miles is overall foot print.

4 Man/worker camps are planned 2 in Valley County, 1 McCone County, 1 Fallon county. Approximately 1000 workers per camp.

Work will be completed in 4 Spreads-segments roughly 50-70 Miles in length. The current plan which is all subject to change; is to complete the first 2-3 northern spreads first and then the remaining last spread the following year. This will depend on the construction season as well, they expect the construction season late June early July until approximately Dec. 1 in each year.

As per requirement: TransCanada will have a communication plan and will be having meetings in every county the pipeline touches each year to discuss construction.

Time Frame:

2017 Permits, planning, public meetings as required by MT DEQ No Construction 2018 "Staging year" Surveying, possible start pump station construction, moving and staging of exemplar parts and pipe

2019-2020 Construction of Pipeline, reclamation

Michael stated they want to "ensure the safety and security of our people and the general public".

Q: regarding the 1000 people employment. Will they be local people?

A: They will be union pipeline – they will pull as many local people as they can – can be up to 50% local employees. (Union hall is where they pull employee) Camp operators take many people as well – There is opportunity for employment, Civil work, and other local contract if available. In the past, they have hired for work camps and access control film security advisor, off duty law enforcement at camps and on the right of ways.

Resourcing is always on the top of the list where Law Enforcement is sparse. They will contract security guards at site, equipment and pipeline yards.

Q: McCone County Sheriff: Man camp will double the population of our county – will there be funding for additional officers, how do we manage and plan?

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A: We want to interact with local impacts, personnel and equipment. (Big Concern for XL)

Q: Will Local sheriffs have a say? Who is working security?

A: Yes – field security officer will be talking with the sheriffs (background checks etc.) We are here to help and assist demands ensuring our people don't over step their bounds.

Q: Will there be financial help?

A: Don't know – we'll have to have more discussion on that.

MT DEQ

DEQ: Craig Jones stated the border crossing, Missouri and Yellowstone River – public lands might be pinch points for activity. Tough with crossing federal lands. 1st pump station on the state lands is 1.8 miles from Canadian border. Tough spot for easement especially when it gets just east of the Fort Peck spill way.

Q: Crossing the Milk River may be a problem?

A: Yes, could be a pinch point as well.

Q: Would the man camps be under any direction of DEQ

A: No local Subdivision regulations have to be followed and the County Sanitarians would be the oversite. Alan TransCanada stated all applicable subdivision regulations were completed in the counties necessary.



Tribal communication and coordination on the project is primarily handled on a federal level, with the Department of State being the lead federal agency in charge of the process. The process is run under what is called the 106 process (Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act). The process identifies historic, archeological and cultural locations, often referred to generally as "cultural resources". Part of this process, and this is true with the KXL line, is the development of a "Programmatic Agreement" (PA), which dictates how culture resources are going to be treated as the project progresses. The PA provides guidance for tribal monitors who will be present during the construction, and how unanticipated discoveries will be treated if discovered. The PA was completed and signed in 2011, with the final version issued in 2013 (sorry, 2015 was when we received the final clean version) and goes to the end of the project. The state (DEQ) is committed to keeping an open dialogue with the tribes prior to and during construction.

The Fort Peck Tribes, the Blackfeet, the Crow and Northern Cheyenne are listed in the PA as consulting tribes. The Ft. Belknap tribes are listed as "undecided", the CTKS are listed as not-consulting.

ND Lessons learned discussion:

Social media is a Key, MHP has someone that could assist local counties with social media problems and education.

Communications are an issue as always.

Proper PPE for Law enforcement is a must.

Having EMS services on standby at any event for both LE, and protestors a must.

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Group Discussion on:

The rest of the agenda items were great discussions, we could not try and catch all of this. The work groups will establish priorities, questions, and hopefully some answers to all of the discussion points. I will transmit to these groups the minimal notes we were able to capture, and the questions we were able to jot down.

They are:

Law Enforcement Training DES / EOC Intelligence

Per the general consensus of the group, the working groups would meet and we would come back as a large group to meet within 90-120 days. Some work may come faster than that i.e. Training classes available, however this was the consensus we heard.
